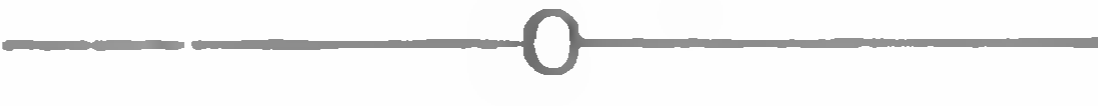

MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT OF THE GENERAL FEDERATION OF WOMEN'S CLUBS

Dear Co-workers in Maine:—

One of the happy things that comes to a National president is an unexpected contact made while on a field trip. This has just happened to me, in New Hampshire and Vermont, where I have met and traveled with Mrs. Eva Mason and Mrs. Roselle Huddleston. Together we have enjoyed the New Hampshire and Vermont meetings and each of us is taking home renewed faith, courage, inspiration and determination.

Mrs. Mason has given me the opportunity of sending a little greeting to you through your year-book edition. I wish I could meet you at Rangeley Lakes or some other fascinating place in beautiful Maine, but it seems impossible. Please, therefore, count this as a personal greeting and accept my sincere hope that the Club-year of 1940-'41 will enrich your own lives through your service for others.

I know that you all feel we are sailing unknown, uncharted seas this year. The very air is filled with fears, doubts, misunderstandings. We know we face new situations and that tomorrow will not be like yesterday. Do not be afraid of change. Do not be bound or hampered by traditions. Step boldly into the swiftly moving current of present-day life. It is not how we fare, but how life fares!

Our Good Neighbor Tour to South America convinced the members of our party that we must learn to think of **Continental** solidarity and to realize that a movement toward conquest anywhere in this hemisphere, whether military or economic, is of primary importance to North America. Secretary of State, Mr. Hull, had this in mind when he said: "I am firmly convinced that what is taking place today in many areas of the earth is a relentless attempt to transform the civilized world as we know it into a world in which lawlessness, violence and force will reign supreme. The people of this country cannot recognize too soon this fact and its overwhelming significance for our national safety and for the maintenance of our national institutions.....We cannot pursue complacently the course of our customary normal lives."

Never before has there been greater need, for unity, for multiplied strength. We have such possibilities within the State and National Federation! The world of no one individual can exist for long without social organization. The more modern our times become, the closer knit and the more dependent are individuals. Each large group in which we find ourselves brings with it new privileges, new necessity, new advantages. It also brings new complications and new distractions. Do not follow unknown, unsafe, emotional appeals. Weigh carefully each proposal placed before you and let it not lead you astray from the greatest contribution you can make—the enrichment of your community life. The well-being of American citizens, in our Democracy, is of primary importance, even in a national defense program. This should be our first field of service. Let us thrust deeply into the areas of social and economic welfare of our people.

