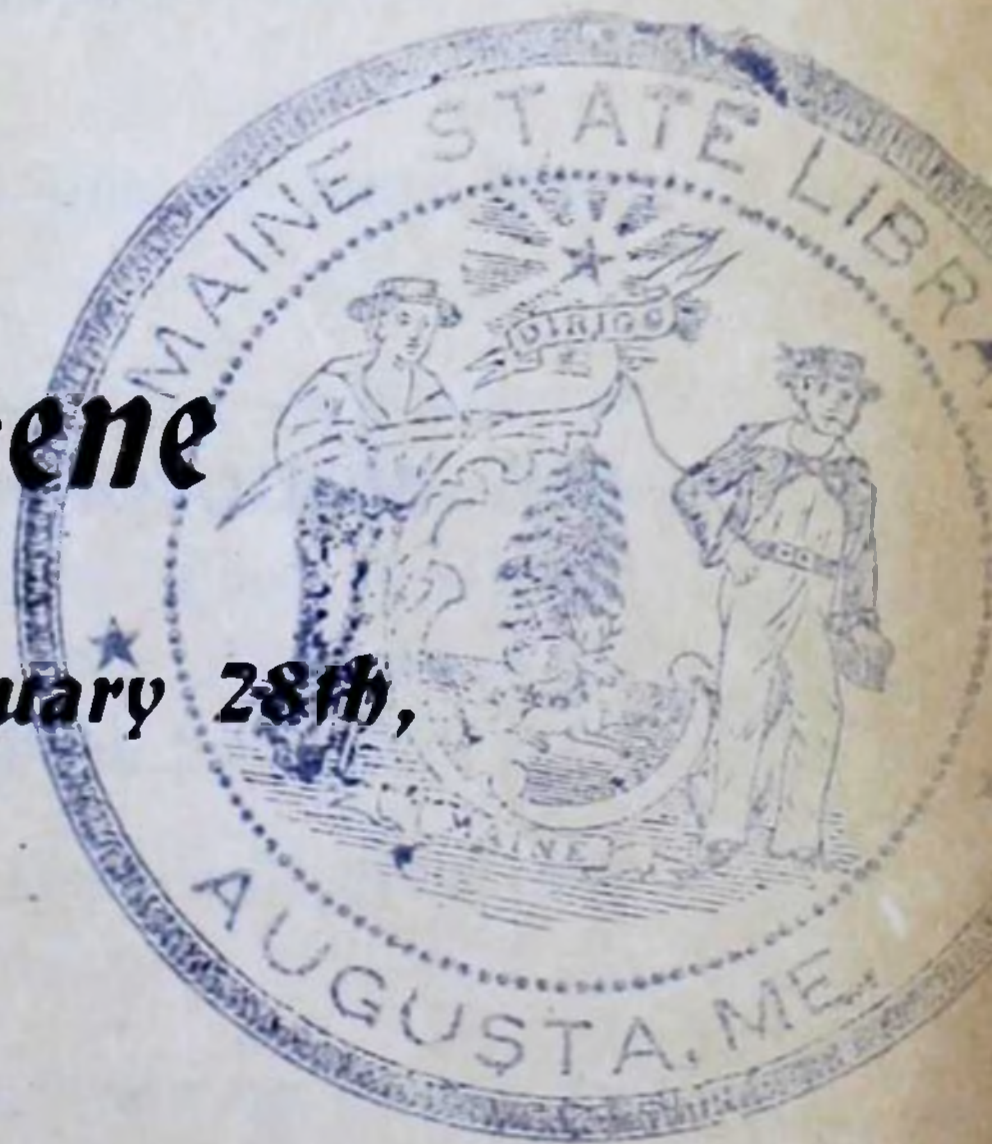

# TOWN WARRANT

ANDROSCOGGIN S. S. STATE OF MAINE.

*To C. S. Foss, a Constable of the town of Greene  
in Said County.*

GREETING :

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby requested to notify and warn the inhabitants of the said town of Greene, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at the Town House in said town on the 15th day of March, 1909, at Ten O'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, to wit :

FIRST. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

SECOND. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

THIRD. To see if the Town will choose one or more Road Commissioners for the ensuing year.

FOURTH. To see if the Town will grant and raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintainance and support of schools, current expenses and cost of poor, repairs of roads and bridges and defray all other town charges for the ensuing year, including the snow bills for the past year.

FIFTH. To see what sum of money the Town will grant and raise to pay tuition for the ensuing year.

SIXTH. To see if the Town will vote "yes" or "no" upon the adoption of the provisions of Chapter 112 of the Public Laws

of Maine for the year 1907, relating to the appropriation of money necessary to entitle the town to state aid for highways for the year 1909.

SEVENTH. To see if the Town will raise, appropriate and set apart for the permanent improvement of the State road within the town such sum of money as is contemplated and directed by Section 5 of Chapter 112 of the Public Laws of Maine for the year 1907, being the sum of \$52.50.

EIGHTH. To see what sum of money the Town will grant and raise to pay the debt and interest for the ensuing year.

NINTH. To see what sum of money the Town will grant and raise for watering tubs for the ensuing year, including a permanent tub near Greene Depot.

TENTH. To see what sum of money the Town will grant and raise for Memorial Day for the ensuing year.

ELEVENTH To see what sum of money the Town will raise to destroy the Brown Tail Moth and what bounty shall be paid on same per nest, for the ensuing year.

TWELFTH. To see if the Town will vote to open the Mountain School, so-called, upon a written recommendation of the School Committee.

THIRTEENTH. To see if the Town will vote to open the Morse School, so-called, upon a written recommendation of the School Committee.

FOURTEENTH. To see if the Town will vote to open the Cummings School, so-called, upon a written recommendation of the School Committee.

FIFTEENTH. To see if the Town will vote to enlarge the Valley Cemetery, pursuant to the action taken by the Municipal Officers at a meeting held December 11th, 1908.

SIXTEENTH. To see if the Town will vote to accept the list of Jurors as prepared by the Selectmen, Clerk and Treasurer.

SEVENTEENTH. To see if the Town will vote to repair the Town House and if so, what sum of money they will grant and raise for that purpose.

EIGHTEENTH. To see if the Town will vote to buy a Town Farm and what sum of money they will grant and raise for said purpose.

The Selectmen give notice that they will be in session for the purpose of revising and correcting the voting list, at the Town House at 9 o'clock in the forenoon of the day of said meeting.
