WARRANT

FOR ANNUAL TOWN-MEETING

Madawaska, Maine

March 16, 1933

To Leonard Dufour, a constable in the Town of Madawaska, in the County of Aroostook, GREETINGS:—

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the said Town of Madawaska, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to meet at W. A. Daigle's Hall, in said Town of Madawaska, on the sixteenth day of March, A. D. 1933, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:—

- Art. 1. To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.
- Art. 2. To choose a town clerk for the ensuing year.
- Art. 3. To see if the town will vote to accept the report of the Town Officers.
- Art. 4. To choose a board of Selectmen, Assessors and Overseers of the Poor for the ensuing year.
- Art. 5. To choose a town treasurer for the ensuing year.
- Art. 6. To choose one member of the board of superintending school committee.
- Art. 7. To choose a collector of taxes and determine his compensation.
- Art. 8. To choose road commissioners or authorize selectmen to do same.
- Art. 9. To choose all officers required by law to be chosen at annual town meeting.

Art. 10. To see what rate of interest the town will charge on taxes and what date this interest shall begin.

Art. 11. To see what sum of money the town will appropriate for salaries of town officers.

Art. 12. To see what sum of money the town will appropriate for the support of poor.

Art. 13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of elementary and secondary schools, including teachers' wages, board of pupils, fuel, janitors' services, conveyance, tuition, text books, reference books and school supplies for desks, water, light and power; fund known as Common School Account.

Art. 14. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the board of high school pupils outside a certain distance from school who are attending the Madawaska High School; this amount to be added to Common School Account

Art. 15. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for school repair, rent, insurance, truant officer, medical inspection and equipment; this fund to be known as the Special School Account.

Art. 16. To see if the town will vote to close School No. 18.

Art. 17. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the purpose of building a High School building in the Town of Madawaska.

Art. 18. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the purpose of buying a lot of land for such High School.

Art. 19. To see if the town will authorize its selectmen to borrow the necessary money for the building of a High School and buying a lot for it, placing a limit to the amount to be borrowed.

Art. 20. To see if the town will vote the sum of \$40.00 for interest on ministerial school fund.

Art. 21. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of five cents per capita for the purpose of suppressing and preventing tuberculosis.

Art. 22. To see if the town will vote \$540.00 for mothers' aid.

Art. 23. To see if the town will vote 'Yes' or 'No' on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the town to State Aid, as provided in Sec. 19 of chapter 25 of the revised statutes of 1916.

Art. 24. To see what sum of money the town will appropriate and raise for the improvement of the section of State-Aid road as outlined in the report of the State Highway Commission, in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges, under the provisions of Sec. 21, Chap. 25, R. S., amended by Chap. 258, P. L., 1917.

Art. 25. To see if the town will vote to authorize the assessors to rescind any amounts appropriated by the town for State-Aid highway construction in excess of the amount required to meet state apportionments.

Art. 26. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for buying iron culverts.

Art. 27. To vote a sum of not less than \$838.00 for the maintenance of improved sections of third class road.

Art. 28. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for repairs of summer roads and bridges.

Art. 29. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for winter roads.

Art. 30. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for snow removal from the streets and sidewalks of the village proper.

Art. 31. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay on waterworks bonds.

Art. 32. To see what sum of money the town will vote for hall and lockup rents.

Art. 33. To see what sum of money the town will vote for street lights.

Art. 34. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for town books.

Art. 35. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for interest and contingent expenses.

Art. 36. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for a fire department.

Art. 37. To see what sum of money the town will vote to apply on town debt.

Art. 38. To see if the town will vote to authorize its selectmen to borrow the necessary funds, not to exceed twenty-five thousand dollars and to be paid through the current year's taxes, for transacting the expenses for the ensuing year.

Art. 39. To transact all other necessary business that may properly come before said meeting.

The Selectmen give notice that they shall be in session for the purpose of revising and correcting the list of voters at the town office from 1:00 P. M. to 4:00 P. M., Wednesday, March 15th, A. D. of the present year.
