ANNUAL DUES

DUTIES OF DISTRICT DIRECTOR

To acquaint herself with the clubs of her district and to visit them whenever possible.

To co-operate with the Chairman of Club Extension and encourage clubs to join the State Federation.

To assist in the organization of new clubs, both Junior and Senior.

To acquaint herself with the work of all State Chairmen and to promote the work outlined by them.

To secure and compile the data on her district for the Year Book.

To keep a record of the work of the district and give a complete report at the annual meeting.

To hold District Conferences at least once during the club year.

To act as Aides to the Press and Publicity chairman in order that she may keep in close touch with unusual events taking place in club districts.

To foster and encourage a spirit that will inspire every club to work for the welfare of the state; to develop an increasing loyalty to the State Federation and to the General Federation.

To encourage clubwomen to subscribe to the Federation News.

DUTIES OF CHAIRMEN

Each Chairman is expected:

To become familiar with the conditions and needs of the State pertaining to the several Divisions of her Department.

To send to each Club President and State Federation President a circular letter outlining suggestions for work.

To pass on to her successor a resume of all work done during her term of office.

To present the work of her department at District Meetings, whenever possible, upon invitation of the Director.

To report the year's work at the annual convention, sending a typewritten copy of such report to the President at least one week before the annual meeting. Duplicate copies should be mailed at the same time to the Maine dailies for publicity.

It is most important that all bills of Department Chairmen and Division Chairmen be in the hands of the President by May first.

Chairmen of Departments, Divisions and Committees are earnestly requested to send reports of their work to the appropriate Chairmen of the General Federation of Women's Clubs.

PRESIDENTS OF CLUBS

It is the duty of the President of each Federated club to bring before her club all communications from the State and General Federation officers and department chairmen in such a way as to make clear the purpose of the message.

She should answer promptly all communications, especially requests for information, thus showing courtesy to the individual and loyalty to the Federation. Nothing retards the work of the State organization so much as the failure to give information promptly.

Please notify the Corresponding Secretary of any change in club officers. Because of neglect of this duty many clubs fail to receive credential cards and important notices.

Send copies of your Club Year Book to the State President and also to your District Director.

Report to your District Director the name of any unfederated club in your community and the name of the President of same.

Each Club President should appoint a Press Committee to edit a column of club news at least once each week in the local daily papers, and to send interesting club news to Miss Greta Kerr, care of Portland Press Herald, Portland or to Mrs. H. C. Swift, 40 Wiley St., Bangor.

EDUCATIONAL LOAN FUND

The State Federation maintains an Educational Loan Fund from which money is loaned to worthy students upon recommendation of the members of the committee. In order to extend the usefulness of this fund and to win more support for it, a committee consisting of one member from each district has been appointed. Applications may be made to the committee; if approved, such applications will be referred to the chairman who will give the necessary instructions. Contributions are solicited from the clubs for this worthy cause.

THE "FEDERATION NEWS"

The "Federation News" is published four times a year, the price, fifty cents for the four copies, thirty-five cents to clubs subscribing 100%.

To members of federated clubs: this copy of the Year Book is fifty cents if sold separately; to all others the price is \$1.00.

MEETINGS

Your attention is called to the change in meetings according to the new By-Laws. Henceforth the annual meeting will be held in May; a fall conference will be held in October, but on legislative years, this fall conference will be supplanted by a mid-winter meeting to be held in Augusta at the usual time in January.

FIVE-YEAR PLAN—FOUNDATION FUND

The Five-Year Plan is a practical reorganization of the Foundation Fund and does not solicit pledges from those clubs which have completed the quota for the Foundation Fund.

The General Federation is placing a new Five-Year Plan before the clubs which have not made or have not completed their contribution to the Foundation Fund. It provides that each club shall contribute two dollars and a half per member, to be paid in five-year installments of fifty cents annually. This is entirely a voluntary contribution, and half of the sum contributed will go to our State Federation endowment fund, which needs further contributions toward our goal of \$10,000. We ask the clubs to consider this plan carefully. We shall also be glad to receive personal pledges, if any are so disposed.

BILLS

All bills against the Federation must be sent to the President.

