## Editor's Stencil

Vice President Charles E. Crossland received an Honorary Doctor of Laws Degree at the 1961 Commencement of the University, at Bangor Auditorium, Sunday, June 11. He is shown on our June cover just after the reading of the citation, as he is having the hood adjusted over his gown. Much happiness is evident in the picture, created by the surprise act of recognition for Mr. Crossland's long period of service and outstanding series of accomplishments.

Alumni, in addition to the University recognition, rendered tribute to Vice President Crossland by presenting to him and to Mrs. Crossland a gift of \$5,000, as a part of the program of Alumni Banquet on the evening before Commencement.

Among the accomplishments surely recommending Charles Crossland for these honors was the completion of the Memorial Union. That task lay heavily upon his shoulders, and the story of the conception and growth of the Union begins in the year that he graduated from Maine. It was 1917.

Forty-four years ago a group of students first donated money to begin a fund for a Union Building. At that time, \$152 was collected. The idea faded badly until it was somehow revived in the year 1945. The dream of those 1917 students was brought to life by the idea of an actively useful Memorial to Maine's honored dead, of World War II. Then Director of Student and Public Relations and Assistant to the President, Charles Crossland was a top proponent of and tireless worker for the project.

There were endless meetings, conferences, memos, reports and letters to deal with the problems of location, size, arrangement, schedule of construction, anticipated activities, costs. Mr. Crossland was right in the forefront of the battle to properly locate the building, not where the cannons are, because of alumni protests, but on a better site. This among other skirmishes he won, and it was through patience and with unanimity at the conference table.

The fund-raising campaign began in the spring of 1947. Mr. Crossland was named Executive Director of the fund drive. So sleepless were his travels for the enterprise that on one trip his car left the road and was demolished. Fortunately he was unhurt.

With a good portion of the funds collected, the decision was made to construct the building. The lower parts were completed in the spring of 1953, and on May 17 of that year, appropriate Open House ceremonies were held. The Memorial Union was dedicated to honored heroes.

The next step was a plan to complete the Union. Mr. Crossland assisted greatly in the task, and led others into the project. Money from a new capital campaign, The Arthur A. Hauck Building Fund, and money from the Bookstore and other sources finally paid for the completion. On April 30, 1961, the second floor, appropriately and beautifully done, was also dedicated by brief ceremonies and an open house celebration. Mr. Crossland was Chairman of the committee.

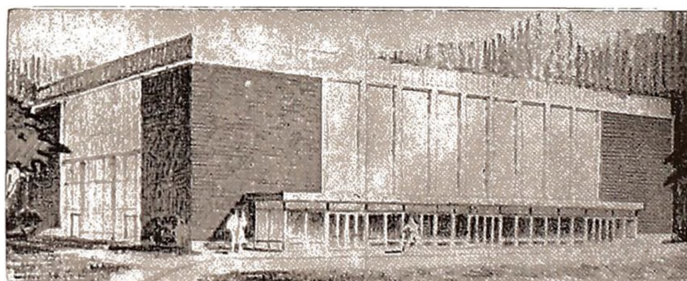
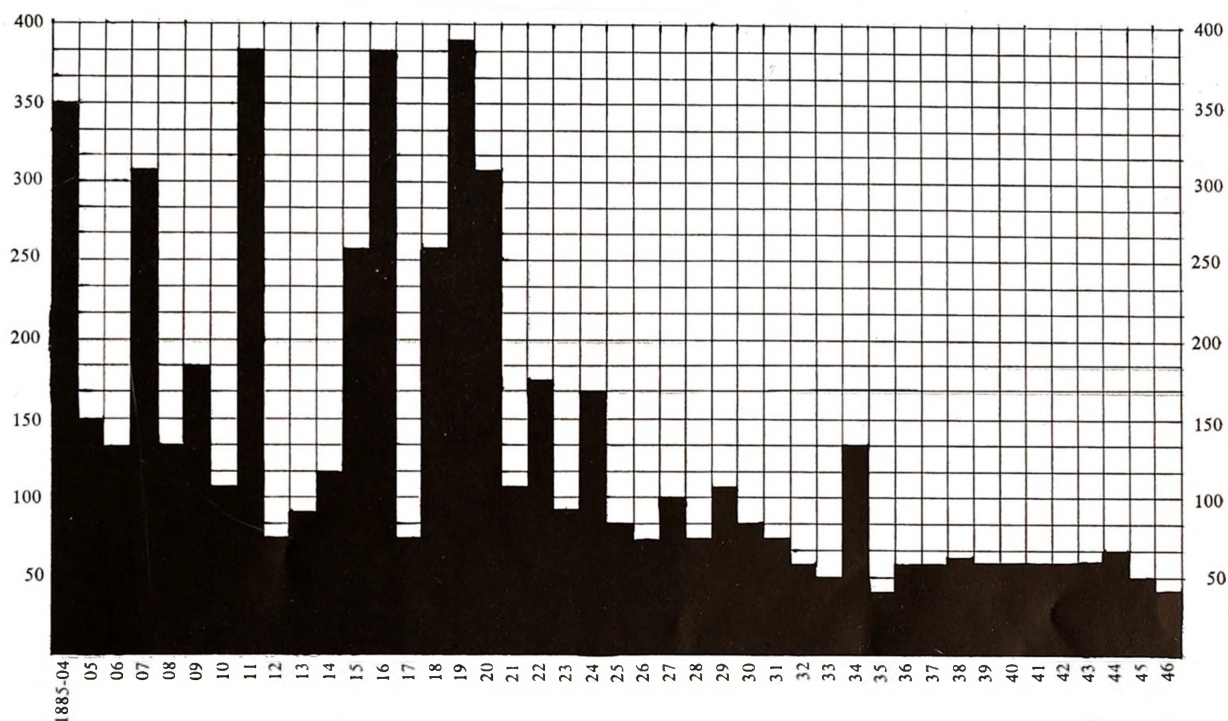

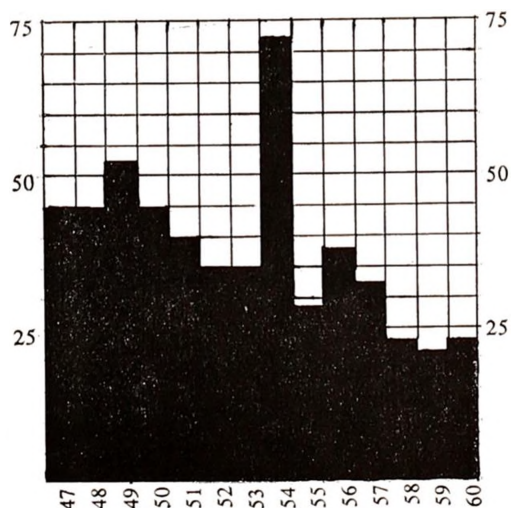


# The Hauck Fund...

The average gift per donor by classes to the Arthur A. Hauck Building Fund is presented here graphically. (Last month the percent participation by classes was shown.) The graph is broken into two parts at the median point. At the top of the page, the classes up to 1946 appear, and at the bottom of the page are shown the classes from 1947 to 1960. (One half of Maine's alumni belong now to a class between '47 and '60 inclusive.)

