

Report of Superintendent of Schools.

Members of the School Committee and Citizens of Machias:

I herewith submit my third report as Superintendent of Schools

The year has been a successful one and there has been

a growth in real school spirit and efficiency.

The function of the public schools is to make good citizens, or at least to contribute largely to that result. Our schools a train punctuality, regularity, work and obedience and our course of study is shaped with the purpose of instilling into the minds of the pupils, the best thoughts of the best people.

There have been many changes in the teaching force this year—one great change. #The vacancies were filled as follows: Grammar school, Miss Mary McDonald. Rawson Grammar, Miss Etta McDonald. Harding Primary, Miss Gladys Stone. Preble Primary, Miss Agnes O'Donnell. West Kennebec Primary, Miss Florence Mealy. I am glad to commend the good work of the new teachers also to express my appreciation of the work of the teachers, who are not new in the schools.

Most of the schools have an Improvement League. The High and Grammar have had two "Art-Exhibits" during the past year, using the proceeds for the purchase of pictures for their schoolrooms.

A few necessary repairs were made on the different school buildings and at present they are in very good condition.

Soon will occur the Annual promotions. The school work is arranged so as to require not only study but regular attendance throughout the entire school year. Our pupils must be taught in classes and most of the classes are large. A day's absence of any pupil is a loss to that pupil and a long continued absence necessarily leaves a pupil far behind. There are always a few by nature slower than others, and for these it may be desirable to repeat a year's work, but for the majority of our pupils the work is adapted to their capacity.

There have been only a few cases of truancy but when called upon our Truant Officer is always ready to assist in this part of the work.

In closing I desire to thank the Town officers and par-

ents for helpful sympathy and co-operation with teachers and school officials; the teachers for their continued patience, and untiring zeal in their labor, which is so full ot discouragements. I also desire to express my grantfude to the School Committee for their helpfullness to me and the schools, for interest taken and work done by them without recompense and usually without thanks.

The return of the Warrant calling the Town Meeting for March 22nd, 1909 was found to be defective so that no legal meeting could be held under it and it became necessary to issue a Warrant calling the annual Town Meeting on Monday, March 29th. This Warrant contains the following articles:

ARTICLE 1st: To choose a Moderator.

ARTICLE 2nd: To choose a Town Clerk, Selectmen, Assessors, Overseer of Poor, Member of School Board, Town Agent, Collector of Taxes, Town Treasurer, Road Commissioner, and all other Town Officers required by the laws of the State of Maine.

ARTICLE 3rd: To raise such sums of money as may be necessary or deemed expedient for the support of Poor, making Roads, for support of Schools and other municipal expenses for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE 4th: To see if the town will vote "yes" or "no" upon the adoption of the provisions of Chapter 112 of the public laws of 1907 relating to the appropriation of money necessary to entitle the town to state aid for highways for the year 1909.

ARTICLE 5th: To see if the Town will raise, appropriate and set apart for the permanent improvement of the State Road within the town such sum of money as is contemplated and directed by Section 5, of Chapter 112 of the public laws of Maine for the year 1907, being the sum of \$144.

ARTICLE 6th: To see what action the town will take in regard to repairing or rebuilding the northerly end of the Old Bridge.

ARTICLE 7th: To see if the town wil! expend \$1,000 in constructing additional gravel walks and raise money for the same.

ARTICLE 8th: To see if the town will raise \$400.00 for Free Reading Room.

ARTICLE 9th: To see if the town will raise \$100, for the Machias Band, said Band giving concerts from time to time during the season.

ARTICLE 10: To see if the town will raise \$100, to repair the town landing.

ARTICLE 11th: To see if the town will vote to locate a hydrant on Broadway between Chas. Gardner's house and the railroad bridge.
