WARRANT FOR TOWN MEETING

To W. A. Corey, a constable in the Town of Holden, in the County of Penobscot, and State of Maine.

GREETINGS:

In the State of Maine, you are hereby requested to notify and warn the inhabitants of the town of Holden, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to meet at the Town Hall, in said town, on Monday, the 11th day of March, 1935, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, and there to act on the following articles, to wit:

Art. 1. To choose a moderator to preside over said meeting.

Art. 2. To choose a clerk for the ensuing year.

Art. 3. To act on report of town officers.

Art. 4. To choose all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

Art. 5. To see if the town will vote to elect a Road Commissioner and fix his compensation.

Art. 6. To act on the report of the Budget Committee.

Art. 7. To see if the town will vote to grant and raise such sums of money as may be necessary for maintenance and support of schools, repair of roads and bridges, care of the poor, pay of town officers, incidental expenses, school-house repairs, tuition of high school scholars, superintendent of schools, maintenance of state and state aid roads, for Mothers Aid, for dependent children, and for paying other legal charges.

Art. 8. To see where the town will vote to expend the State Aid highway money for 1935.

Art. 9. To see if the town will vote "yes" or "no" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the town to State Aid as provided in Sect. 28, Chap. 28 Revised Statutes of 1930.

Art. 10. To see what sum the town will appropriate and raise for the improvement of the section of State Aid road as outlined in the report of the State Highway Commission

on (in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges) under the provisions of Sec. 18, Chap. 28 Revised Statutes of 1930 or under the provisions of Sec. 3 Chap. 175 P. L. of 1933.

Art. 11. To see what sum, if any, the town would recommend to take from the joint State Aid account for the purpose of applying bituminous surface treatment to State Aid roads built within the past five years in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 271, P. L. 1931.

Art. 12. To see if the town will vote to raise \$437.00 for maintenance of third class roads, as required by law in accordance with Sec. 5, Chap. 175 Public Laws 1933.

Art. 13. To see if the town will vote to authorize the treasurer to hire money with the approval of the selectmen, when necessary to pay town bills, and give the town's note for same, and to renew outstanding notes when desired.

Art. 14. To see if the town will vote to raise \$150.00 to repair the road from R. L. Copeland's residence to the property of Dr. Forrest Ames.

Art. 15. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the services of the County Nurse.

Art. 16 To see if the town will vote to raise \$100.00 to be expended on the road from Kingsburys Connor to the property of Percy Levenseller.

Art. 17. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the Ryder's Bluff road, from Scott Houston's building on.

Art. 18. To see if the town will vote to authorize the assessors to abate Walter Smiths 1934 taxes.

Art. 19. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The Selectmen will be in session in the Town Hall for the purpose of receiving and correcting the list of voters, from nine to ten o'clock in the forenoon on the 11th of March, 1935.