Class years are indicated at the bottom of each graph; and at each end of the graphs, the amount (in dollars) of the average gift of the donors in each class is placed on the proper line.

Attention should be called to the fact that donations received from the classes 1958, 1959 and 1960 were pledges received during the student drive.

### BLACK BEAR AWARD NOMINATIONS DUE



THE AWARDING of the twelfth annual Black Bear Award will be one of the highlights of the Faculty-Alumni Homecoming Luncheon preceding the Connecticut game on October 21.

A Black Bear mounted on a Maine granite base with a sterling silver inscription forms the awards. The bear is cast in bronze from a model exclusively sculptured for the Alumni Association by the noted Providence sculptor, Aristo B. Cianforani. The granite bases have been contributed by Robert McGuire '32 of the Deer Isle Granite Corporation.

The selection of recipients of the award is made by an Association committee from nominations made by alumni. The award is not restricted to alumni. Faculty and administrative members or friends of the University are eligible. Anyone who has received the Alumni Service Emblem is not eligible for the Black Bear Award.

Among the points considered in making the awards are: 1) devotion to the aims of the University, 2) exemplification of the ideals of the University in personal life, 3) length and quality of service to the University or Alumni Association, and 4) standing among alumni.

## Lewis O. Barrows '16 Receives Alumni Service Emblem

LEWIS O. BARROWS '16, was awarded the Alumni Service Emblem on Saturday evening, June 9, to highlight the 86th annual Alumni Reunion.

In presenting the coveted award to Mr. Barrows, George F. Dow, retiring President of the GAA, said:

"In 1930, the General Alumni Association established its highest award to recognize outstanding service to the University, rendered through the Alumni Association. Since that time, *thirty-one* Maine Alumni have received the coveted award.

"We have reached that moment in our Commencement-Reunion Banquet program where we are to present the 1961 Alumni Service Emblem to the person nominated and selected this year. It is a pleasure and it is an honor for me, as the immediate Past President, to make this presentation.

"Our 1961 Service Emblem recipient has, in his 45 years since graduation from the University, followed an active course of alumni and civic service. He has been President of his Class and a member of the Alumni Council, also a member and chairman of several alumni committees. He is a past president of the Boston Alumni Association and has served as chairman of the alumni committee in charge of post-war employment plans for Maine alumni in the armed forces. On the drives for funds to build the Library, the Union Building and the Hauck Auditorium he has given unselfishly of time and energy for his University.

"Following his graduation he served in the the Second Maine Regiment in the Mexican Border Campaign, returning to become a partner with his father in business in Newport, Maine. He has served there in the town office of Treasurer and has been State Committee member of his party, member of the Governor's Council, the Secretary of State of Maine and, 1936-41, the Governor of the State of Maine. In 1932 he was awarded the Honorary Doctor of Laws Degree by his Alma Mater.

"He is the originator of and donor of the Annual State Series football competition award, which bears his name.

He is a former Secretary of the Liberty Mutual Insurance Company and affiliated companies, now is residing in Newport, Maine, where he is also president of the Newport Trust Company. Recently he was appointed a trustee of the University of Maine.

"Our 1961 recipient of the Alumni Service Award is the President of the reunion Class of 1916, the Honorable *Lewis Orin Barrows*."

## 116th Commencement

# Charles E. Crossland '17 Receives Honorary Degree

**N**EARLY SIX THOUSAND persons were in attendance as the University awarded the bachelor's degree to 814 seniors and advanced degrees to 71 graduate students at the 116th commencement exercises at the Bangor Auditorium Sunday, June 11. The program was televised by Bangor and Presque Isle TV stations.

This year's class was the second largest ever to be graduated from the University being topped only by the class of 1950 which included many veterans of World War II.

Candidates for the degrees were presented by the deans of the colleges. President Lloyd H. Elliott officially conferred the degrees.

The honorary doctor's degrees were conferred on Dr. Eldon L. Johnson, Durham, N. H., the Commencement Speaker, Thomas B. McCabe, Swarthmore, Pa., President of the Scott Paper Company, Abraham M. Rudman, Bangor '17L, Justice of the Maine Superior Court; Percy L. Spencer, Waban, Mass., Senior Vice President of the Raytheon Company, the Rev. Frederick H. Thompson '28, Pastor of the Woodfords

Congregational Church in Portland, and Max L. Wilder '14, Augusta, Bridge Engineer for the Maine State Highway Commission.

At what appeared to be the conclusion of the honorary degree awards, President Elliott revealed one of the best kept secrets in years at the University, the decision of the Board of Trustees to confer upon Charles E. Crossland '17, retiring Vice President, the honorary degree of Doctor of Laws. As the degree was conferred, the nearly six thousand onlookers rose and gave Mr. Crossland a standing ovation.

The recipients of the honorary degrees were presented by Raymond H. Fogler '15, President of the University's Board of Trustees, and the citations were read by President Elliott.

### Commencement Address

Dr. Johnson spoke on "A Time to Build Up."

"We are living in a frightening age," he said, "because frightening things are morally possible. When it is physically possible to

obliterate a whole city, it is morally possible. When it is materially possible to wipe out a whole people, it is morally possible. What we can do, we may do—with ever widening bounds.

"The reverse is also increasingly true," he continued. "Whatever is morally decided can be materially realized. For the first time in human history, whatever an advanced nation wants to do, it has the means of doing. It has the capital and the knowledge. As someone has said, we as a people had better be careful what we want, because that may be exactly what we get."

Dr. Johnson said that it is the nature of men to have rising expectations, and that people are not satisfied with conditions as they are.

"It is true of us individually, of the nation, and of the people around the globe who see enough of what is materially possible to insist that we likewise raise our sights on what is morally possible," he declared.

"The Soviet Union expects to surpass us industrially," he continued. "We expect to make the planets our neighbors. Red China



expects to make the 'great leap forward' Colonial people expect to be free. Primitive people expect to be educated. Everybody expects to live better and better. What we all have in common is the pattern of rising expectations—everywhere."

He said that if the world challenges us materially, it should challenge us even more morally. He added that it should make us profoundly discontent with ourselves and ever more disturbed about our relations with other human beings.

"This constructive discontent is the self-regarding, or personal, dimension of how we cope with an age which demands more of us but dulls our sense of duty. The spark of discontent, this desire to excel—to excel ourselves—is the generator of achievement, the discoverer of new worlds, the maker of utopias, the destroyer of conformity, and the creator of ideals."

