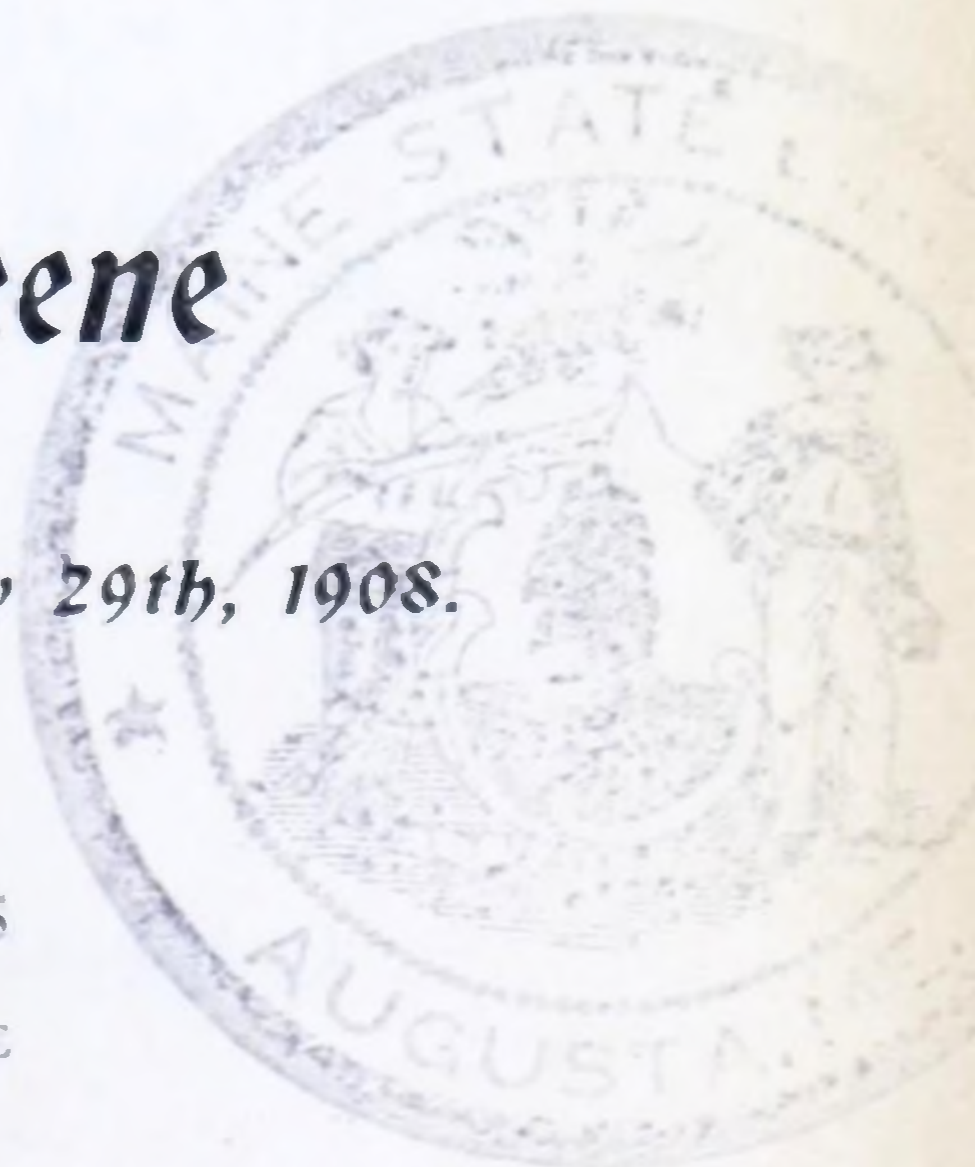

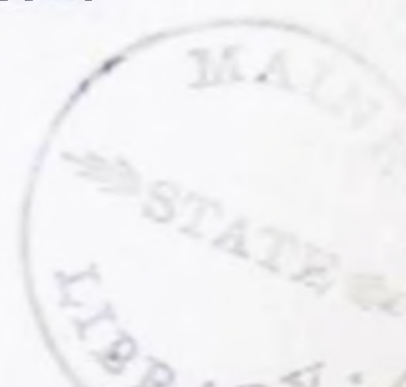

## TEXT BOOKS

Some changes should be made in text books. Many of the books have been in use until badly worn and parts missing. It will be wise to replace such with books of later publication. Maps of different countries were bought for all schools last year.



They are of great help in Geography and History work. In changing books a part should be done each year, thus keeping the cost small. Would recommend the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100) for the demands of the next year.

## SCHOOLHOUSES

Since last report, the Hill schoolhouse has been underpinned and a new chimney built, the Corner house painted outside, the Lane, painted, papered and other repairs inside. The Lane and Hill houses should both be painted outside. The Corner house should have small repairs to walls on inside. The work done on the Lane building adds much to the cheerfulness of the schoolroom. This work should go on until all are in good repair. Two hundred dollars (\$200) should be raised under this head.

## CONCLUSION

The schools on the whole have done good work. Each year finds it harder to secure good teachers for the money we can pay. We must make up our minds to pay more salary if we wish to keep up the standard of the schools.

The Cummings School falling below the standard required by law, the Committee thought best to close the same and transport the children to the Corner School. By this change, money has been saved and a more interesting school built up at the latter place. In closing, I wish to ask the people to take more interest

in the schools—in the right way—not in a faultfinding spirit. The three men on the committee are trying to give you the best they can within their power and they should have the hearty support of every voter in town and a little less of criticism.
