- Culture fest on November 9th from 11 AM to 3:30 PM at the New Balance Rec Center.

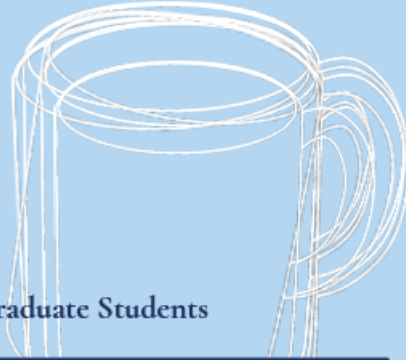
