REPORT OF SELECTMEN.

The Selectmen of the town of Jay respectfully submit the following report of the financial affairs of the town, from March 1, 1872, to March 1, 1873; also of its resources and liabilities:

The appraised value of the real and personal property liable to taxation on the first day of April, was \$563,541 00; Number of polls taxed, 318. We assessed upon each poll \$3 00, and upon each dollar of valuation $12\frac{1}{2}$ mills, for the following purposes:
