Dr. Churchill's "Crafts in Transition: A Case Study of Two Portland Silversmiths in the Early Nineteenth Century" appeared in the winter 1985 issue of the MHSQ.

The James Phinney Baxter Award of \$100.00 is given to promote excellence in the research and writing of Maine history; it is presented at the discretion of the Editorial Board to the author of the best article appearing in the MHS Quarterly during the volume year.

A native of Wisconsin, Dr. Churchill is curator of decorative arts at the Maine State Museum, where he has been employed since 1971. He received an MST degree at Wisconsin State University at River Falls in 1969 and a Ph.D. at the University of Maine at Orono in 1979. Dr. Churchill has written articles on American tinware, furniture, and silver and on early Maine and New England, and has published Simple Forms and Vivid Colors: Maine Painted Furniture, 1800-1850.

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
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
