To: Selden J. Martin, Constable, Town of St. Albans, Greetings:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the Inhabitants of the Town of St. Albans to assemble at the Town Hall in the said town on Saturday, the fifteenth day of March, 1958 at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act on the following articles:

- Art. 1. To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.
- Art. 2. To choose a town clerk.
- Art. 3. To hear the reports of town officers and act thereon.
- Art. 4. To see if the town will vote to employ a town manager in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 91, Sections 16-19, Revised Statues of Maine 1954, as amended.
- Art. 5. To see if the town will vote to fix the compensation of such manager or to delegate the matter to the selectmen.
- Art. 6. To choose a Town Treasurer.
- Art. 7. To choose a member of the Superintending School Committee.
- Art. 8 To choose three or more Selectmen, Assessors and Overseers of the Poor, to determine their terms of office, and to fix their compensation in said offices in accordance with Chapter 90-A, Section 36, of the Revised Statutes of Maine.
- Art. 9. To choose a Road Commissioner, fix his compensation or act on anything relating thereto.
- Art. 10. To choose a collector of taxes, fix his compensation or act on anything relating to discounts, interest and time of payment of the 1958 taxes.

- Art. 11. To choose all other necessary town officers.
- Art. 12. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of the 1958 taxes; such loan or loans to be paid during said taxable year.
- Art. 13. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell tax acquired property, on such terms as they may deem advisable, and to execute out claim deeds for such property.
- Art. 14. To see if the town will vote to accept the following sums of money for perpetual care of cemetery lots as mentioned:

- Art. 15. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for elementary schools, including teachers' salaries, fuel, janitor service, conveyance, supplies, tuition and board of pupils, school physician, and supervision.

 (Budget Comm. recommends \$23,000.80)
- Art. 16. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for secondary school tuition. (Budget Comm. recommends \$8,000.00)
- Art. 17. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for repairs and insurance on school buildings.

(Budget Comm. recommends \$1,500.00)

Art. 18. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for insurance on the Town Hall and equipment.

- Art. 19. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for public health nursing in St. Albans. Said sum to be expended by the Maine Department of Health and Welfare, Bureau of Health, for local service. (Budget Comm. recommends \$100.00)
- Art. 20. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay town charges. (Budget Comm. recommends \$4,000.00)
- Art. 21. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the town poor. (Budget Comm. recommends \$1,500.00)
- Art. 22. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for aid to dependent children.

 (Budget Comm. recommends \$1,200.00)
- Art. 23. To see if the town will raise and appropriate \$50.00 to be paid to the State of Maine Publicity Bureau to be expended and used for advertising the natural resources, advantages and attractions of the State of Maine, in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 91, Sec. 108, of the Revised Statutes of 1954.

(Budget Comm. recommends \$50.00)

- Art. 24. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$10.00 toward the support of the activities of the Somerset County Soil Conservation District. (Budget Comm. recommends \$10.00)
- Art. 25. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,066.00 to pay on State Aid Road notes, construction of which has been completed.

(Budget Comm. recommends \$1,066.00)

- Art. 26. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to be used to improve the Rand Hill Road, so called, from the top of the Rand Hill to the Henry Brown residence. (Budget Comm. made no recommendation.)
- Art. 27. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to be used to improve the road from the Louis White corner to the Hartwell place, so called, now the Denbow residence. (Budget Comm. made no recommendation.)

Art. 28. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repairs of summer roads.

(Budget Comm. recommends \$5,000.00)

Art. 29. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for snow removal and sanding of winter roads, and for the erection of snow fence.

(Budget Comm. recommends \$5,000.00)

- Art. 30. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for street and hall lights. (Budget Comm. recommends \$600.00)
- Art. 31. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for repair of town bridges and culverts. (Budget Comm. recommends \$1,000.00)
- Art. 32. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Fire Dept. expenses. (Budget Comm. recommends \$750.00)
- Art. 33. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise or appropriate to pay on loan, authorized at Special Town Meeting held September 30, 1957 to purchase snow plow equipment and to install the Red Network Alarm system.
- Art. 34. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise or appropriate to pay for gravel used in construction of the State Aid Road on Route No. 23 from the Lang Cemetery to the Ripley Town Line. Said gravel being the town's share of the re-construction expense.
- Art. 35. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise or appropriate to pay the bills incurred May 9, 1957 fighting Forest Fires.
- Art. 36. To see if the town will vote to establish a reserve fund under the provisions of P. L. 1957, Chapter 405, section 17, with a capital improvement account to be known as "The St. Albans Credit Reserve Account." The purpose of such account would be to assist the town during periods of financial emergency to continue its normal operation without increasing the tax rate.