The speaker said the problem facing us is not a shortage of dollars but a shortage of conviction

"It is preposterous to say America, the world's wealthiest nation, cannot afford to share with its neighbors and educate its youth—to say we would sacrifice everything in time of war but little or nothing to prevent it. Are we to spend untold sums for competition in weapons but grudging sums for competition in ideas?" he asked.

Dr. Johnson concluded by saying, "We have greater and greater expectations in a world which can be incredibly good or madly evil."

### Baccalaureate

The Rev. Harvey H. Bates, director of the Office of Religious Affairs, delivered the baccalaureate address to seniors Sunday morning in the Memorial Gymnasium.

Speaking on the subject "On Meaning God," Mr. Bates attempted to spell out the true meaning of the word "God" in life today.

He declared that the search for this meaning is closely related to the leading problem in the whole western world, that of "the anxiety of doubt and meaninglessness."

"Too many of our parents, Sunday school teachers, rabbis, priests, and preachers use the word, which is the center of our thought today, as a crutch for weaklings, a stop gap for lazy heads, and a supersedative for cowards," he said.

"Those who have centered on the deep things of life, trying to speak to others of this one called, variously 'Allah,' 'Yahweh,' 'Oversoul,' 'Elohim,' 'Adonai,' knew all along that no name, no picture, no description is adequate for that toward which they tried to point.

"This 'one' of whom we are trying to speak this morning is beyond all our attempts to speak about—even the word 'him' must be recognized as a picture, not a word to be taken literally.

"It seems to me to be the central added insight of the major voices from the Bible that this 'one' is known in the event of his-

tory and in the people who act out these events. Nature is the stage of life, but the main thing is the drama taking place on that stage.

"The prophets of the Bible say it is not the great nations like Egypt and Babylonia and Persia, but small nations and people like Israel, insignificant as men measure, in which 'Yahweh,' the sovereign of history, exposes himself.

"We can see him clothed in the blacks of South Africa, in our own Negroes in this country, in the Arab refugees displaced by Israel, in those who suffer unjustly under Communism, Capitalism, trabalism, and all the 'isms' of the world.

"What is the meaning of life? Why do we go on living? What we are saying is that the answers to these deepest questions are to be found among those persons who have insight into their suffering, who accept, affirm, and thus overcome their sufferings,

seeing it as a part of the living self-exposure of him who makes and rules the universe; who acts and speaks life's meaning."

In concluding, Mr. Bates gave his answer to the question "How can we mean the word 'God,'" as follows:

"By acting out his suffering, joyful love, starting now with those closest to us, and remaining open to new 'nows' and to new 'closenesses.' For God clothes himself in people. You have seen him or will see him in his people. And you already are or can become a person in whom God himself is clothed for others to know intimately. Such is life's hardest and simplest task. But it's yours for the living," he stated.

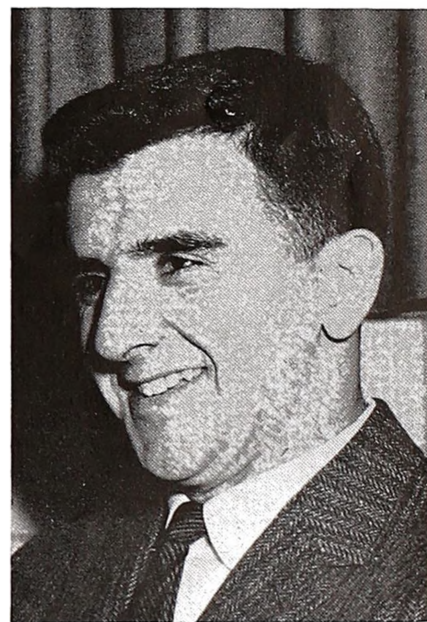

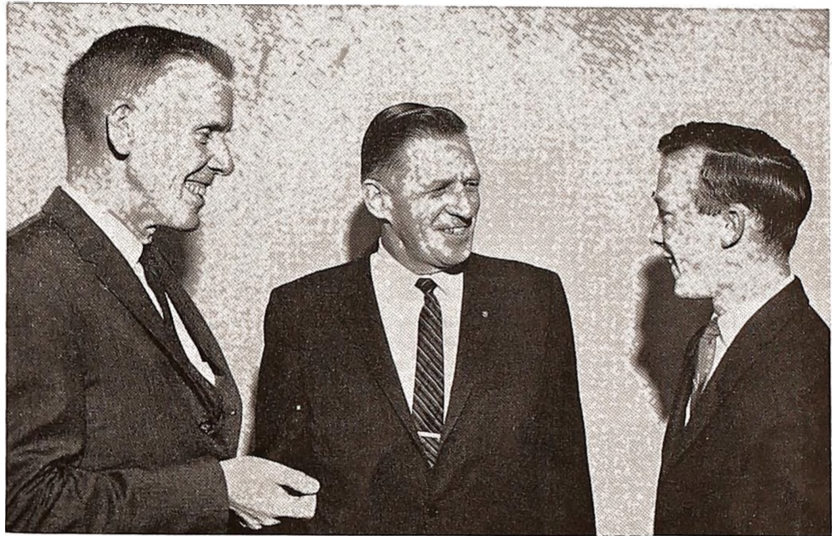

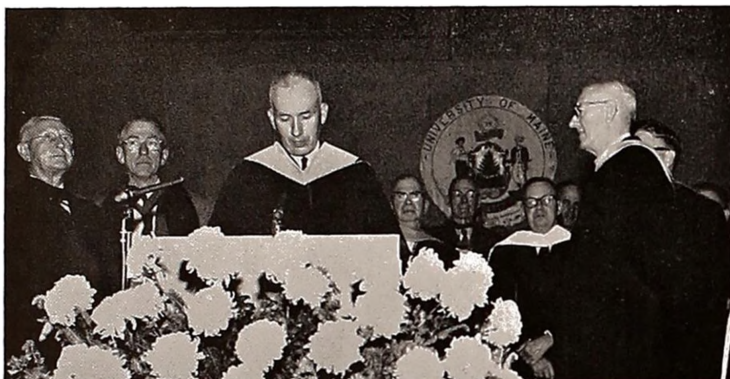

A WRITER who is given such a task as writing a tribute to a man like Charles E. Crossland might feel at first that the job would be easy. With a wealth of material available covering his forty-four years of service to the University, almost any collection of superlatives would be acceptable and justified. One could easily be tempted to fall into the banal, overworked journalistic lead-in: "In 1915 Charles E. Crossland was working for the University at the barns for fifteen cents per hour. . . ." But because the story of the man and his career deserves so much more than this slick and superficial approach, one is forced to the conclusion that the impact of the story itself requires plain and simple prose in the telling.

Mr Crossland's career with the University began the year of his graduation in 1917 when he went to work as Assistant State 4-H Club Leader.

During the years of World War One, Mr. Crossland, like most young men of his day, wanted to join the armed forces, but food production in those days was more critical than it is today. Herbert Hoover as National Food Coordinator asked Dean of the College of Agriculture Leon S. Merrill to become State Food Administrator, and the Dean said he would accept provided he could give up his responsibility as Dean of the College and as Extension Director. He could only do this, he said, if he were assured that none of his key personnel were taken into military service. The agreement was made, and as a consequence Raymond H. Fogler '15 and Charles Crossland ran the Extension Service for the duration of the war. Since at that time no subsidies were used to encourage production, Mr. Crossland had to bring into play his natural talent for diplomacy to encourage teamwork between producers and consumers. In this way he played an important part in the war effort.

In 1926 he assumed the duties of Extension Editor, serving as Executive Secretary and Editor for the Extension Service until he became the third Alumni Secretary of the General Alumni Association in 1928. For eighteen years he worked to build the Alumni Association into a thriving organization.

At the end of his eighteen year tenure as Alumni Secretary in 1946, Mr. Crossland became Director of Student-Public Relations, under Arthur A. Hauck. On this occasion, Arthur L. Deering '12, then Dean of the College of Agriculture, wrote a special tribute to Mr. Crossland in the



May, 1946 *Alumnus*. Below, in part, we quote from Dean Deering's article:

" . In any over-all survey of the past 18 years of the Alumni Association the two outstanding landmarks are without doubt the successful completion of the Alumni Memorial Fund Campaign and the accomplishment of the Library Fund Campaign. In each of these important and highly successful activities the Alumni Secretary has been the driving force behind the planning and direction of the work. Mr Crossland took up the responsibilities of his office in 1928 after the original Memorial Fund Campaign had been launched. The job was only partly done, the building only partly constructed. To plan and carry through a second campaign, to finish the task, was one of his earliest responsibilities in the office. By selecting outstanding individuals among students and alumni, an ability which has always marked his leadership in the alumni work, he built a fund raising organization which carried the job through to the final construction of the present Gym and the eventual financial success of the program.

"The Library Campaign, decided upon in 1939, presents an equally clear picture of successful leadership. The promised sum of \$200,000 was more than fulfilled by the alumni in a drive which for efficiency of operation and success in collection of accounts is an outstanding one in school fund raising.

"Scholarships and loans for the benefit of needy students have been sponsored and financed through local Associations and classes. In cooperation with the University he helped organize the University Placement Bureau in 1935. Attractive University Commemorative China has been made available and enthusiastically accepted by alumni and alumnae.

### The Leader

"Alumni Secretary Crossland would be the first one to say that none of these things have been accomplished alone, that in all of his work the cooperation, the time, and the energy of many persons have contributed to the end result. This, however, is exactly as it should be. In no other characteristic perhaps has he shown his real executive ability so much as his development of leadership and ability from the alumni ranks. With unerring success he has been able again and again to bring into the work the right man for the job. Alumni officers, Council members, committee chairmen, and committee members, a long and distinguished line of Maine men and women, have contributed notably to the Alumni Association and to the University through the encouragement and help of the Alumni Secretary.

### The Background

"Charles Edward Crossland was born in Watertown, Mass., but has devoted his entire adult life to the University of Maine and

the State of Maine. A graduate of the College of Agriculture in 1917, he first entered the Agricultural Extension Service in June of that year. He served for two years as Assistant State 4-H Club Leader and Acting State 4-H Club Leader. In 1919 he became Executive Secretary to the Extension Director. In 1926 he added to that position the duties of Extension Editor. In September, 1928, he became Alumni Secretary. In addition he has served since 1930 as Executive Secretary of Endowments and Donations for the University.

"During the period of World War II, from May, 1942, to January, 1946, in addition to his many other duties he served as Acting Business Manager during the military leave of absence of the regular Business Manager. Fittingly the alumni in 1943 selected him as the recipient of the Alumni Service Emblem Award for his services to the Association and to the University.

"Throughout his entire career with the Association he has stood for the highest ideals of service, of integrity and of moral character. He has inspired the respect and admiration of alumni everywhere and has hundreds of friends among those who have worked with him. His constant readiness to give credit to others for the progress and success of the Association has helped to enlist and hold the cooperation of all. His example has inspired a remarkably close relationship between alumni and the University.

"To those who have had the pleasure of working and living in close intimacy with Charles Crossland it is no surprise that he has been asked to occupy the important position of Assistant to President Hauck. It is a clear case of the job seeking the man. The qualities of fairness, understanding, and vision which have proved so important in his outstanding leadership of the Alumni Association will contribute no less to the success of his new position. In accepting his resignation from the Association, the Alumni Council and all alumni wish him well. The regret which his departure brings to all of us is tempered only by the pleasure of knowing that he will continue to devote his abilities to the welfare of the University." (End of quote)

From 1946 to 1954 Mr Crossland served as Director of Student and Public Relations, and from 1954 to 1958, he was Assistant to University President Arthur A. Hauck. Upon President Hauck's retirement in 1958, he was appointed by the Board of Trustees to the post of Acting President until the inauguration of President Lloyd H. Elliott.

Since 1958 he has been Vice President for Administration. As could be expected from such an active and energetic man, retirement does not mean inaction. He will continue to serve as Executive Secretary of the University of Maine Pulp and Paper Foundation, as Clerk of the Board of Trustees, and will be on hand as always as an advisor to those who need his help in solving difficult problems.

In 1943 the General Alumni Association awarded Mr. Crossland the Alumni Service Emblem, and at the Alumni Banquet on June 10, 1961, Myron C. Peabody '16 presented him with a gift check of \$5,000, the money having been raised by contributions from nearly a thousand alumni from all over the United States.

Mr. and Mrs. Crossland reside in Orono where they are active members of the Church of Universal Fellowship. Their four children are University of Maine graduates: Carlton E. '43, Donald E. '45, Thelma (Crossland '49) Robie (Mrs. Frederick), and Elton '50.

The *Alumnus* is happy to add its voice to the thousands of alumni and friends who are paying tribute to Charles E. Crossland at this time of his semi-retirement.

# A Year Of Progress

## ALUMNI TRUSTEE REPORT TO THE GENERAL ALUMNI ASSOCIATION FOR THE YEAR 1960-61

The college year 1960-61 has been one of gratifying progress. Gifts, bequests, and grants received during the year exceed the total of any previous year. Academic developments and physical plant expansion stand out as notable highlights in the history of the University. Some of the more significant facts and developments of the year are presented in this report.

