# WARRANT

## GREETING:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby requested to notify and warn the inhabitants of the said town of Belgrade qualified by law to vote in town affairs to assemble at Grange Hall in said town on Monday the fourth of March, 1907 at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act on the following articles, to wit.

**FIRST**—To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.

**SECOND**—To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

**THIRD**—To see if the town will vote to have one or more road commissioners.

**FOURTH**—To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise to defray town charges for the year ensuing.

**FIFTH**—To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise for the support of schools for the ensuing year.

**SIXTH**—To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise for snow bills for the winter of 1906 and 1907.

**SEVENTH**—To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise for the support of roads and bridges for the present year.

**EIGHTH**—To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise for the repairs of school houses the ensuing year.

**NINTH**—To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise for the purchase of school books the ensuing year.

**TENTH**—To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise for the support of free High school for the ensuing year.

**ELEVENTH**—To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise for the building of State road if any.

**TWELFTH**—To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise for the purchase of Free High school books.

**THIRTEENTH**—To choose one member of Cemetery committee.

**FOURTEENTH**—To see if the town will accept a bequest of \$100 under the will of Cora A. Hammond the income to be annually expended upon her lot and the lot of J. C. Mosher in Woodside and Pine Grove cemeteries respectfully, and that part of the income not so expended to be used for general cemetery purposes.

**FIFTEENTH**—To see if the town will accept \$200 from Dr. L. J. Crooker, the same to be held in trust; the income to be annually expended upon his lot in Woodside cemetery, and that part of the income not so expended to be used for general cemetery purposes.

**SIXTEENTH**—To see if the town will accept a bequest of \$500 under the will of L. Wesley Bachelder the same to be held in trust, the income to be annually expended upon his lot in Woodside cemetery and that part of the income, not so expended to be used for general cemetery purposes.

**SEVENTEENTH**—To see if the town will accept a



bequest of \$200 under the will of L. Wesley Bachel-der, the same to be held in trust, the income to be annually expended upon the lot of Sadie J. Clough, in Pine Grove cemetery and that part of the income not so expended, to be used for general cemetery purposes.

EIGHTEENTH—To see if the town will vote to grant and raise \$100 to be expended at Woodside and Pine Grove cemeteries as recommended by the cemetery committee.

NINETEENTH—To see if the town will accept \$200 from A. M. Rollins, the same to be held in trust and the income to be annually expended upon his lot in Pine Grove cemetery and that part of the income not so expended to be used for general cemetery purposes.

TWENTIETH—To see if the town will vote to buy a new hearse.

TWENTY-FIRST—To see if the town will vote to build a school-house at Belgrade Depot, as recommended by the school committee and if so, how much money will they raise for that purpose.

TWENTY-SECOND—To see if the town will vote to grant and raise a sum of money to be expended in the observance of Memorial day.
