PRESENT: Chairman Stanley J. Evans, Francis Brown, Patricia DiMatteo, Alan Elkins, Joseph Hakanson, Thomas Monaghan, Richard Morin, Ellen Platz, Harrison Richardson, John Robinson, Elizabeth Russell, Thaxter Trafton, Artemus Weatherbee. Absent: Harold Reynolds, Severin Beliveau. Staff: Chancellor McCarthy, Robert Binswanger, William Sullivan, Mary Ann Haas, Samuel D'Amico, Kenneth Allen, Arthur Buswell, Einar Olsen, Hilton Power, Richard Spath, Robert Woodbury, press and public.

Chairman Evans convened the meeting. On motion made and seconded, the minutes of the meeting of May 27, 1980 were approved as circulated.

Chairman's Remarks. Dr. Evans said he was honored to come to the Chair and that he will support a continuation of open and thorough examination of the issues facing the Board. He announced that the most recent appointee to the Board is Attorney Severin M. Beliveau, Augusta, who will replace Mr. Bernard Carpenter whose term has expired. Dr. Evans took special note of Mr. Carpenter's term of service and, on behalf of the Board, expressed appreciation for his many contributions and dedicated trusteeship.

Chancellor's Report. Chancellor McCarthy indicated he would defer his remarks since he would be reporting later in the meeting on some major personnel recommendations.

NEW BUSINESS.

1. Named Professorship, UMO. Acting President Kenneth Allen presented the recommendation for Board approval to establish a named professorship in the School of Forest Resources, made possible by a major gift to the University of Maine Foundation from the late Mrs. Mary Louise Giddings. Dr. Allen said that the Professorship would be an important addition to the School of Forest Resources, and that the Campus would develop a nomination to fill it, when approval is obtained. On motion of Mr. Weatherbee, which was seconded, it was

VOTED: to authorize the establishment of a Professorship in the School of Forest Resources at the University of Maine at Orono, to be known as the Edwin L. Giddings Professor of Forest Management.

2. Professor of Electrical Engineering, UMO. Acting President Allen presented the recommendation and briefed the Trustees on the nominee. On motion of Mr. Hakanson, which was seconded, it was

VOTED: to authorize the appointment of Dr. William Peake as Chairman of the Department of Electrical Engineering and Professor of Electrical Engineering for a three year term effective September 1, 1980, at an academic year salary of \$31,000 plus an administrative stipend of \$4,000.

3. Vice President of Student Affairs, UMPI. In the absence of President Salwak, Dr. Binswanger briefed the Trustees on the search process and the candidate's credentials. On motion of Mr. Hakanson, which was seconded, it was

VOTED: to authorize the appointment of Dr. Larry L. Mangus as Vice President for Student Affairs at the University of Maine at Presque Isle at an annual salary of \$26,000, effective August 1, 1980.

4. Acting President, UMA. Chancellor McCarthy presented the recommendation for appointment of an Acting President at the University of Maine at Augusta, which was necessitated by the departure of former President Donald W. Beattie to accept the presidency of another institution. The Chancellor said that the change in the Augusta Presidency comes at a time when institutions, generally, are focusing on current trends to part-time learning and he has recommended that the Campus undertake a self-study which would allow review of the alternate possibilities for that institution for the future. He briefed the Trustees on the process which was used for selection of a candidate for the Acting Presidency, who could provide the leadership for the study, and he reported that the various campus constituencies are unanimously supportive of the nominee: Dr. Hilton Power. During discussion, the Chancellor responded to questions about the format and scope of the study. Trustees Monaghan, Weatherbee and Richardson recommended that, in the future, the Trustees be provided an opportunity to participate in a debriefing session with any President who resigns. After further discussion and on motion of Mr. Hakanson, which was seconded, it was

VOTED: to authorize the appointment of Hilton Power to the position of acting President for the University of Maine at Augusta, effective July 23, 1980, through August 30, 1981, or earlier, depending upon the formal search process, at a salary of \$30,500 which includes a \$5,000 stipend added to his current base salary of \$25,500.

5. President, UMO. On motion of Mr. Hakanson which was seconded, the Board voted to adjourn to executive session for discussion of the appointment of a President for the University of Maine at Orono. Following the executive session, Chairman Evans reconvened the meeting. Dr. Evans outlined the scope of the presidential search which had been underway for the past year, and which had recently culminated in the submission of four names to the Chancellor, who was to select a nominee for Board consideration. Before presenting his nomination, Chancellor McCarthy thanked the Search Committee and described the characteristics considered during the search process:

- 1) to support an understanding of the appropriate academic qualities of a major university;
- 2) the ability to communicate, to lead, listen and interact with all the constituencies of the University community;
- 3) experience to include administrative background, scholarly activity, fundraising activity, and the ability to work within the framework of University responsibilities while retaining a balanced capability for strong and forceful advocacy of the Orono Campus.