### Registration

There was a small increase in registration over 1959-60. Unquestionably the increase could have been much larger, but the funds available made it necessary to limit the number of entering students. The completion of Payson Smith Hall on our Portland campus made it possible to admit women to that branch of the University for the first time. Many of these students will be enrolling at Orono in 1962. Following is a summary of the fall semester enrollment by colleges.

Almost twenty-nine percent of the undergraduates are women. This is believed to be the highest percentage in the history of the University, except during the war years.

### Academic

There have been several developments this year which add greatly to the academic stature of our University.

First, two new doctoral programs have been approved by the Trustees this year, one in Animal Nutrition and the other in Psychology. Ph.D. programs in Chemistry and History had been approved previously.

Second, the Summer Session has been extended to nine weeks, primarily so that undergraduates may speed up their progress toward graduation if they so desire, and also to make available courses for entering students who need preparation before undertaking college work.

Third, the proposed team-teacher training program, which the \$500,000 Ford Foundation grant will make possible, is underway.

Fourth, plans are being made for a broader program leading to a degree in

Music Education, which when in full effect will greatly strengthen the music curriculum.

Fifth, a committee is studying the possibility of establishing a two-year medical program which, if adopted, will seek particularly to alleviate the serious problem of the shortage of medical doctors in Maine.

The installation of an electronic computer has been authorized for next year. This will be invaluable in teaching, research, and service projects.

These are but some of the more important developments which will help to maintain the high quality of academic standing at the University.

### Personnel

The maintaining and strengthening of the University staff is the number one problem. This focuses in considerable measure around the fact that the salaries are considerably lower than those paid by other New England state universities and much below the national average for this group of institutions.

More major personnel changes have been and will be made this year than possibly any preceding year. Three department heads have been appointed this college year as follows:

Director of Health Service: Dr. Robert A. Graves

Five major appointments have already been made for 1961-62 with yet others to follow. They are as follows:

The Trustees wish to pay tribute to the nine staff members who are retiring this year. They have rendered loyal and constructive service to the University over a long period of years.

### Physical Plant

Five buildings are now underway. The Education building is to be completed for use in September. This will ease materially the crowded conditions in the College of Education and to a limited degree in the College of Arts and Sciences, which will use one floor of the building. Four housing

projects are all made possible through the housing bond issue approved by voters of Maine in the 1959 referendum. The entire cost of these structures will be amortized through the income from dormitory and housing operations.

A women's dormitory, to be known as Kennebec Hall, with a capacity of 170, is scheduled for use in September. This hall will be filled to capacity. Construction has just been started on another women's unit which will house about 270 students and include kitchen and dining facilities to feed some 700 persons. This is necessary to provide for the increasing number of women students, including those who will be coming to the Orono campus from Portland in 1962.

A men's dormitory, Cumberland Hall, with a capacity of 260, is rapidly nearing completion and will be ready for use next fall. This will make it possible to discontinue the use of the so-called North Dormitories, all but two of which will be removed by September. These two units will be retained only for use if needed for the fall of 1962, looking ahead to another men's dormitory for 1963.

For several years the 196 South Apartments used for married students and faculty have been a source of great concern because of the fire hazard involved in these wooden structures. It will be with much relief and satisfaction that the 120 married housing units north of the campus will be ready for use soon after Commencement. The Trustees have authorized the removal of South Apartments immediately after they have been vacated.

### Gifts and Grants

Over \$1,500,000 has been received by the University in gifts, bequests, and grants during the current fiscal year. This does not include many valuable paintings, land, an organ, and other important gifts, the monetary value of which have not been established. This impressive amount far exceeds the total for any previous year. With the exception of one major gift, practically the entire amount is earmarked for specific uses as student aid, research, institutes, and the like. The largest amount was the Ford Foundation grant of \$500,000 for the team-teaching program. Next was the munificent, unrestricted bequest of \$388,000 from Mrs. Anne Stodder, late of Bangor, which the University expects to receive before the close of the fiscal year. The income from this fund can be used for the general purposes of the University.

Over \$100,000 was given for current scholarship awards, while some \$75,000 was added to loan funds and endowment for student aid. These figures do not include the \$87,930 received under the National Defense Education Act for loan purposes. About \$140,000 was given for research projects. Unfortunately it will be impossible to give further details concerning these gifts which mean so much to the continuing



progress of the University. The Trustees are deeply grateful for the generosity of the scores of donors who, through their gifts, have materially strengthened the entire program of the University. Sincere appreciation is extended to each and every person whose contributions have made possible the completion of the Memorial Union. A study is now underway to determine the next steps to be taken in relation to the Hauck Auditorium.

### Legislative Matters

As this report is written, it is impossible to know what the outcome of our legislative program will be. President Elliott and his associates and an alumni education committee have conscientiously sought to inform the legislators of the needs of the University. Through the generosity of the Ford Foundation (\$13,400) and the leadership of President Elliott, a Pre-Legislative Conference was held on the campus early in December. The conference was a history-making occasion, a first for the State of Maine and a first for the University, serving as host for the session. Legislators and leading citizens gave three days of their valuable time to participate in an extra-legislative activity, planned to acquaint all distinguished citizens with problems and financial issues to be faced in the 1961 Legislative Session.

The operating budget has been foremost in our thinking, for on this appropriation rests so much of the future of our University. Possibly before this report is submitted the Legislature will have acted upon our University bills. There appears to be no point in speculating upon what the results may be.

### Development Council

Much more might be written about interesting, almost exciting, present or potential features which are in process. One of these is the organization of a Development Council which is concerned with the future development of the University in its broadest aspects. The University is fortunate that a group of prominent alumni and many leading citizens are taking such an active interest in this vital subject which can mean so much to the sound growth of our Alma Mater.

### Conclusion

Fred J. Nutter of Cornina retired from the Board this year after seven years of unusually effective service. He was succeeded by the Honorable Lewis O. Barrows '16, who has long had a great interest in the University. Both of your alumni representatives on the Board were reappointed for another term.

The Trustees wish to express their sincere appreciation to the faculty, who have accepted rising work loads, developed new programs, and given strong leadership while maintaining vigorous, academically sound educational curricula in the colleges which

comprise the University. To the University family as a whole we say "Thank you" for tasks well done this past year.

## ATHLETIC BOARD REPORT 1960-61

To the General Alumni Association:

The past college year has been a busy one in University athletics with our frosh and varsity teams competing in approximately 150 contests. In nine sports the results showed a plus score of victories in every sport but one.

Our football team was second in the State and third in the Yankee Conference, repeating the record of the previous year.

The indoor track team lost only to Dartmouth.

The rifle team won the Yankee Conference title.

The baseball team finished second in the State and fifth in the Yankee Conference.

Our winter sports team was very successful in winning the State championship, was ranked fourth in the Eastern United States and Canada, sixth nationally and produced the national crosscountry champion.

The basketball team won the State title, the Downeast Classic, second in the Y.C. and received wide acclaim.

