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

TEACHERS.

None but experienced teachers have been employed during the past year. Good progress has been made in all the schools. A kind and helpful spirit has existed between the scholars and parents with the teachers. This is as it should be. The parents should ever be ready and willing to assist the teachers and the pupils.

REPAIRS.

The appropriation for repairs has been exceeded. The Hill school house was badly damaged by fire at the close of the preceding winter's school. Extensive repairs were necessary. As the house was very small six feet was added to the length of it. New floor and ceiling put in, thereby using nearly all of the appropriation.

The house is now in good condition and will do good service for some time to come. Repairs in the others houses have been slight.

SCHOOL BOOKS.

Some of the badly worn and defaced books have been replaced by new ones, but there are still many books unfit for use. Greater care should be taken by the pupils of these school books. Teachers and parents perhaps need to give a more careful direct supervision in this matter, and those pupils that deface books should be compelled to make good the same.

Charts, maps or globes are very much needed in the schools. They are a great help to the pupils as well as a convenience to the teachers.

In conclusion we must say that the schools for the past

year have been very profitable and it is with pleasure that we have noted the interest manifested by those not directly connected with the schools. We wish that more would enquire into the schools and visit them. It encourages both the teachers and the pupils.

We feel grateful for your kindly spirit and hearty cooperation during the past year and trust it will be manifested likewise in the years to come.