Chancellor McCarthy announced that the nominee, who had his wholehearted support, was Dr. Paul H. Silverman, and he spoke briefly to the nominee's credentials taking note of his background, experience and distinguished record for scholarly research. During discussion, the members of the Search Committee and its Chairman, Dr. James F. Horan, were commended on the integrity of the search process, and a number of Trustees expressed their support for the nominee. On motion of Mr. Hakanson, which was seconded, and with Mr. Weatherbee dissenting, it was

VOTED: to authorize the appointment of Paul H. Silverman as President of the University of Maine at Orono effective August 25, 1980, at an annual salary of \$51,000 and the standard benefit package previously established for presidents.

On motion of Mr. Weatherbee, which was seconded, it was unanimously

VOTED: to endorse a commendation of the highest order to Kenneth W. Allen for his excellent service as Acting President at the University of Maine at Orono and also at the University of Maine at Augusta and the University of Southern Maine.

On motion of Francis Brown, which was seconded, it was unanimously

VOTED: the UMO Presidential Search Committee be commended for their integrity and diligence in conducting a very long and difficult search process.

6. Report of the Trustee ad hoc Committee on Student Life. Chairman Evans noted that the report of the Committee was completed and distributed to the Board at the May meeting with action on the report deferred until this meeting, to allow time for study of the recommendations. Dr. Alan Elkins, who chaired the Committee, briefly outlined the scope of the study and expressed his appreciation to Trustee Robinson who served the Committee as Chairman pro tem, and to staff members who assisted with the project. During discussion the Trustees commended the Committee for its work, and Mr. Brown said he expected that the report on Student Life would take its place beside the earlier Greenbook study on academic planning. On motion of Mr. Weatherbee, which was seconded, it was

VOTED: to accept the Report of the ad hoc Committee on Student Life (Improving Student Life in the University of Maine, 1980) and to have the recommendations contained therein implemented; further, that the Committee be commended for excellent work and discharged.

7. Student Activity Fees. Mr. Hakanson moved to confirm the Campus student activity fees, as submitted, and the motion was seconded. During discussion, Mr. Robinson said that some students object to the size of the fees and the uses to which the fees are put, and he moved an amendment to provide that activity fees be paid by students on a voluntary basis. The amendment was seconded. To clarify the intent of his amendment, Mr. Robinson said that if the activities are considered educational and fees are mandatory, they should be assessed as part of tuition and in this way, justification for funding would become part of the budget and educational policy development

processes. The Presidents were invited to comment on the proposed amendment. President Buswell indicated that without a dependable body of funds the student government function would be seriously eroded at a small campus such as UMM. President Olsen expressed concern that funding for student activities would suffer in competition with the other demands on the E & G budget and he pointed out that Board policy requires any activity fee increases to be approved by the students in Campus referendum and that the students are bound by management restrictions in disbursing the funds. After further discussion, Mr. Brown suggested that more information, including input from students, would be desirable. Mr. Robinson indicated he would withdraw the amendment given an understanding that the staff would undertake a study of activity fee issues and alternatives for a report to the Board by December. The seconder having concurred, the amendment was withdrawn, and in action on the main motion it was

VOTED: to confirm Campus Student Activity Fees for 1980/81 as follows:

8. Gifts, Grants and Awards. On motion of Mr. Hakanson, which was seconded, it was

VOTED: to accept with gratitude all gifts, grants and awards listed under date of July 22, 1980. A complete listing is appended to the file of these minutes.

9. Title III Grants, UMM/UMF. Chancellor McCarthy reported that major planning grants have been awarded to UMM and UMF and he invited the respective Presidents to elaborate. President Buswell reported that the Office of Education established a program four years ago to assist small, developing institutions to do some of the things that couldn't be achieved within regular funding sources. He said that the planning grant awarded to UMM will provide a base for Campus self evaluation, for exploring how UMM fits into the system, and how it should be operating in the '80s. President Olsen reported that a planning process has been going on at UMF for two years and the Campus has been awarded an implementation grant under Title III which will help the Campus: 1) improve teaching effectiveness; 2) strengthen the academic program; 3) plan for new students and new services; 4) improve faculty/student advising and 5) establish a planning support system. During discussion Mr. Weatherbee inquired how UMA could undertake the kind of planning discussed earlier in the meeting, without additional funds and the Chancellor replied that UMA already has a planning grant. The Chancellor added that the purpose of the separate report on the planning grants for Farmington and Machias was to inform the Board about the significance of the planning grants and to report that the planning will be integrated so the

can act on the results in a timely way. On motion of Mr. Hakanson, which was seconded, and with Mr. Weatherbee abstaining, it was

VOTED: to accept gifts and grants for campus planning purposes at UMM and UMF in order that the organization of the planning and the implementation of the plans be integrated as a University of Maine activity.

10. Naming of Greenhouse, UMO. Acting President Kenneth Allen briefed the Trustees on the recommendation. On motion of Mrs. Platz, which was seconded, it was

VOTED: to authorize the naming of the three greenhouses and connected headhouse on the Orono campus, "The Roger Clapp Greenhouses."

11. Major Maintenance Projects. Mr. Richard Eustis briefed the Trustees on the recommendation. On motion of Mrs. Platz, which was seconded, it was

VOTED: to authorize the following major maintenance projects, to be funded from the special maintenance allocation:

UMA - Roofing replacement on Jewett Hall  
estimated cost: \$30,000

UMF - Roofing repairs and replacement on Ricker/Preble/Thomas Hall - estimated cost: \$35,000

UMFK - Roofing replacement on Cyr Hall  
estimated cost: \$35,000

UMM - Roofing replacement on Powers Hall Auditorium  
estimated cost: \$26,000

UMO - Roofing replacement on Coburn Hall  
estimated cost: \$55,000

Roofing restoration and replacement on Field House  
estimated cost: \$81,000

Roofing replacement on Hitchner Hall  
estimated cost: \$22,500

USM - Roofing replacement and solarium removal  
68 High Street - estimated cost: \$75,000

UMPI - Roofing replacement on Weiden Gym  
estimated cost: \$33,000

12. Capital Construction Status Report. Mr. Eustis called attention to the summary report which was included with materials circulated for the meeting. No action was required.

13. Early Voluntary Retirement. Mr. Samuel D'Amico reported that this proposal would extend to employees enrolled in the Maine State Retirement System (MSRS), eligibility to participate in the early retirement program currently restricted to employees enrolled in TIAA-CREF. During discussion, Mr. Robinson objected to adoption of the recommendation on the grounds that the MSRS has an early retirement plan which substantially favors retirees and, further, that the procedure should be reserved for administrative personnel and handled on a case-by-case basis by the Board of Trustees. Mr. Brown inquired whether the proposal was a response to an earlier request to the Board to explore retirement package equity for employees who are covered by MSRS. He was informed by Mr. Sullivan that the proposal is a partial response to that request. Mr. Sullivan noted that a separate concern of these employees is lack of social security coverage, and this proposal does not address that issue. After extensive discussion, it was

MOVED: that the current Board of Trustees policy with regard to the Incentive Plan for Early Voluntary Retirement be amended to extend eligibility to faculty, professional and administrative staff who are enrolled in the Maine State Retirement System plan.

The motion was seconded and failed to carry by a vote of 6 to 4.

14. Collective Bargaining. Mr. D'Amico reported that the University of Maine Professional Staff Association (UMPSA) failed to complete ratification of the tentative agreement which was on the agenda for this meeting, and the item will be deferred until September.

On motion made and seconded, the Trustees voted to adjourn to executive session for discussion of collective bargaining items. Following the executive session, Chairman Evans reconvened the meeting.

15. Service and Maintenance Unit Agreement. Mr. Hakanson moved approval of the agreement and the motion was seconded by Mr. Richardson. During discussion, Mr. Weatherbee objected to a provision which allows partial credit for accumulated sick leave toward determining the amount of retirement annuity, and reiterated his opposition to the agency shop and compulsory payment of union dues or equivalent. Mr. Richardson said that his seconding of the motion should not be interpreted as agreement with all provisions of the proposal; he indicated he would support it simply as a realistic solution to a situation that exists at present. With Mr. Weatherbee dissenting, it was

VOTED: to approve the collective bargaining agreement negotiated by the University with the service and maintenance unit represented by Teamsters Local No. 48, and to authorize the Chancellor, or his designee, to conclude the agreement on behalf of the University.

16. Clerical, Office, Laboratory and Technical (COLT) Unit - Memorandum of Understanding. Mr. Hakanson moved approval of the Memorandum of Understanding and the motion was seconded. Mr. Weatherbee objected to the provision for

partial credit of accumulated sick leave against determination of retirement annuity. With Mr. Weatherbee and Mrs. DiMatteo abstaining, it was

RESOLVED: that the Memorandum of Understanding reached by the University with the Maine Teachers Association and Teamsters Local No. 48 is approved and shall be implemented by the Chancellor or his designee.

17. Other Business. Mr. Weatherbee suggested that the Trustees review the relation of foreign student admissions to the number of openings available in the system, in the same way that the NEBHE exchange program was reviewed by the Board in 1978, and requested that staff prepare a profile of foreign students by Campus to facilitate the review. Mr. Monaghan reiterated his interest in a study of alternative calendar models which would allow students to complete a traditional program in less than the customary four years.

Chairman Evans announced that the next meeting will be held in Bangor on September 23, 1980.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