Our track team was one of the finest in

University history, winning both the State and Yankee Conference titles by wide margins, scoring eight points in the National meet, and having several outstanding record breakers.

Athletic facilities are inadequate in several areas. Increasing enrollment has been accompanied by a marked decrease in the number of tennis courts available for play. The gymnasium is inadequate in seating capacity, ventilation, locker room accommodations, and office space.

In evaluating the performances of our teams in their intercollegiate competition, several factors should be considered. Maine competes in both the State and Yankee Conferences, with every contest a key battle. Many schools play some games which are not crucial in figuring titles. University officials insist that our athletics be conducted on a completely amateur basis. Financial aid is given to students, athletes included, solely on the basis of real need and scholastic ability. Most of our athletes are State of Maine boys.

Our athletes rate very well academically. For the fall semester, all of the University athletic teams attained higher average ranks than the average for all upperclass men students. Over twenty athletic team members are Dean's List students.

Albert Smaha '45, and Thomas Hersey '34, have rendered valuable and conscientious service on the Athletic Board. Your three alumni representatives wish to express their appreciation to the University administration, the faculty, the fine coaching staff, the students, and to the alumni for their cooperation and support of our athletic activities which are an integral part of the University program of Physical Education and physical fitness.

# Honorary Degree Citations

## HONORARY DEGREE CITATIONS

The following citations were read by President Elliott when the honorary degree recipients were presented by Mr. Fogler:

### CHARLES EDWARD CROSSLAND

Born in Massachusetts, a graduate of the University of Maine, and holder of a most distinguished record of service to your alma mater, your responsibilities as a staff member began upon graduation in 1917 and will continue into your retirement. You have held many posts during this outstanding career. Among them have been Assistant State Club Leader, Extension Editor, Alumni Secretary, Business Manager, Assistant to the President, Director of Student and Public Relations, Secretary of the University of Maine Foundation, Clerk of the Board of Trustees, Vice President, and Acting President. Even such a range of titles, however, does not include your many special assignments. You have been described unofficially as "chief of protocol, able to settle all sorts of perplexing problems with only the greater good of the University in mind." This is true statesmanship and you have met the qualifications in each of your forty-four years of service.

In recognition of your administrative skill, your devotion to the best interests of the University, your keen insight of perplexing problems and your help in building a greater University, the Trustees take pleasure in conferring upon you the honorary degree of Doctor of Laws.

### ELDON L. JOHNSON

A Hoosier by birth, a graduate of Indiana State Teachers College, with Master's and Doctor's degrees from the University of Wisconsin, a student at the London School of Economics, recipient of honorary degrees from three institutions, including the University of San Marcos in Lima, Peru, administrator and director of the graduate School of the United States Department of Agriculture, national academic director of the premeteorology college training program for the Army Air Force, during World War II, progressively professor and head of the Department of Political Science, Dean of the College of Liberal Arts, and Dean of the Graduate School of the University of Oregon, President of the University of New Hampshire since 1955, member and officer of many professional organizations, including the governing boards of the land grant and state university associations and President of the New England Board of Higher Education, recipient of the Alexander Meiklejohn Award for Academic Freedom in 1958, contributor to professional journals, father of a daughter who will receive her degree from this University today.

In recognition of your educational leadership, both in the United States and abroad, your ideals of sound scholarship and academic freedom, the Trustees of this University take pleasure in conferring upon you the honorary degree of Doctor of Laws.

### THOMAS BAYARD McCABE

A native of Maryland, a graduate and trustee of Swarthmore College, recipient of many honorary degrees, following graduation from college in 1915, he became a salesman with Scott Paper Company, with which company he is still associated; at the age of thirty-three, he was named president of the company of which he has been a director since 1921, his exceptional ability and business acumen, his firm belief in the development and training of young men, his positive conviction that quality shall be foremost, combined with his capacity to create and direct vast industrial organizations have made him one of our country's foremost industrial leaders, director of corporations, and officer in World War I, for nine years chairman of the Board of the Federal Reserve Bank of Philadelphia, and three years chairman of the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System;

his many and diverse public services, demanding rare ability and devotion, won him a presidential award of merit, a friend of education.

In recognition of your interest in the State of Maine, your long and valuable services which have made you a public figure of first magnitude, your economic statesmanship, vision, industry, and immeasurable achievements which have won for you the respect, admiration, and commendation of your associates, the Trustees of this University are happy to confer upon you the honorary degree of Doctor of Laws.

### ABRAHAM MOSES RUDMAN

Born and educated in and a life-long resident of Bangor, a graduate of the University of Maine, of which his attorney son also is a graduate; a Naval veteran of World War I, active in many local organizations, including membership on the Bangor School Committee, a past president of the Bangor Hebrew Community Center and of B'nai B'rith; director of the Merchants National Bank; past president and long active in the Penobscot Bar Association; quiet, unassuming, and unusually diligent, he enjoyed marked success in the practice of the law, his ability, high ethical and professional standards, and knowledge of the law led to his appointment as a justice of the Maine Superior Court in 1954, which appointment was received with enthusiastic and unanimous acclaim, a distinguished attorney and modest civic leader.

In recognition of your achievements, your keen perception of the law, your dignity and judicial temperament, which have won for you the esteem of your peers and a position of great honor and trust, the Trustees of this University take singular satisfaction in conferring upon you the honorary degree of Doctor of Laws.

### PERCY LeBARON SPENCER

Born in Howland, Maine, starting to work in a spool mill at the age of twelve, he soon developed an interest in wireless communications which led him to enlist in the Navy, thereby gaining the opportunity to attend a wireless telegraphy school; in 1925 he joined what later became the Raytheon Company, with which company he is still associated, having risen through the ranks to become senior vice president, a director, and manager of microwave and power tube operations; his penetrating research resulted in obtaining over one hundred patents in the field of vacuum tubes and electronics, his ability combined with his leadership and capacity to inspire men made possible amazing attainments in World War II, as a result of which he was given an award by the United States Army and three awards by the United States Navy, including the Distinguished Public Service Medal.

Through your rare talent to develop simple solutions for complex problems, your insatiable curiosity and creativeness, your high standards, combined with warm and generous humanitarianism, you have made a lasting impression upon the pages of our time; in recognition of a life of service to mankind, the Trustees of this University take unusual pleasure in conferring upon you, a son of this State, the honorary degree of Doctor of Science.

### FREDERICK HAROLD THOMPSON

Born in Nova Scotia but a resident of Maine for most of his life, son of a minister, a graduate of this University in 1928 with degrees also from Hartford Seminary Foundation, teacher in Turkey for three years, pastor for nearly thirty years, fifteen of which he has been at the Woodfords Congregational Church, the largest Protestant church in Maine and one of the largest in New England, past chairman of the American Board of Foreign Missions, president of the Congregational Christian

Service Committee, present or former Trustee of Bangor Theological Seminary and Hartford Seminary Foundation, twice he has been the baccalaureate speaker at this University as well as having given many other addresses at this campus, widely in demand as a speaker, editor, father of a daughter who graduates today and who, like her father, received an alumni watch for outstanding undergraduate leadership.

