ANNUAL DUES

Club dues are payable at beginning of fiscal year which starts at close of annual meeting. Make all checks payable to Maine Federation of Women's Clubs and send to State Treasurer,

DUTIES OF DISTRICT DIRECTOR

To acquaint herself with the clubs of her district and to visit them whenever possible.

To co-operate with the Chairman of Club Extension and encourage clubs to join the State Federation.

To assist in the organization of new clubs, both Junior and Senior.

To acquaint herself with the work of all State Chairmen and to promote the work outlined by them.

To secure and compile the data on her district for the Year Book.

To keep a record of the work of the district and give a complete report at the annual meeting.

To hold District Conferences at least once during the club year.

To act as Aides to the Press and Publicity chairman in order that she may keep in close touch with unusual events taking place in club districts.

To foster and encourage a spirit that will inspire every club to work for the welfare of the state; to develop an increasing loyalty to the State Federation and to the General Federation.

To encourage clubwomen to subscribe to the Federation News.

DUTIES OF CHAIRMEN

Each Chairman is expected:

To become familiar with the conditions and needs of the State pertaining to the several Divisions of her Department.

To send to each Club President and State Federation President a circular letter outlining suggestions for work.

To pass on to her successor a resume of all work done during her term of office.

To present the work of her department at District Meetings, whenever possible, upon invitation of the Director.

To report the year's work at the annual convention, sending a typewritten copy of such report to the President at least one week before the annual meeting. Duplicate copies should be mailed at the same time to the Maine dailies for publicity.

It is most important that all bills of Department Chairmen and Division Chairmen be in the hands of the President by May first.

Chairmen of Departments, Divisions and Committees are earnestly requested to send reports of their work to the appropriate Chairmen of the General Federation of Women's Clubs.

PRESIDENTS OF CLUBS

It is the duty of the President of each Federated club to bring before her club all communications from the State and General Federation officers and department chairmen in such a way as to make clear the purpose of the message.

She should answer promptly all communications, especially requests for information, thus showing courtesy to the individual and loyalty to the Federation. Nothing retards the work of the State organization so much as the failure to give information promptly.

Please notify the Corresponding Secretary of any change in club officers. Because of neglect of this duty many clubs fail to receive credential cards and important notices.

Send copies of your Club Year Book to the State President and also to your District Director.

Report to your District Director the name of any unfederated club in your community and the name of the President of same.

Each Club President should appoint a Press Committee to edit a column of club news at least once each week in the local daily papers, and to send interesting club news to Miss Alice Frost Lord, Lewiston, or to Mrs. Harvey W. Bowles, 51 Poplar St., Bangor.

EDUCATIONAL LOAN FUND

The State Federation maintains an Educational Loan Fund from which money is loaned to worthy students upon recommendation of the members of the committee. In order to extend the usefulness of this fund and to win more support for it, a committee consisting of one member from each district has been appointed. Applications may be made to the committee; if approved, such applications will be referred to the chairman, Mrs. Florence Waugh Danforth of Skowhegan, who will give the necessary instructions. Contributions are solicited from the clubs for this worthy cause.

THE "FEDERATION NEWS"

The "Federation News" is published four times a year, the price, fifty cents for the four copies, thirty-five cents to clubs subscribing 100%.

To members of federated clubs; this copy of the Year Book is fifty cents if sold separately; to all others the price is \$1.00.

MEETINGS

Your attention is called to the change in meetings according to the new By-Laws. Henceforth the annual meeting will be held in May; a fall conference will be held in October, but on legislative years, this fall conference will be supplanted by a mid-winter meeting, to be held in Augusta at the usual time in January.

FIVE-YEAR PLAN—FOUNDATION FUND

The Five-Year Plan is a practical reorganization of the Foundation Fund and does not solicit pledges from those clubs which have completed the quota for the Foundation Fund.

The General Federation is placing a new Five-Year Plan before the clubs which have not made or have not completed their contribution to the Foundation Fund. It provides that each club shall contribute two dollars and a half per member, to be paid in five-year installments of fifty cents annually. This is entirely a voluntary contribution, and half of the sum contributed will go to our State Federation endowment fund, which needs further contributions toward our goal of \$10,000. We ask the clubs to consider this plan carefully. We shall also be glad to receive personal pledges, if any are so disposed.

BILLS

All bills against the Federation must be sent to the President.

If bills are not in the hands of the President by May first delay in payment will be unavoidable.

CLUB DATA — IMPORTANT

The club data sheet will be sent to the Secretary of each club on or before March first. As soon as the Club elects its new officers, the Secretary will fill out the data sheet carefully and send it to her District Director.