If bills are not in the hands of the President by May first delay in payment will be unavoidable.

CLUB DATA—IMPORTANT

The club data sheet will be sent to the Secretary of each club on or before March first. As soon as the Club elects its new officers, the Secretary will fill out the data sheet carefully and send it to her District Director.

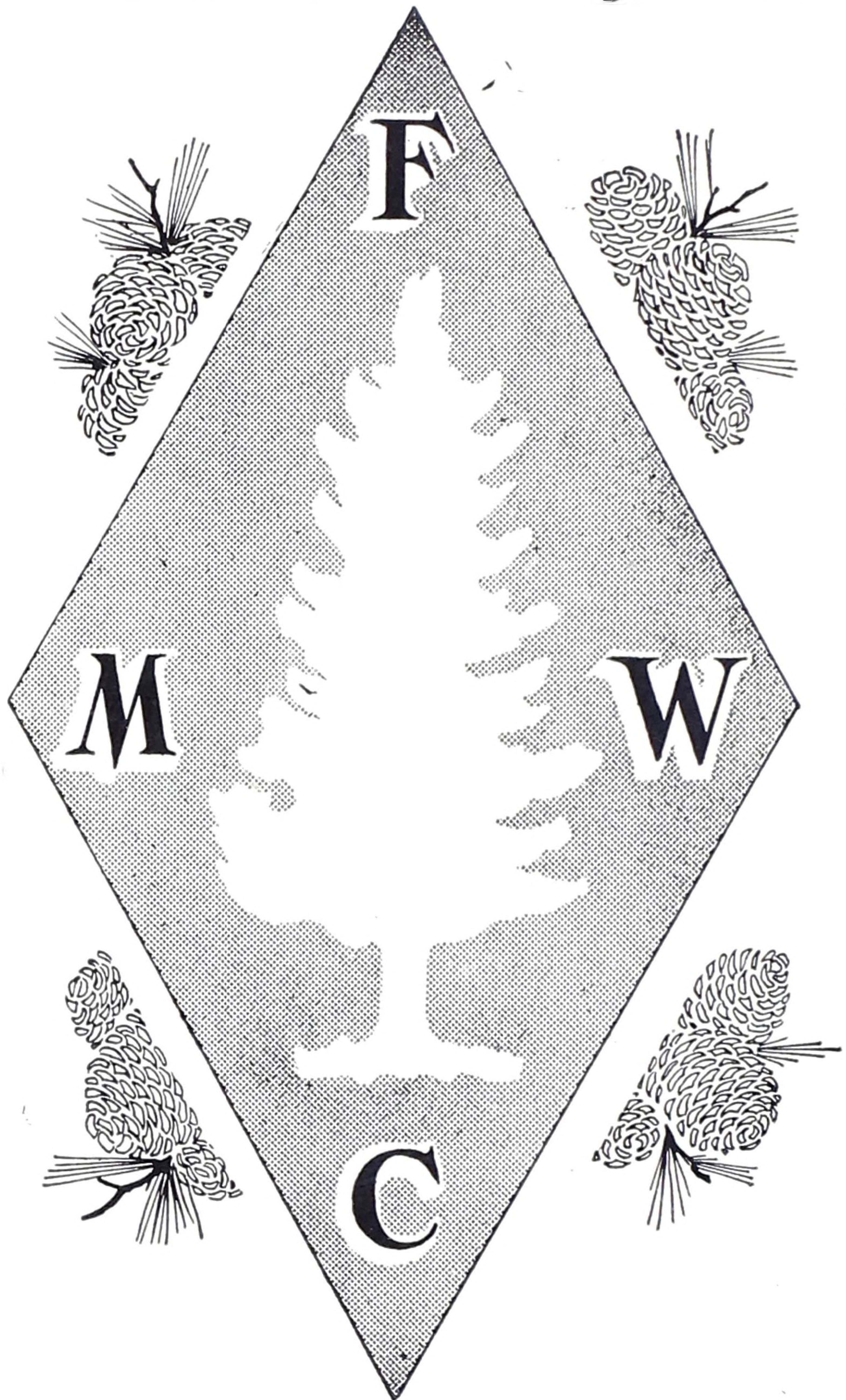

REPORTS OF OFFICERS

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PRESIDENT'S REPORT



To use an apt quotation, "June lies asleep at God's feet in her beauty" and we have come from border to coastline to enjoy these sessions that mean so much to the members of the Maine Federation of Women's Clubs. A busy year has flitted by with such rapidity that it hardly seems possible it has vanished into the past.

