WARRANT

State of Maine

*To J. Manley Sweet, a Constable of the Town of Holden, in
the County of Penobscot,*

GREETINGS:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Holden, in said County, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to meet at the Holden Town Hall in said town on Monday, the twelfth day of March, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon, then and there to act on the following articles, to wit:

Article 1. To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.

Art. 2. To choose a clerk for the ensuing year.

Art. 3. To hear and act on the report of the town officers.

Art. 4. To choose selectmen, assessors, and overseers of the poor.

Art. 5. To choose a town treasurer.

Art. 6. To choose a collector of taxes.

Art. 7. To choose a road commissioner.

Art. 8. To choose a member of school committee.

Art. 9. To choose two or more constables.

Art. 10. To choose all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

Art. 11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repair of roads and bridges, for the ensuing year.

Art. 12. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for maintenance of state and state aid roads.

Art. 13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for maintenance of third class roads.

Art. 14. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for state aid road construction (in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges), under the provision of Section 19, Chapter 28, Revised Statutes of 1930, or under the provisions of Chapter 213, Public Laws of 1941.

Art. 15. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for snow removal.

Art. 16. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for care of cemeteries.

Art. 17. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for dependent children.

Art. 18. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for support of poor.

Art. 19. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the health department.

Art. 20. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for incidental expenses.

Art. 21. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for pay of town officers.

Art. 22. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for fire protection.

Art. 23. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Maine Municipal Association dues.

Art. 24. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for interest on school fund.

Art. 25. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for common schools.

Art. 26. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for high school tuition.

Art. 27. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for schoolhouse repairs.

Art. 28. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for textbooks and supplies.

Art. 29. To see if the town will raise and appropriate \$50.00 for public health nursing in Holden. Said sum to be expended by the State Bureau of Health for local service.

Art. 30. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to procure temporary loan or loans in anticipation of taxes, for the purpose of paying obligations of the town; such loan or loans to be paid during the current

municipal year out of money raised during said current municipal year by taxation.

Art. 31. To see what sum of money the town will vote to pay various town officers for the ensuing year, and what compensation for labor on public roads and for fighting fire.

Art. 32. To see if the town will fix a date when taxes shall be due and payable and to see if the town will fix a rate of interest to be charged on taxes unpaid after said date.

Art. 33. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to sell, and dispose of property acquired by the town by tax process on such terms as they deem advisable, and to execute quit claim deeds for such property.

Art. 34. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 to be expended on the Dole Hill road from the residence of Herbert I. Dole to Holden Center.

Art. 35. To see if the town will vote to expend the sum of \$75.00 on the road from the residence of W. T. Rowell to Eastern Ave. road (so-called), said sum to be taken from the sum already raised for repair of roads and bridges.

Art. 36. To see if the town will vote to expend the sum of \$100.00 on the Ryder's Bluff road (so-called) from the residence of Arthur Lear to Holden Center, said sum to be taken from the sum already raised for repair of roads and bridges.

Art. 37. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 to be expended on the

cottage road from the old Holbrook cellar on the Whitcomb road (so-called) to Bennett's landing on Holbrook Pond.

Art. 38. To see whether or not the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 to be paid to the State of Maine Publicity Bureau to be expended and used for advertising the natural resources, advantages and attractions of the State of Maine, in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 5, Section 82, of the Revised Statutes of Maine.

Art. 39. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 to cooperate with the Maine Forest Service and the Federal Government, in the control of the White Pine Blister Rust, in accordance with Revised Statutes, Chapter 11, Secs. 62, 63, 64.

Art. 40. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 to be used to purchase a piece of land of Russell Coffin to enlarge the Clewleyville Cemetery.

Art. 41. To see what sum of money, if any, the town will vote to raise and appropriate for an Honor Roll for members of the armed forces.

Art. 42. To see if the town will vote to buy one snow plow and raise money for the same.

The Selectmen hereby give notice that they will be in session at the above named hall and place of meeting on Monday, the day of said meeting, for the purpose of correcting the list of voters, from 9:30 in the forenoon until the polls are closed.

The State Equalization Fund is apportioned to towns with a tax rate for schools in excess of the average rate for schools in the State. You will see from the above that Holden has fallen below the average for the State, consequently, will not share in Equalization in 1945. This means a loss of \$2,815.00 from 1944 and a consequent increase in appropriation.
