The piano introduction is in 4/4 time, B-flat major, and Moderato. It begins with a mezzo-forte (*mf*) dynamic. The right hand features a melody of eighth notes, while the left hand provides a steady accompaniment of quarter notes. The piece concludes with a *rit.* (ritardando) marking.