Last June the Federation ship, so tried and true, sailed forth on a new voyage. The hold was laden with fair treasures, golden memories of other captains and other crews, a cargo of earnest endeavor, good intention and high ambition. At our mast head fluttered the banner of loyalty and courage. So we sailed forth to break new seas, our questing gaze on the far horizon, knowing that we should encounter adverse winds and days and nights of storm but determined, withal, to deliver our cargo and to take on a new one before starting forth on a voyage that must end for this

captain and this crew in the harbor of 1939.

It is a chartered course we have followed and no department has been particularly emphasized for each has contributed its share to the progress of Federation activities. In the "Ship's Log" this morning you heard of the devoted service these seamen have given. Each Department chairman has been alert and each Division chairman with her committees has made a distinct contribution that this year might be helpful to fellow men.

Yesterday you heard the encouraging reports of the chairmen of committees in whose hands have been placed much of the routine work of the Federation. They have not, however, accomplished these results in a purely business-like manner. They have also laid on the Federation altar the gifts of service.

Tonight you will hear the reports of your District Directors, thirteen devoted women, links in a golden chain binding the individual club to the Federation. It is a great example of the unselfishness and self sacrifice of the club women of Maine when we realize that at the time one of the little group of Directors was called to higher service in the Great Beyond, another club woman immediately took her place, picking up the torch as it fell from her hands and carried on the work she had laid down. We are sad today as we miss the face of Mrs. Rachel Hodgdon, former director of District 11, but glad as she would be that the work in the district to which she was so devoted will still be carried on.

It is fitting at this time to pay a tribute to another Director, one in our own district, who, when the one first appointed was forced to resign through illness, has carried on the preparations for this conference without hesitation. To her, our own Director, Mrs. Glover, and to the women who have so loyally sustained her in this new office, your president extends her heartfelt gratitude. They have worked in harmony, seeking to overcome obstacles, proving again that this division of the state into districts has been one of the most constructive and forward movements ever attempted in the Federation, proving again that club life is a more vital and important thing than any happening. The districts are steadily weaving threads of service in the tapestry of the state organization and we feel sure that it will exist through these qualities in the years that are to be.

These Directors, these Committees, Department and Division chairmen have ably demonstrated that it is team work that brings results. Although being president of the Federation is a "full-time job" it is not a "one man job". We give and we receive in any term of service and although many duties come, the joy of contact with club women, the friendship and the loyalty have sustained us in the year that has gone.

Your president appreciates deeply the many letters of encouragement received from presidents and members of individual clubs—these presidents and these clubs that are the very backbone of our Federation. She is not only grateful for these but highly honored that out of your busy lives, you have found time to pledge your co-operation without which no president can carry on the work of an organization. Your president has been blessed with the support of your past presidents who are always so willing to give of counsel and advice. Your vice-presidents have been a help and a joy; your secretaries have cooperated in every way to make the administration easier and your treasurer has been an efficient and loyal assistant. In fact the captain and the crew have learned the value of a friendship that will last through the years. Your president is very grateful to all who have worked so untiringly to complete the work of the year. In the many visits through the state she has felt the splendid loyalty and learned of the intimate background and great good accomplished by even the smaller clubs. All the way she has been

inspired by friendship—greatest boon ever bestowed—demonstrated in great measure as she meets and greets her friends—the club women of Maine.

Two delightful ports of General Federation have been made the past year in this ship of ours—the Board meeting in Washington and the Triennial in Kansas City. I wish that each of you could have had that intimate contact, touching hands and exchanging experiences with women from every state and women conversant with every kind of life that this great country of ours can furnish us. There is neither time nor opportunity to describe to you those inspiring conferences which your president enjoyed through your kindness and generosity and she deeply appreciates the honor of representing you at these sessions. Many of you have heard the story of them; many more will hear it in the days to come. The lessons learned there, the vision of what two million women working together can accomplish, can never be forgotten, bringing with them a higher sense of duty, a loftier inspiration, a desire for more consecrated service and a kindlier understanding.

