The Lipstick Project: Leigh Boyle Visit to UMaine

**Date(s) of Event**

April 24-25, 2017

Leigh Boyle, Founder and Executive Director of The Lipstick Project. She will be receiving a \$2000 honorarium and will have travel expenses from Vancouver, BC.

**Project Abstract**

Leigh Boyle will share her story of The Lipstick Project, which grew out of her 2010 volunteer work in a women's hospital in Northern Ethiopia. The hospital cares for women with obstetric fistula, a condition resulting from prolonged, obstructed labor that leaves women chronically incontinent and ostracized. Leigh began giving weekly manicures to the isolated women, an act that proved life-giving for all. Upon returning home to Vancouver, Leigh saw similar need for restorative work in modern healthcare and established The Lipstick Project, a women-run volunteer organization that provides free, professional spa treatments to people in hospice and hospitals during the last days of their lives. The name "Lipstick Project" derives from a mysterious crate of lipstick that appeared during the liberation of the Bergen-Belsen Concentration Camp in 1945. A British officer at the liberation described the lipstick as an act of "unadulterated brilliance." Leigh's work is likewise brilliant.

**Program Description**

Leigh's sharing The Lipstick Project story at UMaine will link together, inform and inspire a number of groups. For Monday,

April 24 I am working to arrange a brown bag lunch with Leigh, Hospice of Eastern Maine and EMMC Supportive Care. Monday evening Leigh will speak at a potluck dinner hosted by Orono High School students that will include students from Old Town, Bangor, Brewer, Hermon and John Bapst High Schools. Tuesday, April 25 Leigh will have breakfast with UMaine Honors students in reciprocity for her lodging in the Colvin Hall guest suite. Interim Director Naomi Jacobs of the Women's, Gender & Sexuality Studies Program has scheduled Leigh to give a WGS luncheon talk on Tuesday, April 25. Finally, Tuesday night at 7:00, Leigh will give a public address in the Donald P. Corbett Building's Room 100, bringing together the various groups with whom she will have already met, along with other community members likewise interested in Leigh's commitment to human connection, dignity and care.

### **Audience**

Leigh's visit to UMaine will build collaborations among UMaine faculty and staff, UMaine students, local public school students and community members like Hospice of Eastern Maine and EMMC Supportive Care.

8 or more Honors Students for the Tuesday, April 25 Breakfast

30 or more UMaine faculty, students and staff for the Luncheon Talk with Women's, Gender & Sexuality Studies Tuesday, April 25

100 or more UMaine staff, faculty, students; local public school students; and community members for the Tuesday, April 25 7:00 lecture in DPC 100

### **Publicity**

I have recruited an Honors College undergraduate, Sam Saucier (double major in sociology and Women's, Gender and Sexuality Studies) to help coordinate Leigh Boyle's visit. Sam is helping with outreach to the communities with whom we are partnering, and she will be managing publicity for various events, generating posters, sending announcements via social media and sharing information with co-sponsors for dissemination among their constituencies.
