## REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF CEMETERY.

The burials for the past year have numbered thirty-one. The Receiving Tomb, recently re-built, has proved satisfactory in every way, sufficient in capacity and convenient of access. Under the care and labors of Mr. J. M. Hadley, the walks and avenues have been neatly kept. Grading and drainage have of necessity received proper attention in many parts of the yard, and as far as possible, unused portions have been utilized or prepared for future requirements.

In report of last year attention was called to the limited grounds of our cemetety. How shall we meet the demands for new burial lots?

The cemetery of Machias is, perhaps, conducted unlike most burial grounds, whether private or incorporated.

It is the property of the town. It makes no "conveyance" of its soil or real estate. It receives no "consideration" or payment for a lot, but simply assigns to the head of a family (who must be a legal resident of the town) a place of burial FREE OF CHARGE with the expectation however that the lot shall not be neglected, but be suitably cared for, by the person or family to whom it is assigned.

With our annual death rate exceeding 6 per cent, how are we to afford space for future interments, except by enlarging the present grounds or purchasing land elsewhere?

### CITIZENS OF MACHIAS :

As in former years there is little to report save progress. The regular work of the schools has been prosecuted with constancy and faithfulness and with the effort to improve. Changes in attendance have necessitated the opening of another room at West Kennebec and the closing of Rawson Primary.

Apart from the minor repairs required from year to year it was deemed necessary to paint the Rawson and Hemenway buildings one coat. A second coat will be applied the coming season. The room opened in Kennebec was furnished with single primary desks and the stairway which in all these years has been a menace to life and limb has been made both commodious and safe.

The heating apparatus at Libby Hall which in extreme weather failed to give satisfaction was subjected to treatment and defects remedied. It is now believed that entirely satisfactory results will be obtained.

## REPORT OF FIRE WARDENS.

To the Selectmen and Citizens of the town of Machias your Fire Wardens submit the following report for the year.

The year just passed has not been an exceedingly strenuous one in the Fire Department, although there has been eight alarms rung in. Every alarm has been answered with promptness and willingness by the members and almost a full company has been present each time. At four of the fires water was turned on and Extinguishers used at one.

New hose, hose cart, lanterns, spanners, pump and hose repairing kit, have been purchased which practically equips us for all purposes. We can say that this Department is as well equipped as any of its size in the State and better than some larger towns. We think that outside of a few minor articles there need be nothing bought during the coming year.

The Fire Alarm System has been extended considerably and we would advocate a still further extension. The alarm as it stands now is of great protection in the night time. There are six boxes and situated as follows:

Box No. 2, At Engine House, corner Broadway and Court streets.

“ “ 3, On pole in front of Clinton Leighton's residence on Water street.

“ “ 4, On Ames' store.

“ “ 5, On pole in front Mrs. Amos Heaton's residence, Elm street.

“ “ 6, On pole in front of Henry McIntosh's residence, Dublin street.

“ “ 32, In Telephone Central Office.

These boxes have a glass in the side of each, which can be broken to obtain the key. In case of fire, after unlocking the box, the party should ring one long ring, then after a short pause ring the number on the outside of the box. The number on the box should be repeated two or three times. This will alarm no less than fourteen men in different sections of the town and will inform them which box has been rung. Parties having Telephones can communicate with Central Office and the Operator will ring the alarm.

- Alarm No. 8, Stephen Saddler, residence, 1 P. M., Feb. 14, '06. Damage considerable. Three Hydrant streams used. 27 men answered. Caused by defective stove pipe.

During the year both companies have held 12 monthly meetings and from three to four drills.

On July 29, '05, Mr. L. B. Wilder tendered his resignation as Fire Warden and it was accepted by the selectmen.

We feel the condition of this Department is such as to warrant a cut in the appropriation for the coming year.

## BOARD OF HEALTH.

The Board of Health respectfully calls the attention of the people of this town to the serious condition existing here by reason of lack of proper sewerage facilities and recommends that some action be taken with regard to the same.

Last summer the attention of the Board was called to the fact that extending from the corner of Charles St. and Broadway to the old Universalist Chapel and thence to Main St., there existed the line of an old underground brook, into which many drains ran including drains from the County buildings and both Hotel stables beside drainage from many private lots.

The condition of this natural drain at the old Chapel was very bad. Under the direction of the Selectmen a survey of this line was made by Mr. H. R. Taylor and it was found that a sewer 1600 feet in length following the line of the brook would drain a very large number of lots.

It might and probably would be more economical to follow natural drainage courses such as this in putting in sewers than to follow street lines. That however is not a matter for us. Our only concern is that something be done with regard to sewerage as we are satisfied that at present the large number of lots relying upon surface drainage alone coupled with the increasing number of private cess pools constitutes a menace to health which should not be allowed to continue a day longer than necessary.

We recommend immediate attention to the sewerage question.