It is not for this administration to complete all the objectives of the Federation. We have our little hour to walk across the stage made sacred by the feet of those who have gone before, consecrated to high endeavor and noble purpose. It is for us to uphold these principles, strive for these objectives and further these achievements that those who come after us can say that we have kept the faith. We realize that in the future we must look to the Junior Club Women for assistance in every project. We must work with them, girding their youth with the armor of faith and the sword of courage that they may take our places in the battle of life. They have the characteristics of youth, the idealism and daring that dominate life. They are the hope of our Federation and we are building a bridge over which we never shall walk but over which their feet will cross to greater achievements in the years to come.

The main objectives of this administration have been the Educational Loan Fund, the Foundation Fund and the Endowment Fund. It has always been a joy to me to know that we women of Maine, banded together, working together could aid the children of other women to become through education better citizens of our state. At the Triennial in Kansas City we were encouraged to know that we were, also, doing our part in financing our own State projects through the Endowment Fund that receives half of all contributions to the Foundation Fund. Remembering that, as Mrs. Lawson said, "The General Federation is only **you** multiplied. The benefits of the Foundation Fund will be felt for generations to come." The fact that all these contributions are voluntary proves the interest of the clubs in both General and State Federations.

That we won the award for the largest per capita increase in subscriptions to the Clubwoman, both in Senior and Junior Clubs, was very gratifying to your president at the Triennial meeting. We

were very happy to receive an award, also, for the largest number of consecutive programs on the Constitution presented by the General Federation Department of American Citizenship. Maine can certainly keep pace with other states and has won a place of honor at these meetings of the General Federation.

It is fitting at this time to pay tribute to our own state publication and its editor who, although she has been elected to the office of president of the New England Conference of State Federations of Women's Clubs has not lessened her interest in the Federation News. Your president, in reading publications from other states, can point with pride to our own magazine as being excelled by none. The News and the Year Book accompanying it are a vital need to every club woman in the state and your president hopes that you will honor it and the editor this year by renewal of old and taking of new subscriptions.

So the first year of this administration draws to a close. The next year will be a vital one. From working with you the past months we know that you have the ability and the power to move forward to the solution of our common problems. May you be stirred as never before to work together to preserve the ideals of our Federation! Though times of discouragement may come to leaders and club members alike, right always has and always shall prevail and we shall steadily march forward to meet the responsibilities of home, state and nation.

May we have enthusiasm, courage and service, increase of membership and a vow from each clubwoman to do her best! Then shall the good ship Federation plow ahead on its course, rough or smooth, rain or shine, and make port with a fine cargo in the harbor of 1939.

"So let us live today.
Do something that will take
A little sadness from the world's vast store,
And may we be so favored as to make
Of joy's too scanty sum a little more.
Let us give something that will aid mankind,
A word of courage or a bit of cheer,
A friendly handclasp and a kindly smile,
A light to gleam across a pathway drear.

Because of some good deed to fellow man,

The autumn meeting was held at Poland Spring in September. On the first afternoon, after greetings from Past Presidents and Guests, our new President, Mrs. Maude Clark Gay, in her welcoming address, spoke on our new motto: "Faith with the past; courage for the future." She stressed the need for more intensive work in fields which the Federation has already entered, and for expansion along lines where need of its assistance is clearly indicated.

At the President's Banquet, the Maine Federation was delighted to have as its guest of honor Miss Emily Louise Plumley, Chairman of the New England Conference, and was gratified that so many other members of the Conference were present.

At this banquet, Mrs. Gay greeted the new Directors who then introduced the Presidents of the different clubs in their districts and

gave a brief outline of work to be undertaken during the coming year. Eleven of the thirteen District Directors were present.

The main speaker of the meeting was Dr. John Smith Lowe, former pastor of the Church of the Immanuel in Boston, whose talk on "Our Inheritance and Our Hope" made a most impressive sequel to Mrs. Gay's address on our motto. Dr. Lowe sounded a clear call for greater appreciation of the privileges enjoyed in this country and the necessity for alertness in safeguarding our American ideals of life, especially in these troubled times.

The meeting adjourned at noon on September 15 and was immediately followed by the twenty-eighth annual meeting of the New England Conference of State Federations of Women's Clubs, on September 15, 16 and 17, for which the Maine Federation of Women's Clubs was hostess.

BY-LAWS OF THE MAINE FEDERATION OF WOMEN'S CLUBS

as

Revised according to vote at 39th Annual Convention

ARTICLE I—NAME

This organization shall be known as the Maine Federation of Women's Clubs.

ARTICLE II—OBJECT

Its object shall be to bring together the various women's literary and educational clubs of the State for mutual benefit and helpfulness to others; to enable them to compare methods of study and work; and to promote legislative, civic, educational, moral and social measures.

ARTICLE III—MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. Clubs and organizations desiring to join the Maine Federation of Women's Clubs should make application to the Corresponding Secretary. The application of each club and organization should be accompanied by a copy of its constitution or by-laws, showing that its character is educational and literary, and that its objects are in harmony with the objects of the Federation.

Section 2. Clubs and organizations may be admitted to membership at the annual meeting of the Federation, or at any regularly called meeting of the Executive Board, a two-thirds vote of members present and voting being necessary in either case for admission of a club.

ARTICLE IV—OFFICERS

Section 1. The State Federation officers shall be a President, who shall be ex-officio General Federation Director; a First Vice-President, a Second Vice-President, a Recording Secretary, a Corresponding Secretary, and a Treasurer. These officers with the thirteen District Directors, shall constitute an Advisory Committee.

Section 2. The officers alone shall constitute an Executive Board.

Section 3. No officers shall be eligible to the same office for more than two consecutive years, except the treasurer, who shall be eligible for re-election.

Section 4. There shall be no salaried officers. Necessary expenses incurred by officers in the service of the Federation may be refunded from the treasury by order of the Executive Board and Finance Committee.

ARTICLE V—DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1. The State President shall preside at all meetings of the State Federation and of the Executive Board and Advisory Committee. She shall be, ex-officio, a member of all Departments and Committees, and shall approve all bills and draw all warrants, before they are presented for payment to the Treasurer.

Section 2. The Vice-Presidents, in order of their election, shall preside in absence of the President. The First Vice-President shall be Chairman of the District Directors. The Second Vice-President shall be Chairman of the Department Chairmen.

Section 3. The Recording Secretary shall keep the minutes of all meetings of the Federation and of the Executive Board and Advisory Committee.

Section 4. The Corresponding Secretary shall conduct all correspondence of the State Federation and shall keep a correct list of all clubs belonging thereto. With the assistance of the District Directors, she shall collect all data and material for the Year Book and furnish a typewritten copy of the same to the printer. She shall send out the call and credentials for all meetings. It shall also be her duty to edit the Year Book, but it shall be the duty of the outgoing administration, in collaboration with the incoming Executive Board, to compile the Year Book closing its term of office.

Section 5. The Treasurer shall collect all money due or belonging to the State Federation, and hold all securities except as hereinafter provided. She shall disburse funds on written order of the President, countersigned by the Chairman of the Finance Committee. The books shall be closed and ready for examination by a certified public accountant one week before each annual meeting. The funds shall be deposited in a bank approved by the Executive Board. A bond shall be given in such sum as the Executive Board may direct.

Section 6. A certified public accountant shall audit the accounts of the Treasurer, also the accounts of any committee or officer having charge of any Federation funds. At least one week before the annual meeting, the books of the Treasurer, also the accounts of any committee or officer having funds, shall be audited by a certified public accountant, selected by the State President, and the report of the accountant shall be presented to the Convention.

ARTICLE VI—EXECUTIVE BOARD

Section 1. The Executive Board shall conduct all necessary business of the Federation during the interim between meetings, except amending the By-Laws or modifying any action of the Federation. A report of all meetings shall be given at each State meeting.