Art. 37. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise or appropriate for the "St. Albans Credit Reserve Account" of the Reserve Fund.

(Budget Comm. recommends transfer of all money (both principal and interest) in the School Building Fund to this account and an

added appropriation of \$1,000 this year.)

Art. 38. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise or appropriate to pay Social Security Insurance payments.

(Budget Comm. recommends \$200.00)

- Art. 39. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise or appropriate to care for Soldiers' Graves. (Budget Comm. recommends \$200.00)
- Art. 40. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise or appropriate for general care of cemeteries. (Budget Comm. recommends \$300.00)
- Art. 41. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise or appropriate for Civil Defense and Public Safety in the town. (Budget Comm. recommends \$200.00)
- Art. 42. To see if the town will vote to expend the Excise Tax money to retire the outstanding notes and interest of the town until such notes are paid in full, or act on anything relating thereto.
- Artt. 43. To see if the town will vote to raise or appropriate
 the sum of \$2,342.68 to cover the 1957 overdrawn

- Art. 44. To see if the town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$400.00 to cooperate with the Maine Forest Service and Federal Government in control of white pine blister rust, in accordance with Revised Statutes, Chapter 36, Section 69.
- Art. 45. To see if the town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$200.00 to establish a Capital Improvement Account of the Reserve Fund under the provisions of P. L. 1957, Chapter 405, Section 17, to build a Memorial honoring those who served in World Wars I and II and in the Korean War.
- Art. 46. To see if the town will instruct the school board to have the pupils in the 8th grade take the Maine State Examination before entering High School.
- Art. 47. To see if the town will vote to have all of the town officials have telephones installed at their own expense while employed by the town.
- Art. 48. To see if the town will vote to have no member on the school board who has other business with the town.
- Art. 49. To act upon any other matters that may legally come before any town meeting.

Insofar as could be ascertained within the scope of the examination, the financial transactions of the Town appear to have been appropriately handled with such exceptions as may be noted in the accompanying comments.

Exhibits and schedules incorporated in this report present the financial position of the Town at February 10, 1958, and the result of its operations for the year then ended.

Recommendations are also offered which are believed to be worthy of your consideration.

TOWN OF ST. ALBANS FEBRUARY 11, 1957 to FEBRUARY 10, 1958

An audit has been completed of the books and records of the Town of St. Albans for the year ended February 10, 1958.

The records maintained by the Town Manager, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Assessors, and Town Clerk were audited. The system of internal control was reviewed. Accounting records and other supporting evidence were examined or tested to the extent deemed necessary under the circumstances.

It is believed that the accompanying balance sheet together with the related financial statements fairly present the financial position of the Town at February 10, 1958, and the result of its operations for the year then ended.

ASSETS

At the year end, the records reflected a cash balance of \$12,711.86, whereas the reconciliation of the bank account indicated a balance of \$12,721.45. The difference of \$9.59 has been set up in a suspense account. The cash balance was reconciled as follows:

The 1957 assessment charged to the Tax Collector was accounted for as follows:

It was noted that unpaid real estate taxes of the 1956 tax commitment had not been secured by tax liens or tax deeds. Unpaid prior years taxes totaled \$6,820.69 which is an increase of \$1,920.62 over prior years taxes receivable at February 10, 1957. During the year, sales of tax acquired property totaled \$1,950.00 of which \$1,510,95 represented profit on the sale.

LIABILITIES

Accounts payable totaled \$847.96 and notes payable totaled \$9,000.00 at the year end. During the year, the notes payable were reduced by \$5,510.00. Tax Anticipation notes of \$5,000.00 were issued and paid. Fire Department note of \$2,000 was assumed by Town.

RESERVES AND SURPLUS

To the fund established for the purchase of truck and snowplow was added an appropriation of \$1,500.00 making a total in the fund of \$3,900.00. The entire fund was expended for the purpose for which it had been established. The school building fund earned \$50.00 in interest during the year and totaled \$3,050.00 at the year end. Of this amount, \$1,720.00 was invested in the stock of the Manufacturers Trust Company of New York and the balance of \$1,330.00 is still a part of the cash of the General Fund and has not been invested.

Unexpended balances in certain appropriation accounts which were carried forward to the ensuing year for expenditure totaled \$5,733.71 as compared with \$189.18 at the end of the last fiscal year. The principal increase was noted in the education accounts.

Unappropriated surplus was decreased by \$1,304.55 as a result of the year's operations and totaled \$19,508.87 at the year end. The principal cause for this decrease were the overdrafts in certain appropriation accounts. A complete analysis of the change in this account may be found on Exhibit E of this report.

TRUST FUNDS

The investments of the trust funds were verified. New funds received during the year and held pending acceptance by the Town at the annual meeting totaled \$800.00. These funds are included in the cash of the General Fund. Unexpended income totaled \$456.55.

GENERAL

Excise tax receipts totaled \$4,871.65 and were verified by examination of the copies of the receipts issued by the Collector.

The following corporate surety bond was on file:

RECOMMENDATIONS

The following recommendations appear to be worthy of your consideration:

- That, the proceeds of the capital reserve fund be invested in accordance with statutory requirements.
- 2. That, the bank balance be reconciled at the end of each month.
- 3. That, more care be exercised in making out the Tax Collector's warrant.
- That, tax liens or tax deeds be used to secure unpaid Taxes assessed against real estate.
- 5. That, a trial balance be taken of the accounts in the ledger at the end of each month.
 - 6. That, excise tax receipts be deposited more promptly.
- 7. That, supplemental taxes be committed to the Tax Collector.

The purpose of the Public Health Program is to promote good health and prevent disease and deformity. The Public Health Nurse attempts to attain this goal through visits to homes and schools, encouraging Health Councils and helping to plan and assist with clinics.

A series of Child Health Conferences were held. Physical examniations were offered in addition to immunizations against diphtheria, tetanus, whooping cough, smallpox, and polio.

Free polio clinics have been held offering polio vaccine to every one from six months to twenty years of age.

Orthopedic and Pediatric clinics, sponsored by the State Department of Health and Welfare are held regularly and provide opportunity for medical consultation and care for crippled children and those with cardiac or rheumatic fever complications. There is also, a clinic for the Mentally Retarded Pre-school child. Regional x-ray clinics and the services of the State Sanatorium are available to those referred by their family physician.

It is the hope of your Public Health Nurse that, through the combined efforts of the nurse and community, every individual and family may realize the enjoyment of a high standard of health.

Your Public Health Nurse wishes to express her sincere appreciation to the members of the local Health Council and other interested persons for their assistance with clinics and other community programs.

In October the Committee introduced the sub-primary grade to the school system. As the total enrollment was dropping in numbers and because it was felt that we should have subprimary in the school, the decision seems to be a wise one.

St. Albans is fortunate in having a very strong teaching force this year. Since schools started in September much progress has been made educationally. Your teachers deserve a great deal of credit.

Much repair work was accomplished during the summer months and vacations. Rooms were painted, shelving added in several rooms, lights installed in the lunch room and the water supply was improved. Our repair money for next year should be spent mostly on adequate heating. Heating pipes that are exposed need to be covered with asbestos and storm sash needs to be installed on the north and west side windows. At the present time there isn't any definite information to report on the formation of a school administration district. Your school committees are meeting with groups from surrounding communities. In the near future there should be something definite to report to the people of St. Albans.

PROGRESS REPORT ON MOUTH HEALTH PROJECT

During the past year a dental hygienist from the State Department of Health and Welfare devoted 12½ days to working with preschool children and elementary school children to promote mouth health.

A total of 7 preschool children and 81 school children had sodium fluoride solution applied to their erupted teeth for the partial prevention of dental decay. These same children had their teeth cleaned.

A total of 7 preschool children and 105 school children received mouth examinations and were given reports to take to their parents.

A total of 112 children were instructed in mouth care, either individually or in classrooms.

Important Notice . . .

All taxpayers should read the following requirement and comply with it:

Section 35, Chapter 81, Revised Statutes of Maine, 1944:

"Before making an assessment, the Assessors shall give reasonable notice in writing to the inhabitants, by posting notifications in some public place in the Town, or shall notify them, in such other ways as the Town, at its Annual Meeting directs, to make and bring in to them true and perfect lists of their Polls, and all their estates, real and personal, not by law exempt from taxation, of which they were possessed on the first day of April of the same year. If any resident owner, after such notice, does not bring in such lists, he is thereby barred of his right to make application to the Assessors or the County Commissioners for any abatement of his taxes, unless he offers such lists with his application and satisfies them that he was unable to offer it at the time appointed."
