WARRANT FOR TOWN MEETING

To Herbert J. Rogers, a Constable of the Town of Jonesport, in the County of Washington, and State of Maine.

Greeting:-

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Town of Jonesport, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at Jonesport Opera House, in said town, on Monday, the 11th day of March, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:-

1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.
2. To choose a Town Clerk.
3. To act on the report of the Selectmen, Superintendent of Schools, Peabody Memorial Library, Overseers of the Poor, and any other reports.
4. To see what action the town will take in regard to having Traffic Officers, and raise money for same.
5. To choose three Selectmen.
6. To choose three Assessors to make up valuations, only, and hire one person to assess the taxes.
7. To choose three Assessors.
8. To choose a Town Treasurer.
9. To vote the fees of the Collector of Taxes.
10. To choose a Collector of Taxes.
11. To see if the Town will vote "yes" or "no" on the question of Appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the Town to State Aid, as provided for in Sec. 19, of Chapter 25 of the Revised Statutes.
12. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$533. for the improvement of the Section of the State Aid Road as outlined in the report of the State Highway Commission, in addition to the sum regularly raised for the care of highways and bridges; this amount being necessary as per provision of Section 18, Chapter 25 of the Revised Statutes.
13. To see what sum the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for advertising our natural resources, advantages and attractions under the provisions of the Revised

Statutes of Maine, the same to be expended by the Maine Development Association.

14. To raise money for the Library for the ensuing year.

15. To elect a Fire Inspector and raise money for same.

16. To elect the Necessary members of the School Committee.

17. To see if the Town will vote to have a Patrolman for the roads.

18. To elect a Road Commissioner or instruct the Selectmen to appoint.

19. To see if the Town will vote to raise money on account of Centennial year, 1932.

20. To see what action the Town will take in regard to care of fire engine, and to appropriate money for the same.

20a. To see what action the Town will take in raising money for Memorial Day.

21. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to hire, in anticipation of taxes, such sums of money as may be needed for the ensuing year.

22. To raise money for Snow Bills.

23. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the support of schools including teachers' wages and board, fuel, janitors' service, conveyance, tuition, and board of pupils, text books, reference books and school supplies for desk or laboratory use.

24. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for school repairs, painting and equipment.

25. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for school committee and office expense.

25a. To see what action the Town will take in regard to appropriating money to build one-half of concrete sidewalk in front of the Later Day Saint Church.

26. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for insurance, light and power.

26a. To see what action the Town will take in regard to putting one light at Emery Farnsworth's factory, one light at Leon Smith's, one light near Oliver Church's and one light on the Indian River road.

27. To see what action the Town will take in regard to raising money for Compulsory education.

28. To raise money for Highways and Bridges.

29. To raise money for Board of Health.

29a. To see what action the Town will take regarding raising money for the Camp Ground and raise money for same.

30. To choose three Overseers of the Poor.

30a. To raise money for support of Poor.

31. To see what action the Town will take in regard to maintaining the Poor Farm or instruct Selectmen to lease if necessary.

32. To raise money for Town Debt and Interest.

33. To raise money for Town Expense.

34. To raise money for Abatements.

35. To raise money for Repairs of Sidewalks.

36. To raise money for Sealer of Weights and Measures.

37. To see whether the Town will vote to raise a sum of money and if so, how much, towards defraying the expense of combating tuberculosis in Washington County, said sum to be expended by the Washington County Anti-Tuberculosis Association.

38. To see what action the Town will take in voting to discontinue road from Addison Town Line to Jonesport Main road.

39. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of Two Hundred Dollars for the purpose of repairs on third class roads and cutting bushes on state aid and state roads.

40. To see what action the Town will take in regard to appropriating money for dependent children and raise money for same.

41. To see if the Town desires to vote to accept the terms of the so-called Workmen's Compensation Act, being Chapter 50 of the Revised Statutes, and raise money for same.

42. To see what action the Town will take in regard to appointing a Committee of twelve men, to act in conjunction with the Selectmen in estimating appropriations and all other Town business.

43. To choose Surveyors of wood, lumber, bark and all other necessary town officers.

The Selectmen will be in session at the Fire House on Thursday, Friday and Saturday, March 7, 8 and 9th preceeding Town Meeting, for the purpose of correcting the list of voters.

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REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens of Jonesport:

In accordance with established law it is my pleasure to present to you my ninth report of your public schools. As usual this report deals with a resume of what has been done during the year aided to some extent by tabulated statistics, and some changes which I think should be made in the system.

The efficiency of a school system is dependent to a very large extent upon the personell of its teaching force. For this reason every effort should be made from year to year to improve the personell of our teaching force. Professional fitness by reason of training in our normal schools and colleges together with successful teaching experience constitutes an essential foundation for teaching. The maximum efficiency of class room work is generally obtained in a school system where there is not a large turnover in teachers each year. Teachers who are well prepared by reason of professional training and successful teaching experience should be secured when possible for every school. An effort should be made to retain the services of these teachers for a period of years. Our present staff of teachers for the most part meet these requirements to a fair degree, at least commensurate with the salaries which they receive.

We employ sixteen teachers, four in the high school and twelve in the elementary grades. In the high school all teachers were retained this last year, there being no turnover; in the grades eight teachers were retained or a turnover of four. This I believe is the smallest turnover of teachers during my experience as a superintendent. The results of this fact are very much in evidence when we consider the work accomplished in the schools with that of the preceeding year. This year there has been a greater degree of familiarity with subjectmatter and methods of presenting the same. There is a greater degree of under-

standing between teacher and pupils, and between teacher and parents. Much more emphasis has been placed on the fundamentals of the curriculum.

This year an attempt is being made to stress reading and allied subjects throughout the State. Unusual emphasis has been placed on this phase of our work from the first grade of the elementary schools to the seniors of high school. At the beginning of the fall term standardized silent reading tests were given to all the grades from the second to the twelfth grades inclusive. By means of these tests we were able to compare the reading ability of our pupils grade for grade with the standards established by the author of these tests. The results of this diagnosis was very gratifying in some instances while in others rather discouraging. These tests made it possible for us to locate wherein our weaknesses lie in reading. From the results of these tests we are able to pick the pupils who show an apparent weakness in their ability to comprehend what they read. Incidentally comprehension is without doubt the most important factor of reading. Some pupils are able to read orally very well and with a rapid rate yet fail to understand what they read, thus failing in the primary purpose of reading. One reads for the sake of information and unless he succeeds in "thought getting", reading is of little value to him. These tests have been of great value to us in helping the teachers to locate the pupil's inability to comprehend what he reads.

Having made this diagnosis of reading we have set about to apply the remedy as far as time has permitted. Silent reading has been stressed, word meanings emphasized and speed or reading rate increased. We have tried to create a desire for reading on the part of the pupils by bringing to them some of the best and most interesting books available for youth. Each school is provided with a library table containing some very carefully selected books. Stories dealing with adventure, character building and good citizenship have been made available. Parents may assist us in this work by encouraging the reading habit during the child's leisure hours at home. It is impossible to over-emphasize the importance of the development of the read-

ing habit when properly supervised. Invariably the child who acquires the reading habit finds little difficulty in his variety of school subjects.

An attempt is being made to conduct a survey of all schools in Washington County. This survey takes into account the work of all the subjects offered in our elementary schools. Our schools in this town have participated in this survey. Stamford Achievement Tests have been given to the pupils of grades five to eight inclusive and the Detroit Reading Tests to the pupils of grades two to four inclusive. The results of these tests have not yet been fully tabulated. The results when fully tabulated will enable us to compare our work with that of the other towns of the county.

Health education has been stressed in our schools this past year. This work has been conducted under the Modern Health Crusade plan whereby the children perform certain health chores daily. Each pupil is supplied with a chore card on which he checks daily under supervision of the teacher the chores he has performed. These chores stress cleanliness as regards the care of the body, wholesome foods, proper exercise and the correct amount of sleep. If all the children of a school perform a certain number of these chores for a period of twelve weeks the school is awarded a National Pennant. The schools of this Union as a part of Washington County stood first in the number of pennants won.

Little need be said concerning the exhibition which was presented in the Opera House February 20th. There is much good yet to come from this experience. This will have a stimulating effect upon the work of the schools. It has already aroused a greater degree of enthusiasm and interest. \$50.00 was realized after the expenses were deducted. This money is to be used to purchase playground equipment for the schools. We have felt the need of playgrounds for a long time. Every progressive town has not failed to provide suitable play grounds. It will be necessary to make suitable preparation of the school grounds before purchas-

ing playground equipment. Provision is made in the school budget to take care of this work.

We painted the Cove Primary, the West Jonesport Primary and the West Jonesport Grammar school buildings this past summer. Judging from the comment of a great many of the citizens I think we may conclude that it was a job well done. An up-to-date outbuilding was built and connected to the school building at Sealand, also the windows were rearranged so as to light the room from two sides only thus standardizing the building in this respect.

The high school building was wired for electric lights from funds made available from the Repair account. This seemed absolutely necessary as on dull days it was impossible to see to study in certain parts of the room.

It will be necessary to shingle one side of the roof of the Kelley's Point school this summer. The bell decks at the West Jonesport Primary and the Kelley's Point schools will have to be repaired. It will be necessary to do considerable work on the Upper Bay school. The Upper Bay the Cove Grammar school and the interior of the high school building will have to be painted another summer. For further information concerning the needs of the schools I ask your careful indulgence of the school budget submitted with this report.

Finally, I wish to thank the teachers who have labored faithfully in the performance of their duties, also to acknowledge the support of the citizens of Jonesport who have made it possible to carry on the work with the youth of this town.
