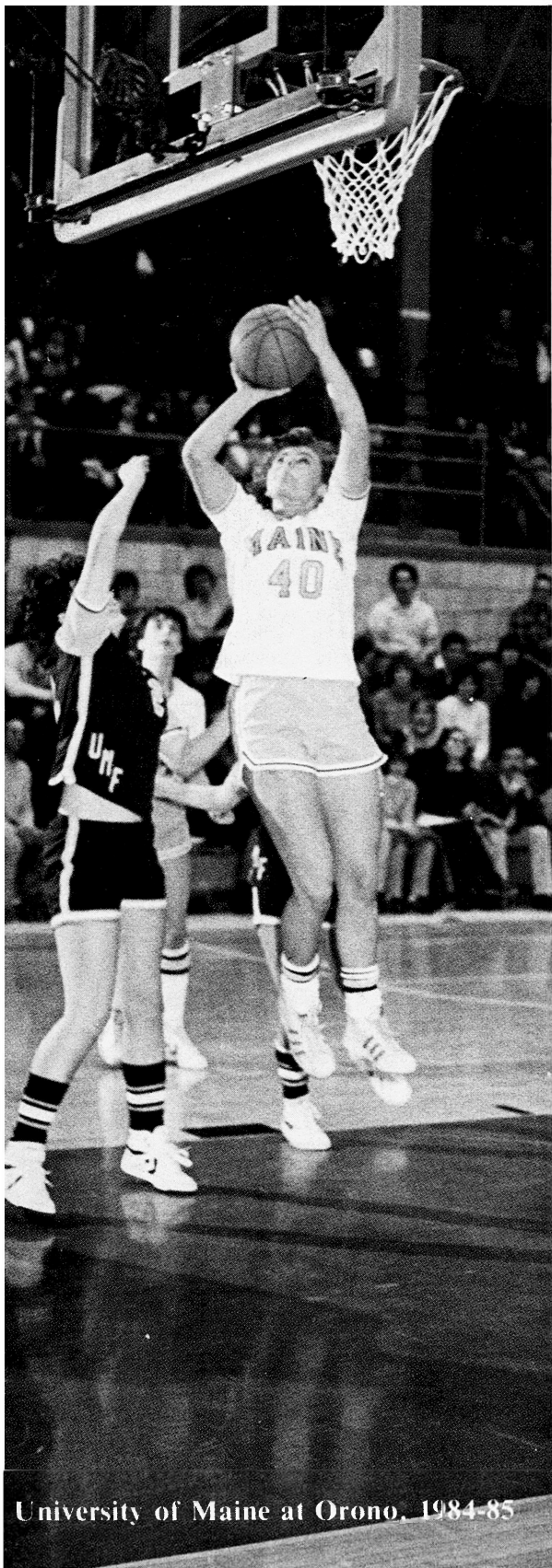

University of Maine at Orono, 1984-85

Since 1983-84 when Peter Gavett took over as women's basketball coach, the team has undergone many new changes. With the formation of the new Eastern Collegiate Athletic Conference (ECAC) Seaboard Conference, Maine will be competing against Boston University, University of New Hampshire, Northeastern University, the University of Vermont, Hartford and Brooklyn College on a regular basis for a league championship. Two to four more teams may be added in the

next year to give Maine a highly competitive Division I conference. In addition to the conference, Maine has upgraded its schedule to include such nationally ranked teams on the East Coast as the University of Virginia, which last year finished first in the Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC).

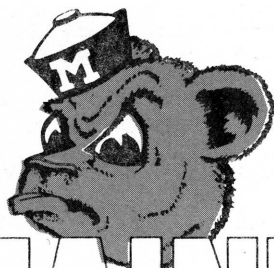
Maine has been and will be involved in several Invitational Tournaments. Last year, the Bears played in the Harvard Invitational and the University of Connecticut Invitational, along with hosting their own Tipoff Tournament. This season's schedule includes the Siena Invitational Tournament and the Queens Christmas Tournament. Both tournaments will include outstanding teams from Florida, North Carolina, Maryland, Delaware and New York. The new ECACSC will hold its first post-season tournament this season with all member teams qualifying.

