REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

Machias, Maine, March 27, 1933

To the Board of Education:

In compliance with the requirements of the law, I submit herewith my report as Superintendent of your schools.

First of all, I wish to say that I have been asked to make this report as brief as possible and for that reason I have omitted the High School Principal's and Music Teacher's reports.

The teaching staff of the elementary schools remained the same this year as last with the exception of one. Mrs. Winifred Bryant Smith resigned at the end of the winter term and her position was filled by Miss Geneva Davis. All the teachers have shown a fine spirit of cooperation and have given conscientious effort to their tasks.

In the High School we found it necessary to make some changes, due to the resignations of Miss Mowry and Mr. Sezak, and to the increased enrollment.

The following teachers were engaged. Miss Ethel Thomas, Mr. Albert Dekin, and Mr. Maurice Perkins, Jr. These new teachers have entered into the work with fine enthusiasm. I am pleased to report that under the able leadership and administration of the Principal, Mr. Additon, the high school has made fine progress in scholarship and spirit. This

is shown by the excellent attendance we have had and by the records of our graduates.

Attendance in all the schools has been very fine during the past year, with very few cases of truancy. This shows fine cooperation on the part of parents and teachers.

The janitor work has been performed in the usual efficient manner.

Health work has been carried on as in past years. The County Nurse has inspected the schools and with the cooperation of the doctors and dentists has found many children entitled to seven-point pins. At the field day last spring Miss Phyllis Johnson of Grade Seven won the cup for highest, individual score.

Music under a supervisor has been continued this year. Mrs. Parlin resigned because of ill health and Mrs. Alice Sennett was engaged to take her place. She devotes two days of the week to this work.

This year we have made as drastic economy in books and supplies as we possibly could. The following comparison of figures shows what we have done.

However, this is poor economy in the long run for the time is coming in a few years when the book account, at least, will be more than doubled because of wear and tear. The average life of a book is three years.

This year we have given particular attention to writing and comprehensive reading in the elementary schools. In writing we have stressed the four S's speed, space, size and shape. In reading we have not only worked for ability to read orally but also to understand and appreciate what they have read. Mrs. Gladys Spearin, Field Agent for Rural Education, and an expert in reading has given demonstrations in our schools and has also spoken at one teachers meeting. I feel that we have accomplished much in these subjects but of course it takes years to see any real results.

The boilers were inspected this year and pronounced safe. Only those repairs that were absolutely necessary were made. The fire around the high school chimney caused considerable damage, but of course was paid for by the insurance companies. This year the Kennebec building needs shingling and the ceiling in the upper room needs painting or washing. The inside walls of the Hemenway and Rawson buildings should be painted and the canvas roof on the High School should have a coat of paint.

WARRANT FOR TOWN MEETING

STATE OF MAINE

To GROVER K. COFFIN, One of the constables of the Town of Machias:

IN THE NAME OF THE STATE OF MAINE, you are hereby required to warn and notify such of the inhabitants of said Town of Machias as are Qualified to vote in town affairs to assemble at high school auditorium in said Machias on the twenty seventh Inst. at nine o'clock and thirty minutes in the forenoon, to act on the following named articles to wit:

Article 1. To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.

Article 2. To choose a Town clerk, Selectmen, Assessors, Overseers of poor, Town treasurer, Auditor, Member of the Superintendent School Committee for the term of three years, one fire commissioner for the term of three years, collector of taxes, road commissioner and all other Town officers required by law of the State of Maine.

Article 3. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary or deemed expedient for the support of the Schools, Poor, Fire department, Water service, Street lighting, school books, apparatus, appliances, repairs of Town buildings, and all other legal purposes and Town charges for the ensuing year.

RECOMMENDATION: That the following sums be raised under Article 3:

The reduction in the appropriation for Discount on taxes would require that the usual discount be reduced to 3% in July and 2% in October.

Article 4. To see whether the town will vote "Yes" or "No", on the question of raising and appropriating money necessary to entitle the town to State Aid as provided in Section 20 of chapter 28 of the Revised Statutes.

Article 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money, and if so, how much, for the improvements of the section of State Aid road as outlined in the report of the State Highway commissioner, in addition to the amount regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges: the amount not to exceed the maximum which the town is allowed to raise under the provision of Section 19 chapter 28, of the revised Statutes and of acts additional thereto.

RECOMMENDATION: That the sum of \$1,066.00 be raised for State Aid Roads.

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money and what sum, for the maintenance of State Aid Highways during the ensuing year, within the limits of the Town, Patrol fund of \$567.00 should be raised.

RECOMMENDATION: That the sum of \$567.00 be raised for maintenance of State Aid Roads.

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of not less than One Hundred Nineteen dollars for the maintenance of the improved section of third class roads to be used in connection with the third class road appropriation made by the State for the improvement of third class roads.

