Report of Auditor for 1937

Houlton, Maine August 1, 1939.

To the Board of Selectmen Town of Madawaska.

In accordance with Chapter 216 of the Public Laws of Maine in 1937, I have audited the books of the Selectmen, Treasurer and Tax Collector for the fiscal year ending March 1st, 1938.

No evidence was found of any official audit having been made since the State Uniform System of Municipal Accounts was installed March 1st, 1927. Therefore I have verified and prepared Comparative Balance Sheets of both the Town and Water Department books as of March 1st, 1938 showing the change in each as result of the audit together with an analysis of the Debt and Surplus accounts.

To the best of my knowledge and belief the Balance Sheet herewith presented reveals the true financial condition of the Town at the close of the fiscal year. The Town Clerk's records were found to be in excellent condition, since taking office he has prepared a card record of all Mortgages which gives instantaneous access to any information required and is available to any person interested. He has in addition to the above indexed all birth records back as far as 1871.

The only criticism to be made on this office is the absence of any fire protection for these valuable records. The Statute specifically provides that they must be protected and under the present method should any Mortgagee suffer a loss due to the absent availability of records the Town would become liable for such loss. I would recommend that steps be taken to provide adequate safe protection for the records of this office.

The Selectmen's books have been well kept, with the exception that no Capital Accounts have been set up only the appropriation and Tax Collector's accounts appearing I have now spread upon these records all of the Capital Accounts shown in the Balance Sheet making them a complete double entry set of books.

The Treasurer's records have been exceptionally well kept and his cash on hand reconciles with the Bank Statement. All money received having been deposited before the books closed.

The Tax Collector's unpaid taxes equal their respective accounts due the town. No verification of unpaid taxes has been made other than preparing a list to support the account.

It has been necessary to install a complete new system for the Water Department to meet the requirements of the Public Utilities Commission effective January 1, 1938.

AUDITOR'S REPORT

Houlton, Maine February 25, 1939

To the Board of Trustees

of the Madawaska Water Department

I have audited the accounts of the Madawaska Water Co. for the year ending December 31, 1938.

I have prepared the following schedules: Receipts and Disbursements, Income and Expense, and Comparative Balance Sheets with analysis of Debt.

The revenue this year is reported on an earned basis, all cash received being credited to Accounts Receivable.

Included in the additions to plant during the year is a contribution from the Federal Government amounting to \$2,766.01, this has been added to plant and set up in Balance Sheet as contributions to construction with others, as required by the new classification as prescribed by the Public Utilities Commission.

The statistical record of this department since origin appears in the front of this report as a result of the audit for 1937, and shows a very rapid growth with increased earnings each year.

I would recommend that the corporate status of the department be reinstated and stock issued to the inhabitants of the town of Madawaska in an amount to represent the town's investments in the plant and that the Board of Trustees be changed to a Board of Directors consisting of five instead of three.

This is the customary form of management employed by most all municipally owned utilities.

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the said Town of Madawaska, qualified by law to vote in Town affairs, to meet at the Madawaska High School Gymnasium, in said Town, on the twentieth day of March, 1939, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:—

- Art. 5. To choose a Road Commissioner and determine his compensation or authorize the Selectmen to do same.
- Art. 6. To choose a Board of Trustees for the Madawaska Water Dept., or authorize the Selectmen to do same.
- Art. 7. To choose a Collector of Taxes and determine his compensation or authorize the Selectmen to do same.
- Art. 8. To choose a Policeman and determine his compensation or authorize the Selectmen to do same.
- Art. 9. To choose all other Town officers or authorize the Selectmen to do same.
- Art. 10. To see what officers the Town will vote to elect by Australian Ballot in the future.
- Art. 11. To see if the Town will vote to operate on Daylight Saving Time during the Summer months.
- Art. 12. To see what rate of discount the Town will vote to give on taxes paid before certain dates and what date the discount will end.