RESOLUTIONS

Adopted at Annual Meeting, June 28-30, 1938

MARIHUANA

Resolved: That the Maine Federation of Women's Clubs in Convention assembled, June, 1938, favors the enactment of such legislation as shall be necessary or desirable for the control of the traffic in and use of Marihuana.

APPOINTIVE POSITIONS FOR WOMEN

Resolved: That it is the sense of the Maine Federation of Women's Clubs, in convention assembled in June, 1938, that there should be more women in both appointive and elective offices, and be it further Resolved: That a committee be appointed whose duty it shall be to gather information in regard to appointive positions which are or may become vacant, or for which appointments are to be made, to notify the Executive Board of such vacancies or prospective appointments, and to give publicity to such information.

REGULATION OF SALE OF BEER

Whereas: It has been noticed that the State Liquor Commission has been granting retail licenses to gasoline filling stations all over the State, and

Whereas: It is the opinion of this Federation that the selling of gasoline and beer at one and the same place is not only psychologically unsound, but also is likely to create a dangerous condition as relating to automobile driving, therefore, be it

Resolved: that the Maine Federation of Women's Clubs in convention assembled, June, 1938, respectfully requests the Maine State Liquor Commission to refuse to grant licenses for the selling of beer to gasoline filling stations or to any establishment within 500 feet of a filling station; and, if the making of such regulation is not within the power of the Commission, that this Federation see to it that legislation be introduced at the next session of the Legislature which will give the Commission such power.

WORLD LANGUAGE

Whereas: The Maine Federation of Women's Clubs recognizes the importance of every effort to improve communication among people of different national cultures, and

Whereas, this Federation realizes that a common language available to people of all national tongues would greatly facilitate such communication and contribute toward intellectual tolerance, therefore, be it

Resolved: That the Maine Federation of Women's Clubs, in convention assembled, June, 1938, authorizes the appointment of one of its members whose duty it shall be to supply the Federation with information concerning the work of the International Auxiliary Language Association and all efforts being made toward the adoption of an international language.



ARTICLE VII—ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The officers and the District Directors shall constitute an Advisory Committee whose duty it shall be to meet as soon as convenient following each annual meeting to appoint Department and Division Chairmen, Committee Chairmen and an Historian; the appointments in all cases to be approved by the State President. They shall also combine or discontinue lines of work and establish such committees as, in their judgment, are deemed advisable, and discuss and formulate plans for the Districts.

ARTICLE VIII—ELECTIONS

Section 1. All state officers shall be elected by ballot at the annual meeting for a term of two years except the Corresponding Secretary who shall be appointed by the President.

Section 2. The nominations for each officer to be elected shall be made from the floor. Nominating speeches for President shall be limited to five minutes and for each other officer to two minutes. There shall be a second or seconds but no seconding speeches. The names put in nominations shall be posted in plain view, and the election shall be by written ballot. A plurality of legal ballots shall elect.

Section 3. If a vacancy occurs in the office of President, the First Vice-President shall become President. If she cannot serve, the Second Vice-President shall take office. All other vacancies in the Executive Board, the Chairmanships of the Departments of work, or the District Directors, shall be filled by the Executive Board.

ARTICLE IX—FEDERATION DISTRICTS

Section 1. To facilitate the work of the Federation, the state shall be divided into thirteen Federation Districts, each to be presided over by a District Director, who shall be appointed by the Executive Board.

Section 2. A club or organization belonging to the State Federation must belong to one of the Districts. All clubs or organizations holding membership in the District Federation must previously have been admitted to membership in the State Federation.

Section 3. There shall be held in each District two meetings during the two year period, at least one of which shall be open to all of the club members in the District.

Section 4. Each District Director shall keep in communication with all the clubs of her district and visit them when possible; shall attend the meetings of the Advisory Committee and assist the Corresponding Secretary in collecting for the Year Book the data of the clubs of her district. She shall assist in organizing new clubs and shall co-operate in carrying out the work of the departments.

Section 5. A registration fee may be charged to defray the expenses of the District Conference whenever thought advisable by the Director of the District.

ARTICLE X—MEETINGS

Section 1. The Annual Convention shall be held in May of each year unless otherwise advised by the Executive Board.

