SCHOOL REPORT.

The following report for the school year ending Mar. 20, 1895, is respectfully submitted :

The schools have been very profitable, both teachers and pupils taking especial interest in their work, which is fully shown by the advancement the pupils have made during the year.

A statistical table of the schools will be given below.

As the new school law requires uniformity in length of schools, and the employment of efficient teachers in all cases, the extra expense entailed thereby, can be met only by adopting one of three methods, viz :—

First : By uniting small schools.

Second : By cutting short the village schools.

Third : By raising more school money.

It remains for the citizens of Damariscotta to decide which of the three methods shall be employed.

At a meeting of the School Board held Mar. 2, 1895, it was voted to submit the following recommendations :

First : That schools in Dists. No. 5 and 6 (formerly) be united, and that the school-house be moved and as centrally located as will best convene the scholars of the schools thus consolidated.

Second : That school in Dist. No. 4 (formerly) be abolished and the scholars of said district attend school in Dist. No. 2 (formerly.)

Third : That the sum of \$75 be raised for needed repairs for the ensuing year, and \$200 additional be raised for repairs on school-house in Dist. No. 4 (formerly) if school in said district be not abolished.

Fourth : That the sum of \$100 be raised for school books for the ensuing year.

- Art. 12. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of schools for the ensuing year;

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- Art. 13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of poor for the ensuing year;
- Art. 14. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for current expenses for the ensuing year;
- Art. 15. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the fire department for the ensuing year;
- Art. 16. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for school text books for the ensuing year;
- Art. 17. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for highways and bridges for the ensuing year, and in what manner they will expend the same;
- Art. 18. To see if the town will accept the following recommendations of the School Board as voted at a meeting held Mar. 2, 1895:
- First: To see if town will vote to unite schools in Dists. No. 5 and 6 (formerly) and the school-house be moved and as centrally located as will best convene the scholars of the school thus consolidated.
- Second: To see if the town will vote to abolish the school in Dist. No. 4 (formerly) and unite it with Dist. No. 2 (formerly.)
- Third: To see if the town will vote to raise \$75 for repairs on school-houses, and to raise \$200 additional for repairs on school-house in Dist. No. 4 (formerly) if school in said district be not abolished.
- Art. 19. To see if the town will vote to fix the compensation of the Superintendent of Schools.