We trust that sometime we shall sleep

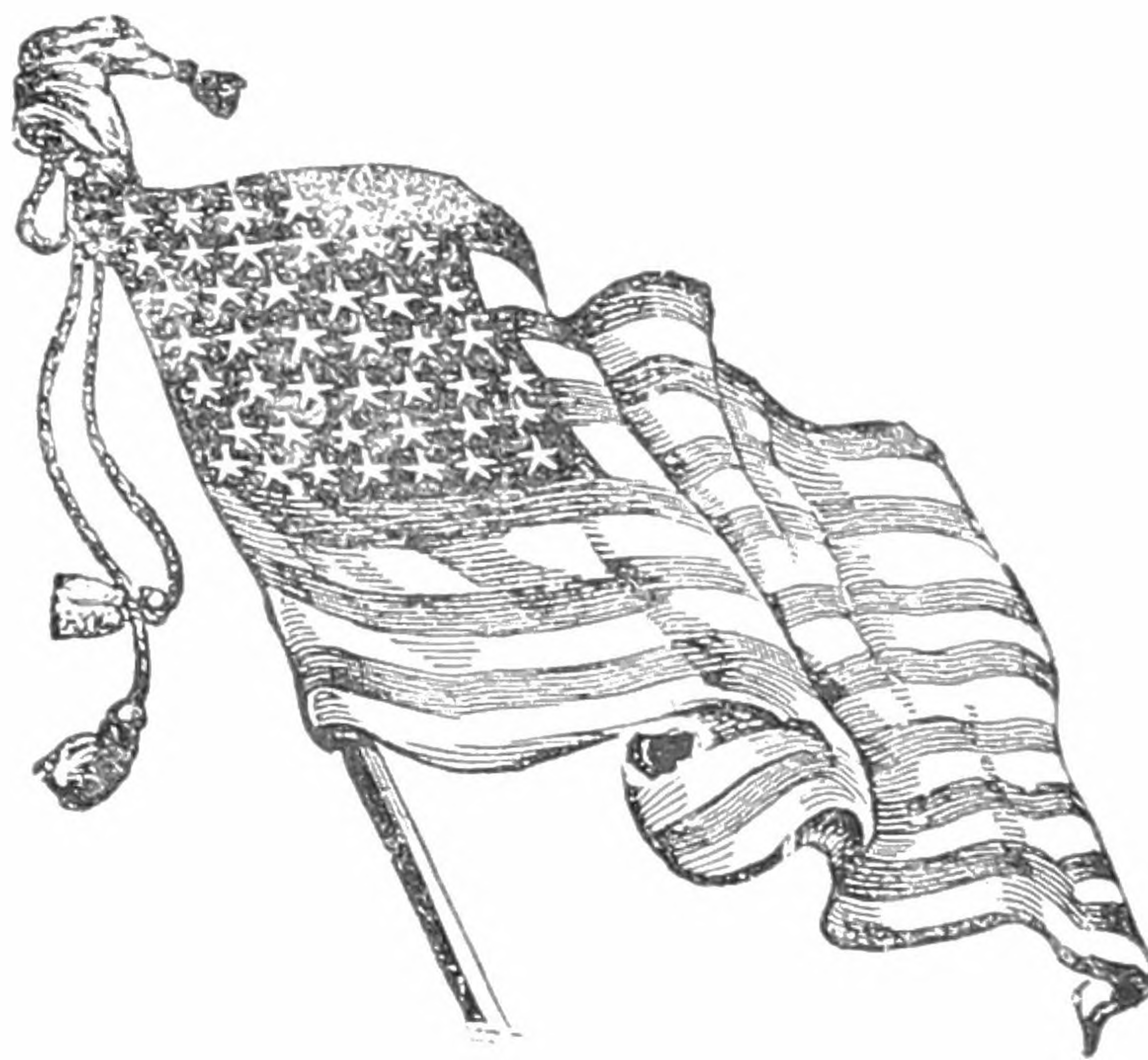
Beneath the dear old pines of Maine.

ANNUAL DUES

Club dues are payable at beginning of fiscal year which starts at close of annual meeting. Make all checks payable to Maine Federation of Women's Clubs and send to State Treasurer,

DUTIES OF DISTRICT DIRECTOR

To acquaint herself with the clubs of her district and to visit them whenever possible.

To co-operate with the Chairman of Club Extension and encourage clubs to join the State Federation.

To assist in the organization of new clubs, both Junior and Senior.

To acquaint herself with the work of all State Chairmen and to promote the work outlined by them.

To secure and compile the data on her district for the Year Book.

To keep a record of the work of the district and give a complete report at the annual meeting.

To hold District Conferences at least once during the club year.

To act as Aides to the Press and Publicity chairman in order that she may keep in close touch with unusual events taking place in club districts.

To foster and encourage a spirit that will inspire every club to work for the welfare of the state; to develop an increasing loyalty to the State Federation and to the General Federation.

To encourage clubwomen to subscribe to the Federation News.

DUTIES OF CHAIRMEN

Each Chairman is expected:

To become familiar with the conditions and needs of the State pertaining to the several Divisions of the Department.

To send to each Club President and State Federation President a circular letter outlining suggestions for work.

To pass on to her successor a resume of all work done during her term of office.

To present the work of her department at District Meetings, whenever possible, upon invitation of the Director.

To report the year's work at the annual convention, sending a typewritten copy of such report to the President at least one week before the annual meeting. Duplicate copies should be mailed at the same time to the Maine dailies for publicity.

It is most important that all bills of Department Chairmen and Division Chairmen be in the hands of the President by May first.

Chairmen of Departments, Divisions and Committees are earnestly requested to send reports of their work to the appropriate Chairmen of the General Federation of Women's Clubs.

PRESIDENTS OF CLUBS

It is the duty of the President of each Federated club to bring before her club all communications from the State and General Federation officers and department chairmen in such a way as to make clear the purpose of the message.

She should answer promptly all communications, especially requests for information, thus showing courtesy to the individual and loyalty to the Federation. Nothing retards the work of the State organization so much as the failure to give information promptly.

Please notify the Corresponding Secretary of any change in club officers. Because of neglect of this duty many clubs fail to receive credential cards and important notices.

