## Report of the Superintendent of Schools

To the Honorable Chairman and Members of the School Committee  
of Lubec:

Gentlemen—

In submitting to you my report upon the condition of the schools of Lubec, I wish first of all to extend to you my sincere thanks for the never-failing support you have given me during the time in which I have been your Superintendent. I also wish to express to the people of Lubec my appreciation of and thanks for the many courtesies they have extended to me during my term of office.

The schools of Lubec as a whole are good, and compare favorably with those of other towns in Maine. There are, however, some ways in which the system can be greatly improved, and these I will mention under separate headings.

## Sanitary Conditions

The most important consideration of course, is the health of the pupils. Under the present conditions at the large building in the village, the health of pupils, teachers and the community at large is jeopardized. During the past year conditions have been so bad that it has been necessary to close these schools several times, as it was impossible for either teachers or scholars to stand the stench arising from the outbuildings. This matter should be attended to at once, as the health of the whole village is endangered by the present condition.

## Attendance

That there are more pupils in the town than ever before is evidenced by the fact that Lubec received from the state this year the sum of \$263.67 more than in the previous year, the amount being \$3361.62, which is \$361.62 more than the town raised for its common schools.

The greater part of this increase in pupils has been in the village, with the result that the rooms there have been overcrowded. New desks have been put in so far as possible, but with the present room it has been impossible to properly accommodate all, some pupils having to sit at the teacher's desk, while a number of desks have three pupils each. At present there are three grades, comprising 105 pupils in the Intermediate room, and 3 grades, comprising 88 pupils, in the Grammar room. Each room has only two teachers, and it does not require very keen perception to see that under these conditions good work is impossible.

I would recommend that the northern half of the lower part of Columbian Hall be fitted up for school purposes and that grade 6 from the Intermediate room and grade 7 from the Grammar room be combined and placed therein. This will necessitate the employment of two more teachers, but the money so expended will give good returns. If these changes can be made Lubec can have a school system which will be a credit to the town.

## Books

The books in the outlying schools are in very bad condition. So far as possible with the amount appropriated, I have replaced these with good books, but there is still a great deal to be done in this respect. The appropriation should be increased so that every child may have a decent book. I would recommend that \$500 be raised for books this year, as with a less sum it will be impossible to properly equip the schools. Only a few minor changes in text books have been made during the year, nearly the whole appropriation having been used to replace worn out books.

## Supplies

Only one of the outlying schools has a map. This is not as it should be. It is impossible to teach geography properly without the aid of maps and globes. The appropriation of \$125 is barely sufficient to cover the cost of the supplies needed to carry on the other work, and leaves nothing with which to purchase maps. I would recommend that \$250 be raised this year in order that the out of town schools may have proper equipment.

## Repairs

The schoolhouses at Nos. 10 and 11, West Lubec, have been put in thorough repair during the past year and are now in first class con-



dition. The newly remodeled building at the Ridge makes an ideal schoolhouse. At Nos. 5 East and 5 West the school houses are in very bad condition and should be thoroughly repaired this year. At No. 2 East the building is entirely unfit for school purposes, and I would recommend an appropriation for a new building in this district.

In order to properly carry on the schools for the ensuing year I would recommend that at least \$3500 be raised for common schools. A glance at the financial statement will show that this amount will be necessary to keep the schools on a proper basis.

In conclusion I wish to extend my thanks to the teachers for their untiring efforts and to express my appreciation of the good work they have done—in some cases under the most trying circumstances. I would impress on the minds of the parents that they are themselves largely responsible for the success or failure of a school, and that it is only through co-operation of parent and teacher that the best results can be obtained.