A warm-hearted, spiritual statesman, skillful in the art of inspiring men and healing wounded souls, and energetic leader, your University looks with pride upon your dedicated life, in recognition of which the Trustees have voted to confer upon you the honorary degree of Doctor of Humane Letters.

### MAX LINCOLN WILDER

Son of Maine, a graduate with distinction from this University with a Bachelor of Science degree in Civil Engineering, Class of 1914, member of honor societies, officer with two years' service in World War I with the well-known First Maine Heavy Field Artillery, forty-five years with the Maine State Highway Commission, starting in 1914 and rising through the ranks to become Bridge Engineer of that important body in 1928, which position he still holds; under his watchful eye a vast number of Maine's beautiful bridges have been designed and built; extremely quiet and modest, he has had a keen interest in training young engineers, many of whom have won professional distinction as a result of his friendly interest, understanding, and encouragement; a loyal alumnus, a Fellow of the American Society of Civil Engineers, and a member of other professional organizations.

In recognition and appreciation of your life-long service to the State of Maine, your notably sound judgment as an engineer, your outstanding ability as an administrator, your quiet guidance and inspiration of young engineers, the Trustees of your Alma Mater take pleasure in conferring upon you the honorary degree of Doctor of Engineering.

# Track Team Wins State And YC Titles

**T**HE BLACK BEAR track team enjoyed one of the most successful seasons in years, winning four meets, including the State and the Yankee Conference meets. In the New Englands, Maine tied for fifth place with the University of Connecticut, and was only eleven points out of first place. With six team members in the IC4A meet in N. Y. City, the pale blue placed 14th.

The outlook for next year is even brighter, since all but three of the top performers will be returning to school as juniors and seniors. An excellent miler and a top notch high-jumper will be moving up from the freshman ranks to strengthen the team even more; and with record breaking athletes like *Pete MacPhee* (dashes), *Dick Nason* (weights), and *Baron Hicken* (hurdles) on tap for two more years, Maine promises to be a track threat in the East for the next couple of seasons.

### **Alumna Authors Children's Book**

*The Sapphire Pendant*, by **Audrey White Beyer '39**. Alfred A. Knopf, New York, 178 pp., \$2.95. Miss White chose rural England at the time of the Napoleonic Wars as the setting on which to build her expert narrative for young teenaged girls. Readers will gather much of historic and descriptive accuracy as Miss White characterizes sixteen year old Elizabeth in a series of daring adventures in the early 1880's. Patriotism, revolt from authority, and the realization of adult love are themes which are woven into this plot, action moves quickly and could easily hold the female teenage audience. The author has used both her major in English and her minor in history in penning this story. Her experience in teaching English to teenagers has increased her adeptness in writing for them. A previous book, *Capture at Sea*, was a boy's story which won the *Jack and Jill Award* in 1959. She has also had poems printed in well-known periodicals. The Beyer, husband Walter who is head of the Math department at Milton Academy, and two sons, live in Milton, Mass. Miss White graduated from Westbrook Junior College in 1937, before studying at the University. WJC presented her the 1961 Tower Award for Alumnae Achievement. M M M

# Completion of . . . *Library Fund Objectives*

IN JUNE OF 1960 a committee was authorized by the Executive Council of the General Alumni Association to study the disposition of a small residue of money left in the Library Fund, and the completion of the original objectives of the Fund.

The committee decided that names of the donors to the Library Fund be printed in the June issue of the *Alumnus* prior to the printing of the list in a permanent book form, in order to insure that the list of donors is correct in all aspects. (In a brochure of the Library Fund, printing of names of donors in book form was stated as one of the objectives of the Fund drive. Verbatim from the brochure, the pledge read: "A gift of any amount that you can afford will line up your name with those who have already made their pledge to Maine. Every gift will insure the donor's name (not the amount) being inscribed in the permanent record book of benefactors to be preserved in the new building.")

The committee also recommended that the small amount of money remaining in the Fund be given by the Alumni Association to the University to be used for a portion of the construction costs of a University Collection Room in the Library. This room will contain all student, alumni, and University publications, including *The Prism*, *The Campus*, *The Maine Alumnus*, *The Cadet*, *The Maine Spring*, and others. # Notes from the Classes

## NECROLOGY

1888

**NATHANIEL ESTES WILSON** Nathaniel E. Wilson, 93, died in Reno, Nevada, on April 4, 1961. At the time of his death he was the oldest living alumnus of the University. A native of Orono, he attended Pennsylvania State College for two years, then received his B.S. degree and a master's degree (1889) from the University of Maine. After post-graduate study at Cornell University, Mr. Wilson went to Reno to become an instructor in chemistry at the University of Nevada, and remained to become one of the city's leading citizens. From 1899 to 1905 he was head of the Department of Chemistry at the University of Nevada and served one year as Dean. He resigned to engage in the drug business, and in 1916 formed his own company, the N. E. Wilson Co., Inc., which he operated for 41 years. He organized the Nevada Retail Merchants Association and served as president for 15 consecutive years; he organized the Reno Community Chest, was a director of the Red Cross chapter there, and a 60-year member of the Knights of Pythias. For 19 years he served on the Nevada State Board of Pharmacy and for 14 years was a member of the State Board of Education. He had also been mayor of Reno. In 1950 he received the Honorary Doctor of Laws Degree from the University of Nevada. Mr. Wilson was an honorary member of Phi Kappa Phi and a member of Phi Gamma Delta Fraternity.

**GEORGE GIFFORD FREEMAN** George G. Freeman, 90, died in Cherryfield in 1958. He was an attorney at law and had served as clerk of courts for Washington County for eight years and Judge of Western Washington Municipal Court at Machias for four years. He also carried on a fire insurance agency. Mr. Freeman was a Mason and a member of Knights of Pythias. A daughter is listed as surviving. Mr. Freeman was a member of Phi Gamma Delta.