Send copies of your Club Year Book to the State President and also to your District Director.

Report to your District Director the name of any unfederated club in your community and the name of the President of same.

Each Club President should appoint a Press Committee to edit a column of club news at least once each week in the local daily papers, and to send interesting club news to Mrs. Harriett Gray, Dover-Foxcroft.

EDUCATIONAL LOAN FUND

The State Federation maintains an Educational Loan Fund from which money is loaned to worthy students upon recommendation of the members of the committee. In order to extend the usefulness of this fund and to win more support for it, a committee consisting of one member from each district has been appointed. Applications may be made to the committee; if approved, such application will be referred to the chairman who will give the necessary instructions. Contributions are solicited from the clubs for this worthy cause.

Make checks payable to the Maine Federation of Women's Clubs, but send them to Mrs. Edna A. Hutchins, Corinna, the treasurer of the Committee.

THE "FEDERATION NEWS"

The "Federation News" is published four times a year, the price, fifty cents for the four copies, thirty-five cents to clubs subscribing 100%.

To members of federated clubs: this copy of the Year Book is fifty cents if sold separately; to all others the price is \$1.00.

FIVE-YEAR PLAN—FOUNDATION FUND

The Five-Year Plan is a practical reorganization of the Foundation Fund and does not solicit pledges from those clubs which have completed the quota for the Foundation Fund.

The General Federation is placing a new Five-Year Plan before the clubs which have not made or have not completed their contribution to the Foundation Fund. It provides that each club shall contribute two dollars and a half per member, to be paid in five-year installments of fifty cents annually. This is entirely a voluntary contribution, and half of the sum contributed will go to our State Federation endowment fund, which needs further contributions toward our goal of \$10,000. We ask the clubs to consider this plan carefully. We shall also be glad to receive personal pledges, if any are so disposed.

Make all checks payable to the Maine Federation of Women's clubs but send to the Chairman of the Foundation Fund Committee, Mrs. John T. Skolfield, Portland.

BILLS

All bills against the Federation must be sent to the President.

If bills are not in the hands of the President by May first delay in payment will be unavoidable.

CLUB DATA—IMPORTANT

The club data sheet will be sent to the Secretary of each club on or before March first. As soon as the Club elects its new officers, the Secretary will fill out the data sheet carefully and send it to her District Director.

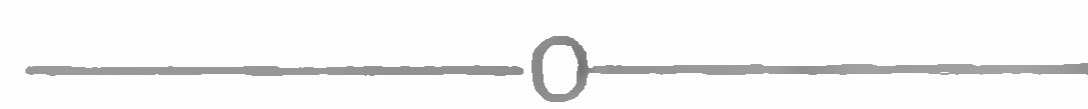

REPORTS OF OFFICERS

PRESIDENT'S REPORT



Dear Club Friends:

My message comes to you with the joy and promise of summer.

With all of the forces of destruction going on in other lands we must think of the lights of America as a symbol of our duty to carry the torch of progress and hold to the principles which will preserve our Democracy.

We have every opportunity to acquaint ourselves with the conditions of the day. Comfort, happiness and joy in living we share together; but while our lives go happily on do not let us forget those less fortunate.

May we not hold our heads a little higher, because we belong to this great army of club women who are earnestly studying and helping to solve the great vital issues of our day? Our path has indeed been made easier for us be-

cause these Pioneer Women, whom we honor this year, braved scorn and ridicule, that this great Federation might come into being, this Federation that is conceded to be one of the greatest forces for good in America today.

To quote Mrs. Sadie Orr Dunbar, "Do we care enough?" to enlarge our tent and to lengthen the cords which bind us within the Federation? Let our answer ring with truth and sincerity. Yes, Mrs. Dunbar, we, in Maine, "Do Care Enough."

Again we have reached the close of the club year. The records show many Birthday parties have been held in almost all of the Thirteen Districts. Gifts have been given to the Golden Jubilee Fund; medals have been presented to the pioneer women; many subscriptions have been sent for the Clubwoman GFWC, and several new clubs have made application for membership.

We are proud of our accomplishments. We have looked backward and forward. We have had tasks to do and together we have done them.

I would like to tell you briefly of the Council meeting in Milwaukee.

Of one of our Maine Clubs winning the prize for the best scrapbook from a club of between fifty and a hundred and twenty-five members.

At the first business session of the Council Mrs. Dunbar opened with this prayer: "May God grant us peace; May this organization of women as it enters the second 50 years of its existence, rededicate its potential power toward abolishment of war and hate throughout the World."

