The past school year has been, on the whole, successful and progressive, though much broken up by changes in our teaching force. There have been changes of teachers in 8 of the II schools in town during the year, and while changes in many instances finally resulted in improvement, at first it has tended to interfere with the progress of the school. The year's work in the Gorham High School has been very satisfactory. The attendance has kept up to that of previous years and the character and amount of work done has been fully up to the past high standard of the school. Mrs. Glover resigned her position as asst. teacher at the close of the summer term and Miss Ellen F. Snow was elected to fill the vacancy. Miss Snow is a graduate of Bates College, has had a long experience in teaching and has proved a capable assistant.

There is a most urgent demand for a second assistant in our High School, if we wish to maintain our High School on a par with the best High Schools in the state. At present our two teachers are overworked to such a degree, that not only are they unable to give sufficient time to the various recitations, but they are also compelled by lack of time, to omit certain valuable class exercises, notably class correction of written work, etc. It is most earnestly recommended that sufficient money be appropriated this year to enable us to employ another assistant.

Mr. Dole resigned his position as Prin. of the Frederick Robie School, at the end of the summer term, and Mr. Tozier, a graduate of Bates College, was elected to the position. Miss Davis, so long assistant teacher in this school, had resigned in the spring and Miss Hinkley, who took her place, resigned in the fall, giving place to Miss Usher.

These many changes have somewhat interfered with the work in this school, but during the latter part of the year, progress has been more satisfactory.

This is one of the largest schools in town, and the school building is not suitably arranged to accommodate the pupils that must attend here.

The arrangement and condition of the outhouses, also, is such as to demand immediate attention. No satisfactory improvement can be made until more land is acquired at the rear of the present grounds. It is urgently recommended that suitable appropriation be made to provide for these needed changes.

At the Levi Hall School, Prin. Lubee, closed a successful

year's work and graduated the following class:

The graduating class presented the school with an unabridged dictionary and stand. The lessening attendance and the small number of pupils in this district compelled the School Board to consider the advisability of maintaining a High and Grammar grade in this school as had been done in the past, requiring an assistant in the upper grade, 3 teachers in all for only 35 pupils. It was decided to cut out the High School work, thus dispensing with one teacher.

At the commencement of the fall term the school was put in charge of Miss Coffin, with Miss Douglass in the primary and intermediate department, and the new arrangement has been successfully established. The White Rock School has maintained its excellent standing under the charge of Miss Varney and Miss Files. Some repairs have lightened and improved the main room, the pupils have placed pictures on the walls and the whole appearance of the school is bright and cheerful. The Blake schoolhouse has been repaired considerably—new seats put in and a successful school maintained throughout the year. The work done in the other ungraded schools during the year has been very satisfactory except where hindered by change of teachers. The Longfellow School has suffered particularly in in this respect, having had 3 different teachers during the year.

The heating apparatus at the Gorham High School needs repairs before another fall and the School Board would recommend a special appropriation for that purpose. It would also recommend a special appropriation for improvements at the Frederick Robie School.

- ART. 2. To choose town officers for the ensuing year.
- $\ensuremath{\mathsf{Art.}}$ 3. To recieve and act upon the report of the several town officers.
- ART. 4. To see what sum of money the town will raise to pay outstanding bills.
- ART. 5. To see if the town will vote to raise \$228 58 to pay interest on Huston fund.
- ART. 6. To see if the town will vote to allow such accounts as may be presented against the town, and raise money to pay the same.
- -ART. 7. To see what sum of money the town will raise for the support of the poor.
- ART. 8. To see what sum of money the town will raise for highways.

ART. 9. To see what sum of money the town will raise for bridges.

ART, 10. To see what sum of money the town will raise for contingent expenses.

ART. II. To see what sum of money the town will raise for common schools.

ART 12. To see what sum of money the town will raise for free high schools.

ART. 13. To see what sum of money the town will vote for the repairs on school-houses, and the care and heating the same.

ART. 14. To see what sum of money the town will raise for the purchase of school books.

ART. 15. To see what sum of money the town will raise for the suitable observance of Memorial day.

ART. 16. To see if the town will raise fifteen dollars (\$15) for the support of a meeting at Little Falls, for the benefit of the inmates of the Town Farm.

ART. 17. To see if the town will vote to allow discount on taxes paid within a certain time from the commitment of the same to the collector; also the time and amount of discount.

ART. 18. To see upon what condition and what per cent. the town will vote to pay for collecting the taxes for the year 1904.

ART. 19. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise in addition to the amount already raised for roads and bridges, for the establishment of, and to be expended upon, a State road as provided by Chapter 63 of the Public Laws of Maine for the year 1903.

 A_{RT} , 20. To see what sum of money the town will raise for the abatement of taxes.

ART. 21. To see what sum of money the town will raise for discount of taxes.

ART. 22. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to refund all or any part of the town bonds,

amounting to one thousand (\$1,000) coming due this year, by the issue of a like amount of new bonds.

ART. 23. To see if the town will vote to pay any or all of the town bonds, amounting to one thousand dollars (\$1,000), coming due this year, and raise money therefor.

ART. 24. To see if the town will vote to raise one hundred and twenty dollars (\$120.00) to pay interest on town bonds.

ART. 25. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to refund the town notes amounting to one thousand three hundred dollars (\$1,300.00) coming due this year.

ART. 26. To see if the town will vote to raise thirty-five dollars and fifty cents (\$35.50) to pay interest on town notes.

ART. 27. To see if the town will vote to pay the town notes amounting to one thousand three hundred (\$1300) coming due this year, and raise money therefor.

ART. 28. To see if the town will vote to buy a sidewalk plow and raise money therefor, agreeable to an application.

ART. 29. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise, to purchase land and build an addition to the Frederick Robie school.

ART. 30. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to repair or replace the heating apparatus in Gorham High School building, as recommended by the school committee.

ART. 31. To see if the town will vote to hire rooms for the use of the town, in the new block at the corner of State and School Streets in Gorham Village for a term of years, and to raise money to build a fireproof vault therein for the use of the town.

ART. 32. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of seventy five dollars (\$75.00) for the improvement of the cemetery at North Gorham.

ART. 33. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise, for the improvement of the old cemetery at Gorham Village.

ART. 34. To see what sum of money the town will vote to

raise, to erect headstones on the town lot in Hillside cemetery.

ART. 35. To see if the town will vote to buy snow rollers and raise money for the same.

ART. 36. To see if the town will vote to buy a road machine, and raise money for the same.

ART. 37. To act upon any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