Adopted at Annual Meeting, May 20-22, 1936

EDUCATION

Be it resolved that the Maine Federation of Women's Clubs goes on record as firm in its belief in the loyalty and honor and patriotism of the teachers of Maine.

STREET AND HIGHWAY SAFETY

Whereas, The annual increase in automobile accidents in the United States in 1935 has reached alarming proportions, and

Whereas, Many of these accidents would be eliminated by uniform traffic laws, therefore be it

Resolved, That the Maine Federation of Women's Clubs recommend to the clubs a study of the Model Traffic Ordinances plan as endorsed by the National Conference on Street and Highway Safety and urge the adoption of the same.

CRIME PREVENTION

Whereas, Crime is a devastating element in our country and presents a yearly bill estimated at from twelve to seventeen billions of dollars in addition to the destruction of many thousands of lives, and

Whereas, The prevention of crime is aided by a coordinated community program, including the abolition of slums; child guidance and social adjustment in the school; interrelationship of home and school; wholesome recreation; adequate probation, court parole and institutional facilities, therefore be it

Resolved, That the Maine Federation of Women's Clubs in meeting assembled, May 1936, urge its clubs to study their community agencies for crime prevention and to promote the coordination and full cooperation of all such agencies.

GOVERNMENT SERVICE

Whereas, The General Federation of Women's Clubs has for many years past urged the application of the merit system in filling appointive public positions, and

Whereas, Some gains have been made in the United States in extending the merit plan for public employment, there still remains thousands of public positions which are filled through the political patronage method, therefore be it

Resolved, That the Maine Federation of Women's Clubs in meeting assembled, May 1936, reaffirm its adherence to the merit system and urge upon Congress and the State Legislature continued extension of the plan to the end that fitness and efficiency shall be the major consideration in the filling of appointive public positions.

REPORT OF COURTESIES COMMITTEE

Resolved: That the Maine Federation of Women's Clubs assembled at Portland for its forty-fourth annual meeting greatly appreciates the courteous hospitality of the clubs of District Twelve; Mrs. O. E. Haney, the efficient Director, and her capable committee. It also extends hearty thanks to the music committee, ushers and pages; to the hospitality committee of the Portland Chamber of Commerce for the delightful tea given at their rooms, to the hotel management, to the floral companies, to the transportation companies for reduced rates which made it possible for more club members to attend, to the Press, to radio station WCSH for time given for broadcasts; and to all others who have helped to make this Annual Meeting an outstanding success.

REPORTS OF OFFICERS

PRESIDENT'S REPORT



"Hold fast to the spirit of youth—let the years to come bring what they may." This motto is over the fireplace in a reception room in John Hay Hall, Columbia University.

As senior clubwomen, we must hold fast to the spirit of youth, because we need the enthusiasm, the courage and hope it brings, to advance with the changing conditions in a changing world which is all about us. We need it to set new goal-posts for others to strive for; then we need this spirit of youth to meet the junior clubwomen joining our ranks today. We need to hold to them, to encourage, to make friends with, and to help them see how much the Federation work means to us, that they may revere it as we are doing and have done.

Ruskin says: "When we build, let us think that we build forever. Let it not be for present delight, nor for present use alone. Let it be such work as our descendants will thank us for."

We need the senior clubwoman with her wide experience and wisdom, which has come through years of training, but we need, no less, the junior clubwoman, with her youth and energy, her enthusiasm and her up-to-the-minute viewpoint.

As the club year of 1935-36 draws to a close, it is fitting that I give an accounting of my stewardship.

There were many hopes in my mind, and among them I hoped this year would see the addition of twenty new clubs to our Federation, especially hoping for several Junior Clubs. Not twenty, but thirteen new clubs have been received into membership; however, as Browning says:

"Ah, but a man's reach should exceed his grasp,
Or what's a heaven for."

The campaign for new clubs has revealed to us several other Women's Clubs, some of which have joined us. These new clubs, and increase in membership throughout the state, is most encouraging, adding nearly five hundred new members to our Federation. Eight of the new clubs are Junior Clubs and five are Senior. We are most happy to welcome them all into the Federation family and may the good work continue and in the coming year may we add at least twelve more.

Your president has attended the duties required of her office, carrying on an extensive correspondence, visiting clubs, district and union meetings, and attended many state wide activities as a representative of the Federation, and has given two Radio Broadcasts. There has been no record kept of the miles travelled, or clubs visited, as it is all part of the duties, and only the interest shown and friendships made, are the records worth recording.

