The play will be directed by a faculty director, and the scenery will be designed by a faculty designer. Auditions will be open to the university community at large, but the cast will be made up mostly of students.

The requirements of the play will require us to hire a guest lighting designer, and a guest costume designer.

Project Abstract

The theatre department would like to continue our exploration of the classics by producing The Cherry Orchard by Anton Chekhov. First staged in 1904, The Cherry Orchard is widely considered one of three masterpieces by the renowned Russian playwright. The play is rarely produced in professional theater, yet is culturally significant enough to have inspired many modern playwrights. This, along with its use of an ensemble of over twelve characters, makes it an ideal piece for an academic theatre.

Program Description

A faculty director, a faculty scenic designer, a guest lighting designer, a guest costume designer, four staff members, two administrative assistants, and about 30-40 student actors and technicians will collaborate in bringing Chekhov's masterpiece to life.

Audience

We are expecting 800 students, faculty, and community members for the entire run of the show. We usually have more students than any other demographic, due in large part to the incorporation of our show into the Honors 180 class.

We are currently working on a new marketing strategy that will increase the number of off campus community members who come to our shows, while maintaining or increasing the number of students and faculty who attend.

Publicity

We will publicize both on campus and to the greater Bangor area. We will use media outlets including: Newspapers, Television, Radio, Social Media, Posters, and postcards.

Amount requested from CADLS

\$4,900

Other funding request

We will be requesting \$4,400 from CLAS to cover the cost of hiring two guest artists, and Theatre/Dance will be contributing \$5,400.

We expect to make \$1,500 in ticket sales.

This play is a period piece set in the late 1800's. Therefore, accurate period costumes are a priority. The costume budget is the highest priority.