- Art. 13 To see what rate of interest the Town will charge on taxes and what date this interest shall begin.
- Art. 14. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for salaries of Town officers.
- Art. 15. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the Support of Poor.
- Art. 16. To see if the Town will vote the sum of \$40.00 for interest on Ministerial School Fund note.
- Art. 17. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for General School Account.
- Art. 18. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Special School Account.
- Art. 19 To see if the Town will vote the sum of \$3,484.70 to cover 1937-38 Gymnasium Construction overdraft.
- Art. 20. To see if the Town will vote to sell the School and Lot known as the Fortune Hebert school and autohrize the Selectmen to give a deed for same.
- Art. 21 To see if the Town will vote to sell the School and Lot known as the Vilas Dufour School and authorize the Selectmen to give a deed for same.
- Art. 22. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of Five Cents per capita for the purpose of suppressing Tuberculosis.
- Art. 23. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Mother's Aid or Aid to Dependent Children.
- Art. 24. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$50.00 for the decoration of the graves of Veterans on Memorial Day, as provided by Chapter 5, Sec. 81 R. S. 1930.
- Art. 25. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for State Aid Road Construction (in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges) under the provisions of Section 19, Chapter 28
 R. S. of 1930, or under the provisions of Section 3, Chapter 229, Public Laws of 1937.
- Art. 26. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Assessors to rescind any amounts appropriated by the Town for State Aid Highway Construction in excess of the amount required to meet State Apportionments.
- Art. 27. To vote a sum of money, not less than \$1,061.00 for the maintenance of improved section of Third Class Road.
- Art. 28. To see if the Town will vote the sum of \$475.00 for the payment of work done in the construction of the Jos Gendreau road, so-called.
- Art. 29. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the extension of Middle Clavette Street to Clavette Street.

- Art. 30 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to repair the road in Doucette Settlement so-called.
- Art. 31. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to repair Daigle Route so-called.
- Art. 32. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to repair Gagnon Route so-called.
- Art. 33. To see if the Town will accept the Streets as laid out on plan furnished by Alexis Martin which plan is on record at the Northern Aroostook Registry of Deeds, said Streets to be built with money for Summer Roads.
- Art. 24. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the repair of Summer Roads and Bridges.
- Art. 35. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the repair of Road Machines.
- Art. 36. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to buy a lot and build a shed to store Town Road Machines and to choose a location for same.
- Art. 37. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Winter Roads, Winter road machines and snow fences.
- Art. 38. To see if the Town will pay Emery Chasse for damages done to fence by snow-removing trucks.
- Art. 39. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to give a deed to Thomas Pelletier for the Germain Cote house and lot.
- Art. 40. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Waterworks Bonds.
- Art. 41. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to pay on School System Bonds.
- Art. 42. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for interest and contingent expenses.
- Art. 43. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Street Lights.
- Art. 44. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Town Books.
- Art. 45. To see if the Town will appropriate the sum of \$1,900.00 for the purpose of buying and installing an adequate Fire Alarm System.
- Art. 46. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for a Fire Department.
- Art. 47. To see what sum of money the Town will vote for the upkeep of the Fire Station Building.
- Art. 45. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the repair of Levite-Martin Road so-called.

- Art. 49. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$269.00 for Public Health in Madawaska, said sum to be expended by the Bureau of Health ,State Department of Health and Welfare, in cooperation with local authorities.
- Art. 50. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for advertising our natural resources, advantages, and attractions under the provisions of Chapter 5 Section S2 of the Revised Statutes of 1930 said sum to be expended under the direction of the State of Maine Publicity Bureau.
- Art. 51. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to procure a temporary loan or loans, in anticipation of taxes for the purpose of paying obligations of the Town, such notes not to exceed an amount of \$50,000 and to be paid during the current municipal year out of money raised during said municipal year by taxes.
- Art. 52. To see if the Town will authorize the issue of a series of its bonds for the following purposes or any of them, to wit:
 - a. To refund in whole or in part outstanding indebtedness of the Town which has or may hereafter become due.
 - b. To pay in whole or in part for the expense of the Fire Station, construction of sewers and cost of water works.

- Art. 55. To see if the Town will vote to repair or discontinue the road between Paul Martin and Patrick Michaud farms.
- Art. 56. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to repair the Jean A. Cyr road so-called.
- Art. 57. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the purpose of buying a snow removal plow.
- Art. 58. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the purpose of buying a road machine.
- Art. 59. To transact all other necessary business that may properly come before said meeting.
