WARRANT FOR TOWN MEETING

To Herbert J. Rogers, a constable of the town of Jonesport, in the County of Washington, and State of Maine:

Greetings:-

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Town of Jonesport, qualified by law to vote in town affairs to assemble at Jonesport Opera House, in said town, on Monday, the 12th. day of March, 1928 at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:

- 1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said Meeting.
- 2. To choose a Town Clerk.
- 3. To act on the report of the Selectmen, Superintendent of Schools, Peabody Memorial Library, Overseers of the Poor, and any other reports.
- 4. To see what action the Town will take in regarding to having a Traffic Officer, and raise money for same.
- 5. To choose three Selectmen.
- 6. To choose three Assessors to make up valuation only and hire one person to assess the taxes.
- 7. To choose three Assessors.
- 8. To choose a Town Treasurer.
- 9. To vote the fees of the Collector of Taxes.
- 10. To choose a Collector of Taxes.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote "yes" or "no" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the Town to State Aid, as provide for in Sec. 19, of Chapter 25 of the Revised Statutes.
- 12. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$533. for the improvement of the Section of the State Aid Road as outlined in the report of the State Highway Commission, in addition to the

sum regularly raised for the care of highways and bridges; this amount being necessary as per provision of Sec. 18. Chapter 25 of the Revised Statutes.

- 13. To see what sum the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for advertising our natural resources, advantages and attractions, under the provisions of the Revised Statutes of Maine, the same to be expended by the Maine Development Asso.
- 14. To raise money for the Library for the ensuing year.
- 15. To elect a Fire Inspector, and raise money for same.
- 16. To elect the Necessary members of the School Committee.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to have a Patrolman for the roads.
- 18. To elect a Road Commissioner or instruct the Selectmen to appoint.
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise money for a 4th. of July Celebration or on account of Centtenial year 1932.
- 19A. To see what action the Town will take in regard to building or buying a Community Hall and raise money for same.
- 20. To see what action the Town will take with regard to care of fire engine, and to appropriate money for the same.
- 21A. To see what action the Town will take in raising money for Memorial Day.
- 21. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to hire, in anticipation of taxes, such sums of money as may be needed for the ensuing year.
- 22. To raise money for Snow Bills.
- 23. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the support of schools including teachers; wages and board, fuel, janitors' service, conveyance, tuition, and board of pupils, text books, reference books and school supplies for desk or

labratory use.

- 24. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for school repairs, painting and equipment.
- 25. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for school committee and office expense.
- 26. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for insurance, light and power.
- 27. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for compulsory education.
- 28. To raise money for Highways and Bridges.
- 29. To raise money for Board of Health.
- 30. To raise money for support of Poor.
- 31. To see what action the Town will take in regard to maintaining the Poor Farm or instruction Selectmen to lease if necessary.
- 32. To raise money for Town Debt and Interest.
- 33. To raise money for Town Expense.
- 34. To raise money for Abatements.
- 35. To raise money for Repairs of Sidewalks.
- 36. To raise money for Sealer of Weights and Measures.
- 37. To see whether the Town will vote to raise a sum of money, and if so, how much, towards defraying the expense of combating tuberculosis in Washington County, said sum to be expended by the Washington County Anti-Tuberculosis Association.
- 38. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the road from Loon Point to the Main road near Greenwood Cemetary.
- 39. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the road from Otis White's to the Addison line.
- 40. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of Two hundred dollars for the purpose of repairs on third class roads and cutting bushes on state aid and state roads.
- 41. To see what action the Town will take in regard to appropriating money for dependent children and raise money for same.
- 42. To see if the Town desires to vote to accept

the terms of the so-called Workmen's Compensation Act, being Chapter 50 of the Revised Statutes, and raise money for same.

42A. To see what action the Town will take in regard to damming Donovan's creek, Cross Cove creek and Beaver Dam brook and raise money for same.

43. To see what action the Town will take in regard to appointing a committee of twelve men, to aid in estimating appropriations, and to assist the Selectmen, in all Town business.

43A. To choose Surveyors of wood, lumber, bark and all other necessary town Officers.

The Selectmen will be in session at the Fire House on Thursday, Friday and Saturday, March 8, 9 and 10th., preceeding Town Meeting, for the purpose of correcting the list of voters.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Superintendent of School Committee and Citizens of Jonesport:

I have the honor of submitting a report of the public schools covering an itemized statement of the resources and the expenditures in the various departments, our accomplishments during the past year and the needs of the schools during the year at hand. In this report I shall endeavor to point out some difficulties we are laboring under with the hope that the same may result in a more sympathetic understanding between parents and teachers and school officials.

We believe that the schools have been operated on a sound financial basis. It has been the purpose of your Superintendent School Committee Superintendent to keep abreast of the times, yet to give due consideration to the things that are fundamental. Our total receipts for all school purposes amounts to \$20,110.57 and our total expenditures \$18,614.84, leaving a balance amounts to It should be noted that this rather large balance is due in part at least to the fact that we have operated the schools for a period of 34 weeks instead of 36 out of the funds made available for the past year. In other words, we owe for the operating expenses of the schools during these two weeks. This cost amounts to about \$800.00, which would reduce the balance to \$695.73. We have two small overdrafts, one being in the school repairs account amounting to \$35.98, and the other in the insurance account amounting to 29.00. overdraft in the school repair account is due principally to the extensive repairs on the furances. Last winter we burned soft coal in the furances at the High School and the Cove Grammar building with disasterous results. It was necessary

to overhaul these three furances prior to the opening of the schools this fall. In the insurance account the overdraft was due to an increase in the insurance rates. Under the old rate this policy cost slightly less than \$75.00 and under the new rate cost \$114.00.