As your General Federation Director—your president attended the Triennial Meeting in Detroit last June, the Board Meeting in Washington in January of this year, and the Council Meeting in Miami, April 27th to May 1st. This has given her a broader viewpoint and she appreciates the privilege. Highlights will be given by the delegates.

With the help of the clubwomen, we have made progress on the Foundation Fund, now known as the Five Year Plan. We have contributed to Headquarters and increased the subscriptions to The Clubwoman. Because of regular contributions from the clubs, our Educational Loan Fund is helping more girls than ever before, and we plead for your continued support.

Our financial situation is encouraging, as you have learned from the Treasurer's report. Dividends have been received from The Fidelity Trust Company and Houlton Savings Bank from Impounded Funds.

Our state magazine—The Federation News, is growing in importance with each issue, and your president's and editor's hearts would be cheered if every clubwoman would realize how important this magazine is to her in learning more about, and keeping in touch with, the Federation activities. Let our Slogan be: "Every woman a clubwoman and every clubwoman a subscriber to the Federation News."

My sincere thanks and appreciation go to the members of the Executive Board. They have supported me loyally at all times, with suggestions and encouragement.

The chairmen have been busy along their lines, and it is to them we look for the creation and building of our Federation work. Their achievements are enumerated in their several reports. These chairmen stand ready and willing to be of assistance in the forming of programs. If the clubs would only avail themselves of the privilege, they would find much of value and interest.

Newspapers are black and white and read (red) all over. Press and Publicity has done its best for us this year, but it needs and solicits your cooperation. Send in reports of unusual programs and anything else that would make for good publicity.

Our Fall Meeting had a record breaking attendance, and the District Directors were every one present. They have shown their devotion to the Federation by their District Meetings, newspaper publicity, work for new clubs, and support of Federation ideals and policies.

A Literature Day at Bates College last year and an Art Day at Bowdoin College this year, have been both instructive and entertaining to the clubwomen; and through our chairman of Education, another Education Day is already planned at Colby College in October.

Your attention is called to the celebration of the fiftieth Anniversary of the dedication of the Statue of Liberty, which will be held October 28, 1936, at Bedloe Island, and because the real significance of the Statue should be in the hearts and minds of the American people—rather than in the structure itself, it has been asked that the celebration be educational, and prizes will be awarded for a Radio Script Contest by the Departments of American Citizenship and Education. The subject will be, "What the Statue of Liberty Signifies to Me."

The coming year will be an important one in history, with a state and national election; and the clubwomen will have to take an active part, perhaps more than they realize. Look well to the next legislature, study the bills, especially those that effect your homes, your children, and your rights. The Social Security Act, Economy Act, The National Academy Bill, Taxation, Education, Public Welfare, Conservation of Wild Life, The Federal Child Labor Amendment, The League of Nations, Reduction of Armaments, Crime Prevention, Street and Highway Safety, Interstate Compacts for Crime Control, and many others are among the bills now pending.

It is the desire of your president that every club during the coming year undertake some outstanding community project and that we have five judges, located in different sections of the state, to judge the most outstanding work done and prizes be awarded at our next annual meeting. Also, your president feels that we would be taking a forward step at this Federation Meeting, if we agree to adopt and put into effect the Fund for Cancer Control and either the Penny Art Fund, or something to take the place of it, as suggested by your Fine Arts Chairman.

I cannot close this report without asking the clubwomen to think more strongly of their citizenship. There is much propaganda surging and seeping around us all the time. There are those who would break down and crush much we have been taught to revere and hold dear. We must be on the alert and assert ourselves, so that our democracy can be preserved, and this can be done only through education.

And now, dear clubwomen, let us hold fast to the spirit of youth, let the spirit of youth be strong in our hearts, and as we labor so shall be our reward.

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RECORDING SECRETARY

Since the annual meeting in Bangor last May, four Executive Board meetings have been held: one in Augusta, two in Waterville and one in Portland. This mid-winter session was memorable because all of the District Directors were present. One new club—Foyer Musicale of Lewiston, the first French speaking club—was welcomed into membership.

BY-LAWS OF THE MAINE FEDERATION OF WOMEN'S CLUBS

as

Revised according to vote at 39th Annual Convention

ARTICLE I—NAME

This organization shall be known as the Maine Federation of Women's Clubs.

ARTICLE II—OBJECT

Its object shall be to bring together the various women's literary and educational clubs of the State for mutual benefit and helpfulness to others; to enable them to compare methods of study and work; and to promote legislative, civic, educational, moral and social measures.

ARTICLE III—MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. Clubs and organizations desiring to join the Maine Federation of Women's Clubs should make application to the Corresponding Secretary. The application of each club and organization should be accompanied by a copy of its constitution or by-laws, showing that its character is educational and literary, and that its objects are in harmony with the objects of the Federation.

Section 2. Clubs and organizations may be admitted to membership at the annual meeting of the Federation, or at any regularly called meeting of the Executive Board, a two-thirds vote of members present and voting being necessary in either case for admission of a club.

ARTICLE IV—OFFICERS

Section 1. The State Federation officers shall be a President, who shall be ex-officio General Federation Director; a First Vice-President, a Second Vice-President, a Recording Secretary, a Corresponding Secretary, and a Treasurer. These officers, with the thirteen District Directors, shall constitute an Advisory Committee.

Section 2. The officers alone shall constitute an Executive Board.

Section 3. No officer shall be eligible to the same office for more than two consecutive years, except the treasurer, who shall be eligible for re-election.

Section 4. There shall be no salaried officers. Necessary expenses incurred by officers in the service of the Federation may be refunded from the treasury by order of the Executive Board and Finance Committee.

ARTICLE V—DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1. The State President shall preside at all meetings of the State Federation and of the Executive Board and Advisory Committee. She shall be, ex-officio, a member of all Departments and Committees, and shall approve all bills, and draw all warrants, before they are presented for payment to the Treasurer.

Section 2. The Vice-Presidents, in order of their election, shall preside in absence of the President. The First Vice-President shall be Chairman of the District Directors. The Second Vice-President shall be Chairman of the Department Chairmen.

Section 3. The Recording Secretary shall keep the minutes of all meetings of the Federation and of the Executive Board and Advisory Committee.

Section 4. The Corresponding Secretary shall conduct all correspondence of the State Federation and shall keep a correct list of all clubs belonging thereto. With the assistance of the District Directors, she shall collect all data and material for the Year Book and furnish a typewritten copy of the same to the printer. She shall send out the call and credentials for all meetings. It shall also be her duty to edit the Year Book, but it shall be the duty of the outgoing administration, in collaboration with the incoming Executive Board, to compile the Year Book closing its term of office.

Section 5. The Treasurer shall collect all money due or belonging to the State Federation, and hold all securities except as hereinafter provided. She shall disburse funds on written order of the President, countersigned by the Chairman of the Finance Committee. The books shall be closed and ready for examination by a certified public accountant one week before each annual meeting. The funds shall be deposited in a bank approved by the Executive Board. A bond shall be given in such sum as the Executive Board may direct.

Section 6. A certified public accountant shall audit the accounts of the Treasurer, also the accounts of any committee or officer having charge of any Federation funds. At least one week before the annual meeting, the books of the Treasurer, also the accounts of any committee or officer having funds, shall be audited by a certified public accountant, selected by the State President, and the report of the accountant shall be presented to the Convention.

ARTICLE VI—EXECUTIVE BOARD

Section 1. The Executive Board shall conduct all necessary business of the Federation during the interim between meetings, except amending the By-Laws or modifying any action of the Federation. A report of all meetings shall be given at each State meeting.

ARTICLE VII—ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The officers and the District Directors shall constitute an Advis-

ory Committee whose duty it shall be to meet as soon as convenient following each annual meeting to appoint Department and Division Chairmen, Committee Chairmen and an Historian; the appointments in all cases to be approved by the State President. They shall also combine or discontinue lines of work and establish such committees as, in their judgment, are deemed advisable, and discuss and formulate plans for the Districts.

ARTICLE VIII—ELECTIONS

Section 1. All state officers shall be elected by ballot at the annual meeting for a term of two years except the Corresponding Secretary who shall be appointed by the President.

Section 2. The nominations for each officer to be elected shall be made from the floor. Nominating speeches for President shall be limited to five minutes and for each other officer to two minutes. There shall be a second or seconds but no seconding speeches. The names put in nominations shall be posted in plain view, and the election shall be by written ballot. A plurality of legal ballots shall elect.

Section 3. If a vacancy occurs in the office of President, the First Vice-President shall become President. If she cannot serve, the Second Vice-President shall take office. All other vacancies in the Executive Board, the Chairmanships of the Departments of work, or the District Directors, shall be filled by the Executive Board.

ARTICLE IX—FEDERATION DISTRICTS

Section 1. To facilitate the work of the Federation, the state shall be divided into thirteen Federation Districts, each to be presided over by a District Director, who shall be appointed by the Executive Board.

Section 2. A club or organization belonging to the State Federation must belong to one of the Districts. All clubs or organizations holding membership in the District Federation must previously have been admitted to membership in the State Federation.

Section 3. There shall be held in each District two meetings during the two year period, at least one of which shall be open to all of the club members in the District.

Section 4. Each District Director shall keep in communication with all the clubs of her district and visit them when possible; shall attend the meetings of the Advisory Committee and assist the Corresponding Secretary in collecting for the Year Book the data of the clubs of her district. She shall assist in organizing new clubs and shall co-operate in carrying out the work of the departments.

Section 5. A registration fee may be charged to defray the expenses of the District Conference whenever thought advisable by the Director of the District.

ARTICLE X—MEETINGS

Section 1. The Annual Convention shall be held in May of each year unless otherwise advised by the Executive Board.

Section 2. In September or October of alternate years there shall be a fall conference; and each legislative year there shall be a mid-winter conference in January at Augusta.

Section 3. Each club belonging to the Federation may be represented at each of the above meetings by its President and one delegate and by one additional delegate for every fifty members or majority fraction thereof after the first fifty. Federation Unions and affiliated organizations may be represented by the President and one delegate. Officers, District Directors, Department and Division Chairmen, Chairmen of Standing Committees and Past Presidents shall be voting members of these meetings.

Section 4. Other members of the clubs belonging to the State Federation may be present at the meeting and take part in discussions, but shall not introduce motions or vote.

Section 5. No matter of legislation shall be approved or disapproved unless, previous to the meeting at which action is taken, notice of such proposed action shall have been published in the "Federation News" or shall have been sent to each club belonging to the Federation.

Section 6. Meetings shall be conducted according to Roberts' Revised Rules of Order.

ARTICLE XI—FINANCES

Section 1. The annual dues shall be fifteen cents per capita for each club. Federation Unions shall pay three dollars each annually. Affiliated Organizations shall pay five dollars for each one hundred members or majority fraction thereof. Clubs and Affiliated Organizations in arrears for dues shall not be entitled to be represented at the meetings of the Federation.

Section 2. All clubs which have failed to pay dues by the end of the year, may after due notice be dropped from membership.

Section 3. There shall be a Finance Committee composed of five members which shall include the President, and the Treasurer of the Federation, also a Chairman and two other members who shall be nominated and elected from the floor. This Committee shall prepare a budget for approval by the Executive Board. The Chairman shall approve all bills before their payment by the Treasurer.

Section 4. A registration fee may be charged to defray the expenses of the state meetings whenever thought advisable by the Executive Board.

ARTICLE XII—STANDING COMMITTEES

Section 1. There shall be a Committee on State Endowment of

five members, whose duties shall be to further the interest of an Endowment Fund for the Maine Federation.

Section 2. There shall be a Committee on Resolutions. All recommendations of officers, except those calling for appropriations of money, shall be referred to this Committee. All resolutions introduced by members shall be read aloud in the Federation and referred without debate to the Committee, which shall consider and report them to the Federation, or reject them, as it deems best. The Committee shall be empowered to make such additions to, modifications of, or combinations of the resolutions referred to it, as it chooses, and also to frame resolutions of its own and report them to the Federation. It shall report each day for action by the Federation such resolutions as it shall have approved or framed, and shall make its final report during the last session of the Federation. Nothing in this section shall impair the right of members to bring before the voting body any resolution which the Committee shall have rejected.

Section 3. The Historian shall collect and have the custody of all State Federation Year Books, Club Histories, State Convention programs and files of the Federation News, and such other records as the Executive Board shall require. She shall give to her successor an itemized statement of all properties held by her. She shall give an annual report to the Convention.

ARTICLE XIII—EDUCATIONAL LOAN FUND

As soon as practicable after the State Federation election, the Advisory Committee shall appoint an Educational Loan Fund Committee consisting of thirteen members, one from each district, and a Chairman and a Treasurer to have charge of the Fund. Not less than seven of those appointed shall have served on this committee during the preceding administration. The Treasurer of this Committee shall have custody of all money coming into the hands of said Committee, and of all notes or obligations of any kind. A full report shall be given by the Chairman and Treasurer of this Committee at each annual meeting.

ARTICLE XIV—QUORUMS

Section 1. Representation from ten clubs shall be sufficient to constitute a voting body for either the Annual Meeting or Fall Conference. At any session, one-third of the voting membership shall be a quorum.

Section 2. The quorum for the Executive Board shall be four. The quorum for the Advisory Committee shall be ten.

ARTICLE XV—ENTERTAINMENT

Officers of the Maine Federation, invited guests, and Chairmen of Departments shall be eligible to free entertainment at the annual meeting.

ARTICLE XVI—AMENDMENTS

These By-Laws may be amended at any delegated meeting by a two-thirds vote of those present and voting, notice of the proposed amendment having been appended to the call for the meeting, or presented at a previous meeting.
