COVER PHOTO: Franco-Americans like the Morin brothers, photographed in front of their Old Town fruit store in 1922, are an important force in the state's cultural and economic history. Maine's industries, agriculture, and, as the photograph illustrates, its commercial life benefited enormously from the great migration from Quebec to New England that began in the early nineteenth century. Franco-American life is the subject of two comprehensive bibliographical studies in this issue. The first, by Université Laval's French-American historian Yves Roby, was delivered at a 1983 conference sponsored by the Minister of Intergovernmental Affairs at Trois Rivières, Quebec, and describes the literature on Franco-Americans in New England. The second, by Professor Emeritus Alice R. Stewart of the University of Maine, discusses in similar fashion the literature on Franco-Americans in Maine. The cover photograph is from the collections of the Old Town Historical Museum.
