Yes, the project was carried out as outlined in the proposal. We did not have much modifications from the past years. The performance at the stage was held more than once, which attracted more audience during the event.

Roughly 1,500 people attended this event including UMaine students, faculty and numerous members of surronding communities, and Husson University students. For the exhibit, Hirosaki University from Japan attended and provided participants various cultural experiences. For the children's acitivity, UMaine representative sorolity Members of Kappa Delta Pi (KDP) provided amazing acvities to children.

The exhibit tables were represented by about 32 different countries or domestic and international student associations. About 150 students/faculty members presented for exhibit tables. The food court sales were represented by 21 various countries or international student/faculty associations. About 50 students/faculty members presented for food tables. We had over 200 participants for both exhibit and food sales tables.


How was the event promoted? Please attach copies of promotional material.