Mrs. Dunbar in her response to the Mayor's greeting said: "Only as we serve shall we deserve." She spoke of the 15,172 clubs, 50 State Federations and about 2,000,000 club members. She spoke of the condition of the country and of the confusion we are in.

One thousand women dined together on the opening night of the council meeting in the beautiful crystal dining room of the Hotel Schroeder and listened to introductions of pioneer club women who had given many years of service to their communities and to their country through the channels provided by organized woman's clubs. These pioneers, many of whom were well past the accepted limit of "three score years and ten."

This was a serious convention, distinguished by unusual variation of opinion, unchecked expression of such differences in spirited argument. On few occasions have delegates to G. F. Council or convention meetings displayed such determination in defense of individual thought. Free discussion was encouraged, honest opinion respected, patience exercised with the impatient.

Presiding over parliamentary procedure was the quiet, alert, clear-thinking 93 year old Emma A. Fox, who was never absent from her post. She was the life of the party on most occasions and whose judgment was never questioned.

The strongest plea to the convention, and one which found its way into almost every address, was that of participation in a war against fear, hate and doubt, so that our Democracy may remain invulnerable. "The spiritual force, made effective, is the greatest possible strengthening force in these trying times," was a much reiterated declaration.

Helen Hayes in person was brought, with the entire cast of "Cavalcade of America" to present a story of the life of Jane Addams. Nothing could have been more appropriate or inspiring. The National Broadcasting Company has the gratitude of the Federation and its guests.

The Council was addressed by many notable men and women from a world of research workers—those who live their lives in colleges, pulpits, business pursuits, politics, industry, adventure and social service.

These interpretations of the crying needs of today's world were the measuring sticks by which activities of clubwomen could most accurately be measured.

This is our Annual meeting. This is the time of accounting and of evaluation of one year of work and administration. It is a time of looking back and searching in the years that are past for work done, for visions made into actuality, and for a review for all things accomplished.

"Courage, is the price that life exacts!" It was Amelia Earhart who wrote those words. Surely, courage was so interwoven in her living, and, doubtless, in her death that it is strange that she should think these words. Her courage was that of the open sky, the headlines and public acclaim. Our courage is of a far more quiet nature. When we are courageous, no one knows about that courage many times, but it is a quality we must have to meet each day of living.

I have been told it takes courage to be a club president. It does, for one becomes immediately in the "public eye." One must make decisions and be counted, and unwaveringly stand for that which one counts best. It takes courage to be a club member. To assume the tasks assigned and do them well, when life is so full of many things. To keep one's tongue from criticism. To lift one's mind from the too little things of life. All this requires and demands courage.

The Officers of the Federation have meant so much to me this year that I find it impossible to speak of them in an impersonal or detached way. They have supported me loyally at all times. I have had the spiritual strength not of one woman, but of my entire Board. They have guided me, helped me, encouraged me, throughout the year. They are more than State Federation Officers to me, they are dear and valued friends.

Our Clubs have done faithfully and well the work set before them. Their achievements will be enumerated in the reports of their Directors. I want to express to everyone of you my deep affection for you and my sincere thanks for all you have done to make this club year a year of progress for the Maine Federation of Women's Clubs.

"Life is sweet because of the Friends we have made,
And the things which in common we share,
We want to live on, not because of ourselves,
But because of the people who care;
It's giving and doing for somebody else,
On that all life's splendor depends,
And the joy of this world, when you've summed it all up—
Is found in the making of Friends."

BY-LAWS OF THE MAINE FEDERATION OF WOMEN'S CLUBS

as

Revised according to vote at 39th Annual Convention

ARTICLE I—NAME

This organization shall be known as the Maine Federation of Women's Clubs.

ARTICLE II—OBJECT

Its object shall be to bring together the various women's literary and educational clubs of the State for mutual benefit and helpfulness to others; to enable them to compare methods of study and work; and to promote legislative, civic, educational, moral and social measures.

ARTICLE III—MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. Clubs and organizations desiring to join the Maine Federation of Women's Clubs should make application to the Corresponding Secretary. The application of each club and organization should be accompanied by a copy of its constitution or by-laws, showing that its character is educational and literary, and that its objects are in harmony with the objects of the Federation.

Section 2. Clubs and organizations may be admitted to membership at the annual meeting of the Federation, or at any regularly called meeting of the Executive Board, a two-thirds vote of members present and voting being necessary in either case for admission of a club.

