Warrant for Town Meeting

To Mathias Albert, a constable of the Town of Madawaska, in the County of Aroostook, Greeting:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said town of Madawaska, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to meet at Town Hall in said town of Madawaska on the seventeenth day of March, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:

- Art. 1. To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.
- Art. 2. To choose a town clerk for the ensuing year.
- Art. 3. To act upon the report of the town officers for the past year.
- Art. 4. To choose a board of selectmen, assessors and overseers of poor for ensuing year.
 - Art. 5. To choose a town treasurer for the ensuing year.
- Art. 6. To whoose one member of the board of superintending school committee.
- Art. 7. To choose a collector of taxes and determine his compensation.
- Art. 8. To see what rate of interest the town will charge on taxes, and what date this interest shall begin.
- Art. 9. To choose all other officers required by law, to be chosen at the annual meeting.
- Art. 10. To choose road commissioners or authorize selectmen to do same.
- Art. 11. To see if the town will vote "yes" or "no" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the town to State Aid, as provided in Section 19, of Chapter 25, of the Revised Statutes of 1916.
- Art. 12. To see what sum of money the town will appropriate and raise for the improvement of the section of State Aid road as outlined in the report of the State Highway Commission, in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of the ways, highways and bridges, under the provisions of Section 21, Chapter 25, R. S., amended by Chapter 258, P. L., 1917.

- Art. 13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the salaries of all town officers.
- Art. 14. To see what sum of money the town will vote for the support of poor.
- Art. 15. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for repairs of summer roads and bridges.
- Art. 16. To see what sum of money the town will vote for winter roads and snow plows.
- Art. 17. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for buying iron culverts.
- Art. 18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate money for advertising our natural resources, advantages and attractions, under the provisions of Chapter 4, Section 59, of the Revised Statutes of Maine, the same to be expended by the Maine Development Association.
- Art. 19. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of money and if so, how much to be expended by the Board of Health for the suppression and prevention of tuberculosis.
- Art. 20. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the State Board of Charities and Corrections.
- Art. 21. To see if the town will vote to raise money for the payment of interest and also for contingent expenses.
- Art. 22. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for elementary and secondary schools, including teacher's wages and board, fuel, janitor's service, conveyance, tuition and board of pupils, text books, reference books and school supplies for desks or laboratory use.
- Art. 23. To see what wages the town will set for janitor service in the rural schools.
- Art. 24. To see if the town will vote to raise necessary money to build a modern schoolhouse in District No. 2.
- Art. 25. To authorize the selectmen of the town to enter into a contract with the Fort Kent Electric Co., to provide 25 lamps of 60 watts each for street lighting purposes in the village at a cost of \$450.00 per year.
- Art. 26. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the purpose of building sidewalks in the village.
- Art. 27. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for a silent policeman of solid construction to be placed at the junction of Bridge and Main road.

- Art. 28. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for waterworks and sewers in the village.
- Art. 29. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for a jail or lockup in the village.
- Art. 30. To see what sum of money the town will vote for the purpose of hiring a policeman in the village.
- Art. 31 To see if the town will vote to permit the members of the school committee to represent the town of Madawaska in a petition, to the State Commissioners of Education and the Governor of the State of Maine, to disolve the school union, 127 into two Districts, namely (1) Madawaska and Grand Isle, and (2), Frenchville and St. Agatha, for better supervision.
- Art. 32. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to buy two lots to enlarge the school ground at Evangeline School.
- Art. 33. To see if the town will vote to raise \$1,500.00 to be spent on the church route so called.
- Art. 34. To see if the town will vote to raise \$1,000.00 to be spent on L. B. Fournier's route.
- Art. 35. To see if the town will vote to raise \$100.00 to work a new piece of road at the rear end of Onesime Michaud land and to vote the necessary amount to pay the damage in keeping the old road.
- Art. 36. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$200.00 to work the cross road leading to Pit Cyr.
- Art. 37. To see if the town will vote to raise \$200.00 to be spent in the Simeon Martin route.
- Art. 38. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to make a bridge over Joe. Gagnon Brook, near the mill.
- Art. 39. To see if the town will vote to raise \$1,000.00 to finish the Eloi Martin route and also to work the cross road.
- Art. 40. To see if the town will vote to raise \$400.00 to work the portage and the Isidore Daigle hill.
- Art. 41. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$250.00 for Joe M. Pelletier road.
- Art. 42. To see if the town will vote to stop the Canadian bread dealers after we'll have a bakery in the town.
- Art. 43. To see if the town will vote to authorize its selectmen to sell the vacant schoolhouses.
- Art. 44. To see if the town will vote to set the poll tax at five dollars each.

- Art. 45. To see if the town will vote to accept a list of jurors as prepared by the municipal officers, treasurer and town clerk.
- Art. 46. To see if the town will vote to raise money for the payment of interest and also for contingent expenses.
- Art. 47. To see if the town will vote to authorize its selectmen to borrow the necessary funds for transacting the expense for the ensuing year.
- Art. 48. To see if the town will vote to accept the report of the town officers.
- '. Art. 49. To transact all other necessary business that may properly come before said meeting.

The Selectmen give notice that they shall be in session for the purpose of revising and correcting the list of voters, at the hall at eight o'clock in the forenoon, on the day of said meeting.
