REPORT OF THE TOWN MANAGER

To the Board of Selectmen, Citizens and Taxpayers of the Town of Monson:

I would like to begin my report by thanking Bob Lander for the many fine years of service he provided the town. Due solely to the work that Bob planned and presented last year, the town finds itself again in excellent condition.

Revenue Sharing comprises a little more than a third of the total budget and will continue to defray, at least temporarily, a major tax increase. The revaluation proposal being made this year should further aid the community in adjusting to this period of "inflationary spiral" that the entire nation is now enduring.

Mr. Brown of Bryant M. Brown and Associates, a familiar face to Monson, conducted two audits of the town this year. A special audit was conducted during the transition from Mr. Lander to myself and our annual audit was just completed.

Highway: Further improvement of the Willimantic Road was completed this summer and the State is continuing that project this year. Work on the Barrows Falls Road is continuing this year as well. Regular maintenance was carried out by the town forces which have been expanded through a Federal Grant. The highway crew is now providing a once a week pick up of trash on Thursdays. Ditching of the streets and ways should be completed soon after the spring thaw. The fall rains

and sediment have clogged or blocked many of the drains and ditches.

Plowing of the Town Streets and ways and State Aid Roads was again done by Farrin Bros. and Smith, Inc. of Brighton. Even though there was a rise in the contract fees, this was offset by an increased State reimbursement for snow removal.

Commerical Paving Co., South Portland, surfaced the town streets this year and as anticipated there was a substantial increase in the cost of materials. There is a further anticipated rise in costs this year as well.

Cemeteries: Mr. Weldon Conner was appointed Sexton of all cemeteries and, as in the past, the pride and skill he places in his work is evident in all of Monson's cemeteries. A reminder that lots that are not in Perpetual Care are subject to a mowing fee. This should be paid directly to Mr. Conner.

As a novice in this position I would like to extend a heartfelt thank you to each of you for your patience, understanding, and assistance during these past months. A special thank you to Mrs. Donna Lowell, Clarence and Philip Pratt, without their help my initial months would have been absolute chaos.

FIRE CHIEF'S REPORT

To the citizens of the Town of Monson. Fire calls answered by the Monson Fire Department.

January 1, 1974 - December 31, 1974. Nine of these calls were to out of town alarms.

Equipment purchased this past year included 1,000 feet of 4 inch hose with necessary fittings. We are renovating our 4 x 4 pick-up to be used as a hose truck for this hose. We expect to complete this with a paint job in the spring.

We have two new M.S.A. smoke masks; one was purchased from the Fireman's fund and the other from the Arthur Haggstrom Memorial Fund.

Drills were held twice a month during the summer through October with special attention being given to the use of our four inch hose. We had two men on duty Sunday P. M. during the summer months. These men performed needed work on equipment and were available for quick response in the event of a fire or other emergency.

We have six Junior Firemen who assist in traffic control, radio operation and other nonhazardous duties.

We do not contemplate any major equipment purchases during the next year, however we feel that we should make some improvements in our radios especially our Base Station, which is over twenty years old and has given us considerable trouble in the past year.

Our usual money raising activities during the year include our Rabies Clinic, the Baked Bean Supper and our Fireman's Calendar program. These were very successful due to the cooperation of the town's people and work by the members of the Fire Dept.

On behalf of the Monson Fire Department I wish to thank you for your cooperation in our programs and fire fighting activities of the past year.

MONSON PLANNING BOARD

March 1975

Report of Activities

Throughout the Planning Board's second year, members concentrated their efforts upon composition of a municipal building code and a shoreland zoning ordinance.

After many hours of careful consideration, the proposed building code was presented to townspeople at two public hearings, held on Tuesday, March 5 and on Wednesday, April 17. The code was revised as a result of incorporating suggestions offered at the hearings.

Approximately 14 hours during 9 consecutive weekly meetings held between April 2 and May 28 were put into the preparation of the shoreland zoning ordinance material and map, together with 12 news articles printed in area newspapers during April and May. A public hearing was held on Tuesday, May 21, to explain the material and receive suggestions from townspeople. Copies of the proposed material were available prior to the hearing.

At a special town meeting held on Monday, June 3, both the building code (dated May 28, 1974) and the shoreland zoning ordinance were adopted by Monson voters.

Subsequently, a building permit form was designed and printed. The Board has followed implementation of the building code through periodic reports from Code Enforcement Officer Lloyd Kelley.

On March 18, 1974, at the annual Town Meeting the seat of Francis Marshall on the Board of Directors was taken by Larry Hoyt. George Young was elected Chairman at their first meeting.

This past fall a new well was drilled in the same area as the two existing wells. The new well is 300 feet deep and cost \$2,918.77. This cost includes the well, pipe, pump, and all miscellaneous parts and labor. For this project the Board borrowed from the Northeast Bank of Guilford, \$2,500.00 of which as of January 1, 1975, \$1,000.00 has been paid back.

We again take this opportunity to ask all persons who have added additional fixtures in their homes to report them to the Town Office. Without this information it is quite possible that we will have to request an increase because of added operational expenses.