The 1983-84 season saw numerous University records set plus NCAA Division I records shattered. Graduating seniors Lisa Cormier and Julie Treadwell plus returning starter and this year's team captain Emily Ellis were mainly responsible for the 21 individual records broken and the 18 team and five NCAA standards set.

Coach Gavett is optimistic about his program and the prospects for the team being a strong contender for honors in the East both this year and in future years.

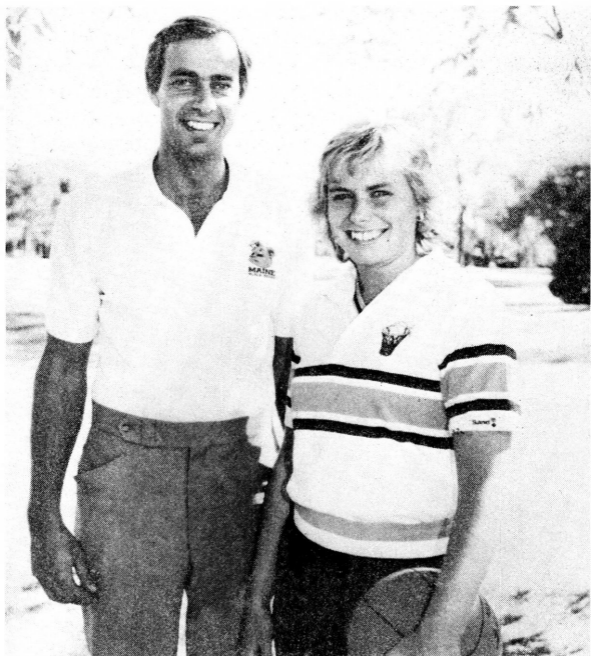

HEAD COACH PETER GAVETT

Peter Gavett moved from being a very successful assistant coach and recruiter with the University of Maine at Orono men's basketball program to head coach of the women's team in 1983-84. A graduate of UMO in 1973, Gavett was named an assistant to men's basketball coach Skip Chappelle in September of that year. In the ten years he served in that capacity Gavett was responsible for coaching the junior varsity team, coordinated the recruiting of all prospective student-athletes, coordinated the scouting of future opponents and served as team advisor concerned with academic and financial matters. As coach of the jayvee team from 1973-78 his record was 48 wins and 11 losses.

While an undergraduate at UMO, Gavett played one year of freshman basketball and three years of varsity during which he was named All Yankee Conference and All District One, scored 1,294 career points and was drafted by the Boston Celtics. He was captain of the team in 1972-73 and was twice named to the Yankee Conference All Academic team. From 1976 to the present he has been the director of the University of Maine Girls Summer Basketball Clinics. He and his wife Shelley and daughter Gretchen reside in Old Town.

1984-85 PROSPECTS

In the first year under new head coach Peter Gavett the Black Bears won 16 and lost 11. This season Gavett hopes to do even better, thanks to a successful recruiting season. One reason for this optimism is the return of senior forward Emily Ellis, who was the Northeast's top scorer last season, averaging 22.4 points a game. She was named the ECAC Independent Player of the Week three times and established 10 new school records, including a single game high of 42 points against Vermont and another for hitting 26 consecutive free throws, a new NCAA mark. Helping Ellis will be several outstanding freshmen, including 6-0 forward Liz Coffin, who scored 1,800 career points in high school; 6-0 forward Kelly Nobert, an All-Maine selection; and 6-0 forward Crystal Cummings. The guard spots will be handled by two veterans, Mary Walker and Beth Cormier, although freshman Jen Smart, sophomore Annie Allen and sophomore Sonja Wedge will also battle for playing time.

Other returnees who give the Bears excellent depth are forward Claire McCoy, forward Lauree Gott, who is returning after a year's absence due to injury; and Lynn McGouldrick, who may alternate at either guard or forward.