Section 2. In September or October of alternate years there shall be a fall conference; and each legislative year there shall be a mid-winter conference in January at Augusta.

Section 3. Each club belonging to the Federation may be represented at each of the above meetings by its President and one delegate and by one additional delegate for every fifty members or majority fraction thereof after the first fifty. Federation Unions and affiliated organizations may be represented by the President and one delegate. Officers, District Directors, Department and Division Chairmen, Chairmen of Standing Committees and Past Presidents shall be voting members of these meetings.

Section 4. Other members of the clubs belonging to the State Federation may be present at the meeting and take part in discussions, but shall not introduce motions or vote.

Section 5. No matter of legislation shall be approved or disapproved unless, previous to the meeting at which action is taken, notice of such proposed action shall have been published in the "Federation News" or shall have been sent to each club belonging to the Federation.

Section 6. Meetings shall be conducted according to Roberts' Revised Rules of Order.

ARTICLE XI—FINANCES

Section 1. The annual dues shall be fifteen cents per capita for each club. Federation Unions shall pay three dollars each annually. Affiliated Organizations shall pay five dollars for each one hundred members or majority fraction thereof. Clubs and Affiliated Organizations in arrears for dues shall not be entitled to be represented at the meetings of the Federation.

Section 2. All clubs which have failed to pay dues by the end of the year, may after due notice be dropped from membership.

Section 3. There shall be a Finance Committee composed of five members which shall include the President, and the Treasurer of the Federation, also a Chairman and two other members who shall be nominated and elected from the floor. This Committee shall prepare a budget for approval by the Executive Board. The Chairman shall approve all bills before their payment by the Treasurer.

Section 4. A registration fee may be charged to defray the expenses of the state meetings whenever thought advisable by the Executive Board.

ARTICLE XII—STANDING COMMITTEES

Section 1. There shall be a Committee on State Endowment of five members, whose duties shall be to further the interest of an Endowment Fund for the Maine Federation.

Section 2. There shall be a Committee on Resolutions. All recommendations of officers, except those calling for appropriations of money, shall be referred to this Committee. All resolutions introduced by members shall be read aloud in the Federation and referred without debate to the Committee, which shall consider and report them to the Federation, or reject them, as it deems best. The Committee shall be empowered to make such additions to, modifications of, or combinations of the resolutions referred to it, as it chooses, and also to frame resolutions of its own and report them to the Federation. It shall report each day for action by the Federation such resolutions as it shall have approved or framed, and shall make its final report during the last session of the Federation. Nothing in this section shall impair the right of members to bring before the voting body any resolution which the Committee shall have rejected.

Section 3. The Historian shall collect and have the custody of all State Federation Year Books, Club Histories, State Convention programs and files of the Federation News, and such other records as the Executive Board shall require. She shall give to her successor an itemized statement of all properties held by her. She shall give an annual report to the Convention.

ARTICLE XIII—EDUCATIONAL LOAN FUND

As soon as practicable after the State Federation election, the Advisory Committee shall appoint an Educational Loan Fund Committee consisting of thirteen members, one from each district, and a Chairman and a Treasurer to have charge of the Fund. Not less than seven of those appointed shall have served on this committee during the preceding administration. The Treasurer of this Committee shall have custody of all money coming into the hands of said Committee, and of all notes or obligations of any kind. A full report shall be given by the Chairman and Treasurer of this Committee at each annual meeting.

ARTICLE XIV—QUORUMS

Section 1. Representation from ten clubs shall be sufficient to constitute a voting body for either the Annual Meeting or Fall Conference. At any session, one-third of the voting membership shall be a quorum.

Section 2. The quorum for the Executive Board shall be four. The quorum for the Advisory Committee shall be ten.

ARTICLE XV—ENTERTAINMENT

Officers of the Maine Federation, invited guests, and Chairmen of Departments shall be eligible to free entertainment at the annual meeting.

ARTICLE XVI—AMENDMENTS

These By-Laws may be amended at any delegated meeting by a two-thirds vote of those present and voting, notice of the proposed amendment having been appended to the call for the meeting, or presented at a previous meeting.
