### School Report

At the beginning of the year, when the school committee met for the purpose of reorganization and transaction of the usual routine of business, Mr. A. W. McKeen was duly elected chairman.

Although the committee have met only a few times during the year, yet they have been able to perform the work as a unit, from the fact that a specified portion of the repairs and general supervision of the school buildings is entrusted to each member, by this division of labor each school building with its necessary repairs has the personal attention of the one in charge.

While it seems almost impossible to obtain the ideal teacher for each school with its varied conditions and requirements, yet we feel that we have met the needs and demands of the majority of the schools in our selection of teachers, many of whom have had special preparation for teaching.

We feel assured that the progress and general improvement of the scholars has been quite satisfactory, which commends the teachers for their methods of instruction and discipline.

During the last year the village and East Fryeburg school houses have been painted, new seats and desks placed in the Toll Bridge school room, and numerous smaller repairs made on other school houses, such as new doors, locks, curtains, etc. As the paint on the outside of nearly all the school houses is in good condition and many of the roofs have been so recently recovered, we would recommend that the greater part of the repair appropriation for the ensuing year be expended on the interior of the school rooms. A little new paint is not only attractive, but sanitary.

We recommend the maintenance of the Smart's Hill and Haley schools for the year ensuing.

As usual the cost of conveying the pupils is large and in view of a possible reduction in this item of expense, we would recommend that the school committee, after making due notice, receive bids and sell conveyance of pupils to the lowest responsible bidder.

Thanking all who have assisted in the general welfare and prosperity of our schools, we recommend that the following sums of

money be voted and raised: Common School, General Fund, three thousand dollars, School Books, three hundred dollars, Repairs on school buildings, three hundred dollars.

## Warrant For Town Meeting

To Charles P. Gray, Constable of the Town of Fryeburg in the County of Oxford, Greeting:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Town of Fryeburg, qualified by law to vote in town affairs to meet at the Town House in said Town on Monday the fifth day of March, A. D., nineteen seventeen, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:

- Article 1. To choose a moderator to preside over said meeting.
- Article 2. To choose a clerk for the ensuing year.
- Article 3. To see if the town will vote to accept the town reports for the year ending February seventeenth, A. D. nineteen seventeen.
- Article 4. To choose three Selectmen, Assessors and Overseers of the Poor for the year ensuing and vote their compensation.
  - Article 5. To choose a Treasurer for the year ensuing.
- Article 6. To choose one member of the School Board for the term of three years. The term of A. W. McKeen expires.
- Article 7. To see how many road commissioners the town will vote to have not exceeding three, and vote their compensation.
  - Article 8. To choose a tax collector and vote his compensation.
- Article 9. To elect one or more fire wards and vote their compensation.
  - Article 10. To choose all other necessary officers.
- Article 11. To see if the town will grant and raise a sum of money to take care of the deficiency in the road account.
- Article 12. To see what sum of money the Town will grant and raise for the support of bridges for the year ensuing.
- Article 13. To see what sum of money the Town will grant and raise for the repair of roads for the year ensuing.
- Article 14. To see if the Town will grant and raise the sum of five hundred dollars to be laid out under the direction of the Selectmen on the "Fish Street Road," so called.

Article 15. To see if the Town will grant and raise the sum of five hundred dollars to continue the work on Smith Street.

Article 16. To see if the Town will grant and raise the sum of five hundred dollars to be laid out in sanding the road between C. P. Smith's and the Stow line.

Article 17. To see if the Town will grant and raise the sum of three hundred dollars to continue the work on the "Weston's Bridge Road," so called.

Article 18. To see what action the Town will take in regard to letting the hauling of the snow rollers to the lowest bidders.

Article 19. To see if the Town will vote to instruct its Selectmen to buy a road machine and if it so votes, to raise a sum of money for this purpose.

Article 20. To see if the Town will authorize its Selectmen to appoint a committee of twelve men, three of whom shall be the Selectmen themselves, the remaining members chosen from the various sections of the Town for the following purposes: to give careful consideration to the several branches of town business and submit recommendations to be printed in the Town's annual report as to the sums of money which should be appropriated for the various purposes.

Article 21. To see if the Town will vote "Yes" or "No" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the Town to State aid as provided in Section 19 of Chapter 25 of the Revised Statute of nineteen sixteen.

Article 22. To see if the Town will appropriate and raise the sum of six hundred dollars for the improvement of the section of State Aid road as outlined in the report of the State Highway Commission in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges. The above amount being the maximum which the Town is allowed to raise under the provisions of Section 18, Chapter 25, of the Revised Statutes of nineteen sixteen.

Article 23. To see if the Town will grant and raise a sum of money required by law for the repairs on the State road and State Aid road.

Article 24. To see if the Town will vote to instruct its Selectmen to enter into an arrangement with the State Highway Commission in patrolling such highways as they may agree upon.

Article 25. To see what sum of money the Town will grant and raise for the support of schools for the year ensuing.

Article 26. To see what sum of money the Town will grant and raise for the support of the poor for the year ensuing.

Article 27. To see what sum of money the Town will grant and raise for the current expenses for the year ensuing.

Article 28. To see what sum of money the Town will grant and raise for the purchase of school books for the year ensuing.

Article 29. To see what sum of money the Town will grant and raise for the repairs of school houses for the year ensuing.

Article 30. To see what sum of money the Town will grant and raise for the tuition of scholars who attend the Academy.

Article 31. To see if the Town will vote to pay the School Board for their services and if so how much they shall be paid.

Article 32. To see what sum of money the Town will grant and raise for Grover Post G. A. R.

Article 33. To see if the Town will vote to maintain schools in the Haley and Smart's Hill school districts.

Article 34. To see what action the Town will take in regard to the browntail moth question and provide means therefor.

Article 35. To see whether or not the Town will vote to accept the sum of one hundred dollars bequeathed it in trust under the will of Mrs. Augusta Ward the income thereof to be applied to the perpetual care of Lot No. 33 of the Pine Grove cemetery.

Article 36. To see if the Town will vote to authorize its selectmen to hire a sum of money not exceeding two thousand dollars to pay bills if needed.

Article 37. To see if the Town will vote to authorize its superintending schools committee to join with either or any of the following towns, viz: Brownfield, Denmark, Lovell, Sweden, Stow, or such other town or towns as it may deem expedient for the purpose of employing a superintendent of schools in accordance with the provisions of the Revised Statutes of nineteen hundred and sixteen.

Article 38. To act on any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The selectmen give notice that they will be in session for the purpose of correcting the list of voters in said town and hearing and desiding upon the application of persons claiming to have their names entered upon said list, at the Town House at nine o'clock in the forenoon on the day of said meeting.
