# WARRANT

---

State of Maine

County of Penobscot, ss.

*To J. Manley Sweet, a Constable of the Town of Holden,  
In the County of Penobscot.*

GREETINGS:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Holden, in said County, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to meet at the Holden Town Hall in said town on Monday, the eleventh day of March, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon, then and there to act on the following articles, to wit:

Article 1. To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.

Art. 2. To choose a clerk for the ensuing year.

Art. 3. To hear and act upon the report of the town officers.

Art. 4. To choose selectmen, assessors, and overseers of the poor.

Art. 5. To choose a town treasurer.

Art. 6. To choose a collector of taxes.

Art. 7. To choose a road commissioner.

Art. 8. To choose a member of school committee.

Art. 9. To choose two or more constables.

Art. 10. To choose all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

Art. 11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repair of roads and bridges, for the ensuing year.

Art. 12. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for maintenance of state and state aid roads.

Art. 13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for maintenance of third class roads.

Art. 14. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for State Aid road construction (in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges) under the provisions of Sections 25 and 29, Chap. 20, R. S. 1944, as amended.

Art. 15. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for snow removal.

Art. 16. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of cemeteries.

Art. 17. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for dependent children.

Art. 18. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for support of poor.

Art. 19. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the health department.

Art. 20. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for incidental expenses.

Art. 21. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for pay of town officers.

Art. 22. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for fire protection.

Art. 23. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Maine Municipal Association dues.

Art. 24. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for interest on school fund.

Art. 25. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for common schools.

Art. 26. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for high school tuition.

Art. 27. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for schoolhouse repairs.

Art. 28. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for textbooks and supplies.

Art. 29. To see if the town will raise and appropriate \$50.00 for public health nursing in Holden. Said sum to be expended by the State Bureau of Health for local service.

Art. 30. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to procure temporary loan or loans in anticipation of taxes, for the purpose of paying obligations of the town; such loan or loans to be paid during the current

municipal year out of money raised during said current municipal year by taxation.

Art. 31. To see what sum of money the town will vote to pay various town officers for the ensuing year, and what compensation for labor on public roads and for fighting fire,

Art. 32. To see if the town will fix a date when taxes shall be due and payable and to see if the town will fix a rate of interest to be charged on taxes unpaid after said date.

Art. 33. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to sell and dispose of property acquired by the town by tax process on such terms as they deem advisable, and to execute quit claim deeds for such property.

Art. 34. To see if the town will vote to open the Clewleyville school.

Art. 35. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$655.00 to pay for the snowplow that the town voted to buy at the 1945 March meeting.

Art. 36. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$300.00 to be expended on the road from Woodrow Dorman's residence to the residence of Arthur Lear.

Art. 37. To see if the town will vote to buy the snow plow owned by Harold O. Rogers and priced at \$175.00, and raise money for the same.

Art. 38. To see if the town will vote to buy a sander for sanding town roads and raise money for the same.

Art. 39. To see if the town will vote to use the Townhouse stable as a sand shed for sand to be used on town roads.

Art. 40. To see if the town will vote to expend the sum of \$75.00 on the road from Kingsbury's Corner (so called) to the driveway of Willis Harvey's residence, said sum to be taken from the amount already raised for the repair of Roads and Bridges.

Art. 41. To see if the town will vote to buy a road machine and raise money for same.

Art. 42. To see if the town will vote to install sinks connected with cesspools in all schoolhouses to take care of waste water and raise money for the same. This a recommended by the State Department of Health and Welfare.

Art. 43. To see if the town will vote to accept \$100.00 as a Trust Fund, the income to be used for the perpetual care of the John C. Gray lot.

Art. 44. To see if the town will vote to buy chairs for the dining hall of the town hall and raise money for same.

Art. 45. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$125.00 to be expended on the Holbrook's Pond Road from State Aid Road No. 5, and continuing to the Fred D. Wyman cottage.

Art. 46. To see whether or not the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00) to be paid to the State of Maine Publicity Bureau to be expended and used for advertising the natural resources, advantages and attractions of the State of Maine



in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 80, Section 95, of the Revised Statutes of Maine.

Art. 47. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 to cooperate with the Maine Forest Service and the Federal Government, in the control of the White Pine Blister Rust, in accordance with Revised Statutes, Chapter 11, Secs. 62, 63, 64.

The Selectmen hereby give notice that they will be in session at the above named hall and place of meeting on Monday, the day of said meeting, for the purpose of correcting the list of voters, from 9:30 in the forenoon until the polls are closed.