ARTICLE IV—OFFICERS

Section 1. The State Federation officers shall be a President, who shall be ex-officio General Federation Director; a First Vice-President, a Second Vice-President, a Recording Secretary, a Corresponding Secretary and a Treasurer. These officers with the thirteen District Directors, shall constitute an Advisory Committee.

Section 2. The officers alone shall constitute an Executive Board.

Section 3. No officers shall be eligible to the same office for more than two consecutive years, except the treasurer, who shall be eligible for re-election.

Section 4. There shall be no salaried officers. Necessary expenses incurred by officers in the service of the Federation may be refunded from the treasury by order of the Executive Board and Finance Committee.

ARTICLE V—DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1. The State President shall preside at all meetings of the State Federation and of the Executive Board and Advisory Committee. She shall be, ex-officio, a member of all Departments and Committees,

and shall approve all bills, and draw all warrants, before they are presented for payment to the Treasurer.

Section 2. The Vice-Presidents, in order of their election, shall preside in absence of the President. The First Vice-President shall be Chairman of the District Directors. The Second Vice-President shall be Chairman of the Department Chairmen.

Section 3. The Recording Secretary shall keep the minutes of all meetings of the Federation and of the Executive Board and Advisory Committee.

Section 4. The Corresponding Secretary shall conduct all correspondence of the State Federation and shall keep a correct list of all clubs belonging thereto. With the assistance of the District Directors, she shall collect all data and material for the Year Book and furnish a typewritten copy of the same to the printer. She shall send out the call and credentials for all meetings. It shall also be her duty to edit the Year Book, but it shall be the duty of the outgoing administration, in collaboration with the incoming Executive Board, to compile the Year Book closing its term of office.

Section 5. The Treasurer shall collect all money due or belonging to the State Federation, and hold all securities except as hereinafter provided. She shall disburse funds on written order of the President, countersigned by the Chairman of the Finance Committee. The books shall be closed and ready for examination by a certified public accountant one week before each annual meeting. The funds shall be deposited in a bank approved by the Executive Board. A bond shall be given in such sum as the Executive Board may direct.

Section 6. A certified public accountant shall audit the accounts of the Treasurer, also the accounts of any committee or officer having charge of any Federation funds. At least one week before the annual meeting, the books of the Treasurer, also the accounts of any committee or officer having funds, shall be audited by a certified public accountant, selected by the State President, and the report of the accountant shall be presented to the Convention.

ARTICLE VI—EXECUTIVE BOARD

Section 1. The Executive Board shall conduct all necessary business of the Federation during the interim between meetings, except amending the By-Laws or modifying any action of the Federation. A report of all meetings shall be given at each State meeting.

ARTICLE VII—ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The officers and the District Directors shall constitute an Advisory Committee whose duty it shall be to meet as soon as convenient following each annual meeting to appoint Department and Division Chairmen, Committee Chairmen and an Historian; the appointments in all cases to be approved by the State President. They shall also combine or discontinue lines of work and establish such committees as, in their

judgment, are deemed advisable, and discuss and formulate plans for the Districts.

ARTICLE VIII—ELECTIONS

Section 1. All state officers shall be elected by ballot at the annual meeting for a term of two years except the Corresponding Secretary who shall be appointed by the President.

Section 2. The nominations for each officer to be elected shall be made from the floor. Nominating speeches for President shall be limited to five minutes and for each other officer to two minutes. There shall be a second or seconds but no seconding speeches. The names put in nominations shall be posted in plain view, and the election shall be by written ballot. A plurality of legal ballots shall elect.

Section 3. If a vacancy occurs in the office of President, the First Vice-President shall become President. If she cannot serve, the Second Vice-President shall take office. All other vacancies in the Executive Board, the Chairmanships of the Departments of work, or the District Directors, shall be filled by the Executive Board.

ARTICLE IX—FEDERATION DISTRICTS

Section 1. To facilitate the work of the Federation, the state shall be divided into thirteen Federation Districts, each to be presided over by a District Director, who shall be appointed by the Executive Board.

Section 2. A club or organization belonging to the State Federation must belong to one of the Districts. All clubs or organizations holding membership in the District Federation must previously have been admitted to membership in the State Federation.

Section 3. There shall be held in each District two meetings during the two year period, at least one of which shall be open to all of the club members in the District.

Section 4. Each District Director shall keep in communication with all the clubs of her district and visit them when possible; shall attend the meetings of the Advisory Committee and assist the Corresponding Secretary in collecting for the Year Book the data of the clubs of her district. She shall assist in organizing new clubs and shall co-operate in carrying out the work of the departments.