**HERBERT MURRAY** Herbert Murray, 88, died in Haworth, N. J., on April 16, 1961. A native of Brooklyn, N. Y., he was active in sports and a Class Day speaker at the University. 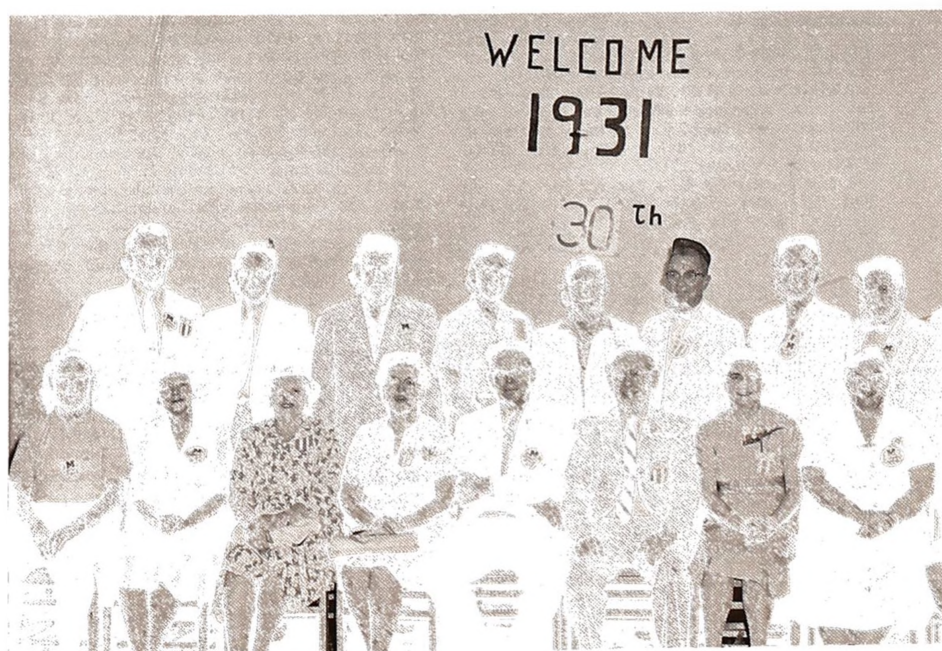

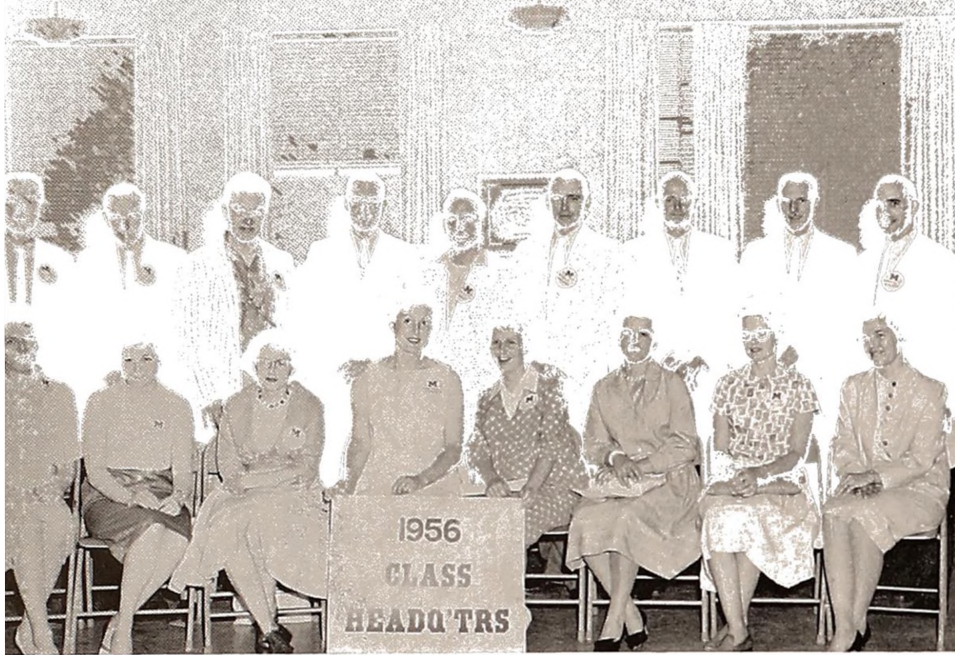

Mueller was a son of a clock maker, and for twenty-five years worked in engineering development for Mack Truck Co. On a visit to Switzerland, where he had been born, he became interested in hand-made chime clocks and decided to make them. As a result of this interest, he made 128 such clocks and sold them to private individuals who could afford the necessary high cost. His clocks involved new

principles in the chime mechanism which he patented.

The clock shown in the picture indicates the position of the earth and the moon on the respective date in any given month. It strikes on the hour and half-hour, and can be set to play a series of chimes on the hour, half-hour and quarter-hour.

Alumni who are visiting campus should make it a point to visit the Peabody lounge in the Memorial Union to see this masterpiece of the clock-makers art.

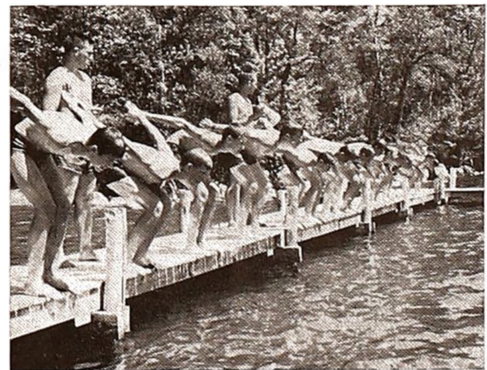

## Apparel

Until after the Revolution, social distinctions in Portland followed the pattern established in England. "The Quality" were ministers, judges, governors, and those persons of wealth who had large landholdings. Their houses were larger and finer, and they had slaves or indentured servants to perform household tasks and work in the fields. Their clothes were mostly imported from England, as were household furnishings. Willis says that the cocked hat, the bush wig and the red cloak were envied marks of distinction in early Portland.

Men's coats were made with long cuffs reaching to the elbows and low collars. They were long and full-skirted, fastened with brass or silver buttons. Elaborately embroidered vests had long pocket flaps, also embroidered. Linen shirts had either linen or fine lace ruffles at throat and wrists. Buckskin breeches or scarlet breeches had brass or silver knee buckles. Low, square-toed shoes and silken or ribbed hose completed the costume. Face masks were carried in winter for protection against wind and cold, by women and the younger dandies.

The trappings of social rank were always donned by "The Quality" on social occasions with elaborately curled and powdered wigs to top off the display. At business, more serviceable clothes and plain queue wigs were worn.

The wigs were as expensive as the clothes and had to be replaced as often. Portland's own Parson Smith wrote, "August, 1765, had a new wig and clothes." Again in 1769, "another rich wig, and hat." Deane's famous diary tells us that in 1766 a wig cost sixteen pounds, ten shillings and sixpence.

Men's and even children's heads were shaved to accommodate the wigs. For comfort's sake, at night, and when at home, the wigs were moved and turbans of silk or wool substituted, to protect shaven heads from drafts — which explains why contemporary portraits always show men with either a wig, turban or hat covering the head.

An interesting note is that in 1771 three silversmiths, Paul Little, John Butler and Joseph Ingraham, were busy in Portland making knee and shoe buckles and brass buttons.
