Warrant for Annual Town Meeting

MADAWASKA, MAINE.

March, 21, 1930.

To Leonard Dufour, a constable of the Town of Madawaska, in the County of Aroostook, Greeting:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the said Town of Madawaska, qualified in law to vote in town affairs, to meet at W. H. Daigle's Hall in said town of Madawaska on the twenty-first day of March A. D., 1930, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:—

Art. 1. To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.

Art. 2. To choose a town clerk for the ensuing year.

Art. 3. To see if the town will vote to accept the report of the Town Officers.

Art. 4. To choose a board of selectmen, assessors and overseers of poor for ensuing year.

Art. 5. To choose a town treasurer for the ensuing year.

Art. 6. To choose two members of the board of superintending school committee.

Art. 7. To choose a collector of taxes and determine his compensation.

Art. 8. To see what rate of interest the town will charge on taxes and what date this interest shall begin.

Art. 9. To choose all other officers required by law, to be chosen at the annual meeting.

Art. 10. To choose road commissioners or authorize selectmen to do same.

Art. 11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the salaries of all town officers.

Art. 12. To see what sum of money the town will vote for the support of poor.

Art. 13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for elementary and secondary schools including teacher's wages and board, fuel, janitors's service, conveyance, tuition and board of pupils, textbooks, reference books and school supplies for desks or laboratory use.

Art. 14. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for school repairs, light and power, insurance, rent, truant officer, and medical inspection.

Art. 15. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for grading and fencing Evangeline School lot.

Art. 16. To see what sum of money the town will vote to

raise for the purpose of new school buildings.

Art. 17. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of five cents per capita for the suppression and prevention of tuberculosis.

Art. 18. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the State Board of Charities and Corrections.

Art. 19. To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise to be expended and used for advertising the natural resources, advantages, and attractions of the State of Maine.

Art. 20. To see what sum of money the town will vote for sewers, or to see what sum of money the town will authorize the selectmen to borrow for same.

Art. 21. To see what sum of money the town will vote for the purpose of hiring a policeman in the village.

Art. 22. To see if the town will vote the sum of \$50.00 for town hall rent.

Art. 23. To see if the town will vote the sum of \$60.00 for rent of basement for lockup.

Art. 24. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for a sidewalk and gutter down the hill to Edmundston.

Art. 25. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the building of streets in the village.

Art. 26. To see if the town will vote the sum of \$640.00 for the actual street lights and for ten additional's.

Art. 27. To see if the town will appropriate money for building housings for fire hose.

Art. 28. To vote the sum of \$40.00 for interest on ministerial school fund.

Art. 29. To see if the town will vote "yes" or "no" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the town to State Aid, as provided in Section 19, of Chapter 25, of the Revised Statutes of 1916.

Art. 30. To see what sum of money the town will appropriate and raise for the improvement of the section of State Aid road as outlined in the report of the State Highway Commission, in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of the ways, highways and bridges, under the provisions of Section 21, Chapter 25, R. S., amended by Chapter 258, P. L., 1917.

Art. 31. To vote a sum of not less than \$759.00 for the maintenance of improved sections of third class road.

Art. 32. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for repairs of summer roads and bridges.

Art. 33. To see what sum of money the town will vote for winter roads and snow plows or roller.

Art. 34. To see what sum of money the town will vote for the purpose of buying a road machine.

Art. 34a. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for buying iron culverts.

Art. 35. To see if the town will vote the sum of \$1,000.00 for Jos. Gagnon's Route.

Art. 36. To see if the town will vote the sum of \$200.00 for Mathias Albert's bridge.

Art. 37. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Joseph X. Cyr's route.

Art. 38. To see if the town will vote the sum of \$500.00 for a piece of road in the back settlement between Louis A. Cyr's farm and Michel Cyr's.

Art. 39. To see what sum of money the town will vote for a piece of road in the back settlement beginning at John J. Cry's farm going in a westerly direction as far as Church Route so-called.

Art. 40. To see if the town will vote the sum of \$1,000.00 for the Grand Rousseau road in the neighborhood of Fred R. Cyr.

Art. 41. To see if the town will vote the sum of \$500.00 for a piece of road in the neighborhood of Eloi J. Dionne and William Paradis.

Art. 42. To see if the town will vote the sum of \$500.00 to complete the work left unfinished last year in Paul Pelletier road.

Art. 43. To see if the town will vote the sum of \$150.00 to finish Jos. M. Pelletier road.

Art. 44. To see if the town will vote the sum of \$1,000 to work on Daigle's route and bridge.

Art. 45. To see if the town will accept the road laid out by the Selectmen, as follows: Beginning in the center of the highway road leading from Victorie Cyr to land presently owned by Simeon Martin where the rear line of the old homestead farm of the late Xaxier Michaud now supposed to be owned by Mrs. Victoria Lizotte, strikes the southern side of said highway and running in the dividing line between land of said Victorie Cyr and land of Francis Morin but wholly on land of said Francis Morin, following said dividing line until same strikes land presently owned by Jos. R. D. Cyr.

We award to said Victoria Lizotte \$10.00 for damage to be paid by said town.

Art. 46. To see if the town will vote the sum of \$110. for damage and building the same, if approved.

Art. 47. To see if the town will accept the road laid out by the Selectmen as follows: Said road to start at a stake on the westerly line of lot of land owned by Alfred Levesque and south easterly across said lot to the westerly line of lot of land owned by Joseph T. Chasse thence southeasterly and across said lot to the westerly line of another lot owned by said Alfred

Levesque, thence from the easterly line of said lot south easterly and across lot of land owned by Carise Cote to the westerly line of lot of land numbered 64 owned by Adolphe Levesque to the westerly line of lot of land owned by Emery Chasse.

Art. 48. To see if the town will vote the sum of \$300.00 to build the same if accepted.

Art. 49. To see if the town will vote to impose a license of \$200.00 per year on foreign traders who seek to sell their merchandise in this town.

Art. 50. To see what sum of money the town will vote to apply on town debt.

Art. 51. To see what sum of money the town will vote for the payment of interest and also for contingent expenses.

Art. 52. To see if the town will vote to authorize its selectmen to borrow the necessary funds for transacting the expense for the ensuing year.

Art. 53. To transact all other necessary business that may properly come before said meeting.

The Selectmen give notice that they shall be in session for the purpose of revising and correcting the list of voters, at the hall at eight o'clock in the forenoon, on the day of said meeting.