Section 5. A registration fee may be charged to defray the expenses of the District Conference whenever thought advisable by the Director of the District.

ARTICLE X—MEETINGS

Section 1. The Annual Convention shall be held in May of each year unless otherwise advised by the Executive Board.

Section 2. In September or October of alternate years there shall be a fall conference; and each legislative year there shall be a mid-winter conference in January at Augusta.

Section 3. Each club belonging to the Federation may be represented at each of the above meetings by its President and one delegate and by one additional delegate for every fifty members or majority fraction thereof after the first fifty. Federation Unions and affiliated organizations may be represented by the President and one delegate. Officers, District Directors, Department and Division Chairmen, Chairmen of Standing Committees and Past Presidents shall be voting members of these meetings.

Section 4. Other members of the clubs belonging to the State Federation may be present at the meeting and take part in discussions, but shall not introduce motions or vote.

Section 5. No matter of legislation shall be approved or disapproved unless, previous to the meeting at which action is taken, notice of such proposed action shall have been published in the "Federation News" or shall have been sent to each club belonging to the Federation.

Section 6. Meetings shall be conducted according to Roberts' Revised Rules of Order.

ARTICLE XI—FINANCES

Section 1. The annual dues shall be fifteen cents per capita for each club. Federation Unions shall pay three dollars each annually. Affiliated Organizations shall pay five dollars for each one hundred members or majority fraction thereof. Clubs and affiliated organizations in arrears for dues shall not be entitled to be represented at the meetings of the Federation.

Section 2. All clubs which have failed to pay dues by the end of the year, may after due notice be dropped from membership.

Section 3. There shall be a Finance Committee composed of five members which shall include the President, and the Treasurer of the Federation, also a Chairman and two other members who shall be nominated and elected from the floor. This Committee shall prepare a budget for approval by the Executive Board. The Chairman shall approve all bills before their payment by the Treasurer.

Section 4. A registration fee may be charged to defray the expenses of the state meetings whenever thought advisable by the Executive Board.

ARTICLE XII—STANDING COMMITTEES

Section 1. There shall be a Committee on State Endowment of five members, whose duties shall be to further the interest of an Endowment Fund of the Maine Federation.

Section 2. There shall be a Committee on Resolutions. All recommendations of officers, except those calling for appropriations of money, shall be referred to this Committee. All resolutions introduced by members shall be read aloud in the Federation and referred without debate to the Committee, which shall consider and report them to

the Federation, or reject them, as it deems best. The Committee shall be empowered to make such additions to, modifications of, or combinations of the resolutions referred to it, as it chooses, and also to frame resolutions of its own and report them to the Federation. It shall report each day for action by the Federation such resolutions as it shall have approved or framed, and shall make its final report during the last session of the Federation. Nothing in this section shall impair the right of members to bring before the voting body any resolution which the Committee shall have rejected.

Section 3. The Historian shall collect and have the custody of all State Federation Year Books, Club Histories, State Convention programs and files of the Federation News, and such other records as the Executive Board shall require. She shall give to her successor an itemized statement of all properties held by her. She shall give an annual report to the Convention.

ARTICLE XIII—EDUCATIONAL LOAN FUND

As soon as practicable after the State Federation election, the Advisory Committee shall appoint an Educational Loan Fund Committee consisting of thirteen members, one from each district, and a Chairman and a Treasurer to have charge of the Fund. Not less than seven of those appointed shall have served on this committee during the preceding administration. The Treasurer of this Committee shall have custody of all money coming into the hands of said Committee, and of all notes or obligations of any kind. A full report shall be given by the Chairman and Treasurer of this Committee at each annual meeting.

ARTICLE XIV—QUORUMS

Section 1. Representation from ten clubs shall be sufficient to constitute a voting body for either the Annual Meeting or Fall Conference. At any session, one-third of the voting membership shall be a quorum.

Section 2. The quorum for the Executive Board shall be four. The quorum for the Advisory Committee shall be ten.

ARTICLE XV—ENTERTAINMENT

Officers of the Maine Federation, invited guests, and Chairmen of Departments shall be eligible to free entertainment at the annual meeting.

ARTICLE XVI—AMENDMENTS

These By-Laws may be amended at any delegated meeting by a two-thirds vote of those present and voting, notice of the proposed amendment having been appended to the call for the meeting, or presented at a previous meeting.