Our teaching force as a whole is composed of a loyal, competent and efficient group of men and As stated in a previous report, one of our women. greatest obstacles to progress in our schools is the great overturn in teachers each year. We obliged to take on to the force each year many inexperienced teachers due to our inability to wages sufficiently large to attract teachers of more experience. If these inexperienced teachers who come to us demonstrate their ability to get on well with the work, they look for a more remunerative position elsewhere, and usually find it. intendent is then obliged to look up another experienced teacher. Obviously, this makes our school practice and training schools by which train teachers for other more favored Communities. We hope to be able to build up our teaching force each year by being able to retain the services those teachers who render efficient service. vision is made in the budget, submitted in the latter part of this report, to counter act this cause.

Our teaching force at present is as follows: (See table on next page)

75 per cent of the high school teachers are new to the positions which they now hold, and over 58 per cent of the elementary teachers are new to the positions which they now hold.

We had 432 pupils registered in all of our schools during the fall term, and of this No. 104 or 24 per cent of the numebr registered had perfect attendance. Our percentage of attendance for the full term was 91 4-10 per cent. It should be noted that the enrollment in the high school is the largest in the history of the school, there being 106 pupils at present or an increase of 9 over 25 per cent of the total number of pupils are registered in the school, which is a relatively high percentage, 33 1-3 per cent being the maximum percentage providing all pupils continue their education to the completion of the high school grades. Some pupils have been leaving school prior to the completion of the eighth grade, or at the time when the compulsory eduction law ceases to become effective. Many pupils drop out at the close of the eighth grade. Under the new compulsory education law that was passed at the last session of the legislature it will be impossible

for pupils to drop out of school prior to the copletion of the eighth grade. This new law makes it compulsory for pupils to continue school until the completion of the eighth grade or until the sixteenth anniversary of his birth, thus setting up as a minmum education the completion of the elementary grades. Previously the minimum was the completion of the first six grades.

Occassionally it happens that a pupil is not fitted to persue a high school education because of physical disability or mental retardation. Again, it happens occasionally that some pupils persue a high school education for want of something else to do. These pupils qualify as to physical and mental equipment. They belong to a class who lack ambition, detest work and perfer to follow the line of least resistance. They come to high school expecting to find an education. A school system has no place for this type of pupil. It is impossible to secure an education without labor. Acquiring an education is analogous to a business enterprise in which one gets out of it no more than he puts into it.

Our high school records reveal some interesting facts in this connection. We have seven pupils in our high school at present who are making a complete failure of the work. These pupils have not passed and subject during the first eighteen weeks of this year. These pupils for the most part belong to the class of which I have just referred. There are several pupils who have failed in three subjects during the first half of this school year. These pupils almost without exception have failed because of a lack of effort and application to work.

There are some factors, as I see it, which contribute to this cause. In the first place, there is a lack of responsibility on the part of the pupil. There is a tendency on the part of many of us, as parents, to releive our children of responsibility. We edu-

cate them in the belief that it enchances their epportunity for greater service to mankind and a more wholesome enjoyment of life. They are too often permitted to exercise their own judgment on matters of great importance. Every child of intermediate grade age and up should be required to spend a reasonable amount of time each evening in paration of his work for the day following. a good habit and should be established early in life. This makes it more difficult for the child to become interested in out-side activities. loitering stores, walking the streets and night prowling. of these outside activities have a tendency turb the work of the school and give rise to idleness. Sleep and rest are very essential to the growing A certain amount of recreation is necessary but should not be indulged in to the extent that it lessens interest in things that are fundamental to a successful life.

Outbuildings and wood sheds were built and attached to the school buildings at West Jonesport and the Cove. All school buildings now comply with the requirements of the State Law with respect to sanitation and toilets, with the exception of the building at Sealand. Provision is made school budget under repairs to take care of We have added one new typewriter to our equipment in addition to making one exchange. We now have five machines as follows: two Underwoods, two Royals, and one L. C. Smith, Provision is made under the repair and equipment account to provide one new machine and to make one exchange during the new year. We were obliged to purchase a number of tablet arm chairs for recitation rooms at the high school. Many new editions of text books have been puschased this past year dition to some library and reference books. New Recent European Histories were purchased for use in

in high school. New latin books for use by the freshmen were introduced the same being "Elementary Latin" by Smith. Some new editions were purchaseed for use in the Commercial department. geographies were purchased for use in the fourth grades throughout all schools in Town, the book be-"How And Where We Live" bv We purchased some new Readers for use Grammar Grades. the same being "Junior Literature" School bv Bolenius. new editions on supplementary reading were introduced. A 10 volume set of reference books. "Comption's Pictured Enclclopedia" were purchased. A set of six volumes of child literature including the great masterpieces of literature of the Bookhouse" was purchased. A great many teachers books were purchased, some being of a professional nature, and some being desk copies for use in supplementing the regular texts.

It will be necessary to do considerable painting this year. We have three school buildings that require painting on the exterior and some interior painting as well. This is the year when most of our insurance policies on the school buildings become due. For a more detailed account of our needs for the new year I solicit your very careful sideration of the School Budget submitted later in this report.

Arrangements have been made with Wm. Underwood Co. of West Jonesport and R. B. & C. G. Stevens of Jonesport to give one long blast of the factory whistle at 8 o'clock on mornings when weather conditions do not warrant keeping school. One long blast at 8 o'clock A. M. will be given as a signal of no school for the day.

In concluding this my eighth report as superintendent of schools I wish to take this opportunity to express my appreciation of the interest and support rendered me by the citizens of Jonesport for the improvement of the schools for our children. I also wish to acknowledge my appreciation of the cooperation of the teaching staff, and the loyalty of the members of the Committee.