RECOMMENDATION: That the sum of \$119.00 be raised for the maintenance of Third Class Roads.

Article 8. To see if the the Town will instruct the

Selectmen to appoint a road commissioner for the ensuing year.

Article 9. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate a sum of money and if so how much, for the support of a free reading room, or public library.

RECOMMENDATION: That \$700.00 be raised under Art. 9.

Article 10. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of One Hundred dollars for the observance of next Memorial Day.

RECOMMENDATION: That \$50.00 be raised for the observance of next Memorial Day.

Article 11. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate a sum of money, and if so, how much to pay this years interest on the town debt.

RECOMMENDATION: That the sum of \$492.25 be raised for interest on the Town Debt.

Article 12. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate a sum of money, and if so how much to be applied toward payment of the principal of the town debt.

RECOMMENDATION: That \$1,000.00 be raised to apply on the Town Debt.

Article 13. To see what sum of money if any, the Town will recommend to take from the joint State Aid account for the purpose of applying bituminous surface treatment to state aid roads built within the past five years in accordance with the provisions of chapter 271, P. L. 1931.

RECOMMENDATION: No recommendation.

Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen and Town treasurer to borrow from banks, Trust companies, or individuals, as temporary loans to and for the use of the Town of Machias, in anticipation of the taxes of the current year of 1933, sums of money in the aggregate not exceeding \$16,000, Sixteen Thousand dollars, and authorize the treasurer of the town to execute the negotiable note or notes of the town therefor, payable within said municipal year from moneys raised by taxation therein and upon

such terms as shall be satisfactory to said treasurer and the selectmen of said town.

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money, and if so how much towards defraying expenses of combating Tuberculosis in Washington county, said sum to be expended by the Washington County Anti-Tuberculosis Association.

RECOMMENDATION: That the sum of \$75.00 be raised under Art. 15.

Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money and how much, for the purpose of tarring streets said streets to be designated and money to be expended by the selectmen.

RECOMMENDATION: That the sum of \$400.00 be raised for the purpose of tarring streets.

Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money, and if so how much to defray the expense of insurance on the Town buildings.

RECOMMENDATION: That the sum of \$535.24 be raised to defray the expense of Insurance on Town Buildings.

Article 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of Five Hundred dollars or other sums, for snow removal during the winter of 1933 and 1934, the same to be expended under the supervision of the selectmen.

RECOMMENDATION: That \$300.00 be raised under Art. 18.

Article 19. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Assessors to recind any amounts appropriated by the Town for State Aid Highway construction in excess to the amount required to meet state apportionments.

Article 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money and if so how much to be expended on the Longfellow cemetery.

RECOMMENDATION: That article 20 be indefinitely postponed.

Article 21 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum or sums of money for the maintenance of Court Street cemetery.

RECOMMENDATION: That Article 21 be indefinitely postponed.

Article 22. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to grant and raise to be expended and used for advertising the natural resources, advantages and attractions of the State of Maine.

RECOMMENDATION: That the sum of \$25.00 be raised under Article 22.

Article 23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Hundred dollars \$100. for the benefit of the Boys Band.

RECOMMENDATION: That Article 23 be indefinitely postponed.

Article 24. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One hundred dollars to be expended on River View Cemetery, West Kennebec.

RECOMMENDATION: That the sum of \$25.00 be raised under Article 24.

Article 25. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money, and if so, how much, to be expended for repairs and upkeep of roads and bridges, said sum to be expended under the supervision of the selectmen. Also to allow unemployed tax payers to work out all or part of their taxes.

RECOMMENDATION: That the sum of \$1,000.00 be raised under Article 25.

Article 26. By request of E. M. Garnett and others. To see what action the Town will take if any about the dump and nuisance on Lyons St.

Article 27. To see what action the Town will take on the question of DAYLIGHT SAVING TIME for the coming year.

Article 28. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money and if so, how much, to be expended cutting bushes on the State Aid roads for the year 1933.

RECOMMENDATION: That the expense of cutting bushes

on the State Aid Road be taken from the regular appropriation for Roads and Bridges.

TO the Voters of the Town of Machias:

For the information of our Tax Payers, your Budget Committee would say that theirs has been a difficult task, trying to lesson our taxes without cutting appropriations.

We exceedingly regret to recommend cuts on our schools, but feel that our tax payers have had to take considerable greater cuts in wages, even if fortunate enough to retain their jobs.

We also feel obliged to cut deep on our Road Money. Our recommendation on State Aid was made with a view of smaller tax payers being given an opportunity to work out at least part of their taxes, providing other employment was scarce as we fear may be the case.

The total amount of the appropriations recommended by the Budget Committee would mean a saving of nearly \$8,000.00 from the amount raised last year, and with the present valuation would carry a rate of approximately .048.
