# Report of Selectmen.

THE SELECTMEN of the town of Jay respectfully submit the following Report of the financial affairs of the town, from March 1, 1874, to March 1, 1875; also of its resources and liabilities:

The appraised value of the real and personal property liable to taxation on the first day of April was \$596,868.00. Number of Polls taxed, 310. We assessed upon each poll \$3,00, and upon each dollar of valuation 11 1-3 mills, for the following purposes:
