5:30-6:30pm on Thursday, Sept 24th, 2015, Andreas Von Huene will give a lecture on interpretive figural Sculpture in 100 Lord Hall.

The next day he will give figurative sculpture demonstrations, Friday Sept 25th, 9:00am-12:00pm in the Sculpture Studios.

### **Program Description**

The Littlefield Gallery Visiting Artist Series: Andreas Von Huene: The Figure as Sculptural Inspiration.

5:30-6:30pm on Thursday, Sept 24th, 2015, Andreas Von Huene will give a lecture on interpretive figural Sculpture in 100 Lord Hall. The lecture will run for approximately one hour, with a question and answer period at the end. This event is free and open to the public.

The next day he will give figurative sculpture demonstrations, Friday Sept 25th 9:00am-12:00pm, in the Sculpture studios. Von Huene will be working in plasticine modeling clay, and later moulds will be made from his sculptural works to create cast metal figurative elements that he will use in an upcoming Spring 2016 visiting artist residency on campus (ongoing in Littlefield Gallery series.)

Both events are free and open to the public.

### **Audience**

Lord Hall lecture, estimate 25-45 audience. Our lectures are attended by faculty and students, and the number of community members is usually dependent upon the nature of the speaker. Because Von Huene was one of the sculptors who worked on campus during the Schoodic International Sculpture Symposium in summer 2012, and he has a popular public work sited at Acadia Hospital, we expect some attendance from local community members.

Sculpture Demonstrations: 30-50, mostly students with a few faculty and interested community members.

So total audience numbers would be 55-80.

### **Publicity**

The Littlefield Gallery will advertise the events through their mailings, at their gallery, and website. The Dept. of Art will print posters to go around campus, in Orono and Bangor businesses, and send out email invites to campus and community mail lists. Our Art Education mailing lists include local schools.


