### MEDIA CREDENTIALS

Requests should be directed to Brent Williamson by phone, fax, or e-mail as far in advance as possible and no later than 48 hours before game time. All credentials will be left at will call at the Alfond Arena Ticket Office. Pursuant to Hockey East regulations, credentials CANNOT be issued to professional scouts.

### PRESS BOX

Press boxes at Alfond Arena are located on both sides of the rink. The primary press box is located on the east side (penalty box side) of Alfond Arena. Additional press box seating is located on the west side (player bench side), next to the coaches' video platform.

Limited seating is available with beat writers, television and primary radio outlets receiving priority. Additional media requests will be accommodated as seating allows. Due to the lack of space in both press boxes, media members are asked not to bring any unnecessary items or equipment with them to Alfond Arena.

### TELEPHONES

The main press box phone number is 207-581-1049. Additional phone lines in the press box are available for filing on a shared basis. One radio line is available to the designated radio station of the visiting team. There will be no charge for press box lines at Maine during the 2006-07 season. If additional or dedicated lines are needed, charges will apply. In addition, wireless internet access is available in Alfond Arena. Media wishing to use the wireless network can get a guest user ID from the Media Relations Staff.

### INTERVIEWS

All requests for player interviews, either in person or via phone, should be coordinated through Brent Williamson in the Maine Athletic Media Relations Office. Players will not be available for interviews on game days prior to the game. All locker rooms, training rooms and weight rooms at the University of Maine are closed to the media. After home games, head coach Tim Whitehead and selected players will be available in a media area outside of the locker room.

All regular season practices are open to the media, and coach Tim Whitehead and his players are available to the media before practice and team meetings. Schedules are subject to change on a daily basis, so please contact Brent Williamson for up-to-date information on practice and meeting times.

### INJURY INFORMATION

Due to federal laws regarding privacy of medical information under the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA), the University of Maine will not release a student-athlete's medical information to the media. Maine may, however, release information at an appropriate time as to how long a student athlete's injury will keep him/her from participating in athletic competition. This disclosure will only occur after the student-athlete has signed a waiver form related to the specific injury that has occurred.

We ask the cooperation of the media in not asking coaches or team personnel questions regarding injuries to student-athletes. Furthermore, if a student-athlete chooses not to divulge an injury or illness, we request that you respect his or her choice.

Take Interstate 95 North to Exit 193 (Stillwater/Old Town)... bear right at end of off-ramp onto Stillwater Avenue... at fourth set of lights (McDonald's on left) take a right onto College Avenue... travel one mile on College Avenue... turn left onto Maine campus just prior to Alfond Sports Arena ... Alfond Arena parking lot is directly in front.

## BLACK BEARS ON RADIO

All University of Maine hockey games are carried live over the air by "The SportsZone," WZON-AM 620 in Bangor, Maine. Games will also be heard on the Black Bear Radio Network, which includes WLOB in Portland, WDME in Dover-Foxcroft, and WEGP in Presque Isle and Caribou. Internet audio can be found at WZON's web site, [www.zoneradio.com](http://www.zoneradio.com).

Dan Hannigan returns to handle the play-by-play duties for his twelfth season. He has called many memorable moments in Maine hockey history, including the overtime game-winner in the 1999 National Championship game. Joining Hannigan in the booth for most games will be *Bangor Daily News* beat writer Larry Mahoney. Mahoney has been covering the Black Bears for nearly 25 years.

Many home games and select road games will also be broadcast by the University of Maine student radio station, WMEB (92.1 FM).

## TELEVISION COVERAGE

The University of Maine men's ice hockey team will appear on television numerous times during the 2006-07 season. WABI-TV 5 in Bangor will broadcast nine games, with most of the games also shown on WPFO-TV 23 in Portland. All games broadcast on WABI can also be seen on [www.watchmainesports.com](http://www.watchmainesports.com) on a pay-per-view basis. In the

booth for WABI will be Joe Carr with play-by-play and Mike Tuell as color analyst. Carr has been broadcasting Black Bears hockey either on radio or on television since the 1987-88 season. Tuell has been a referee for a number of years,

and is currently a Hockey East official observer. As part of New England Sports Network (NESN) Friday night Hockey East package, two games will be picked up regionally, January 12 against



Boston University and February 9 against Vermont. College Sports Television (CSTV) will also carry three Black Bear hockey games as part of a national broadcast package — February 2 at New Hampshire, February 10 vs. Vermont and February 16 at Boston College. Joining the broadcast package this season is ESPNU, which will broadcast the November 19 Boston College match-up.

# 1865 THE UNIVERSITY OF MAINE

The University of Maine is the state's center of learning, discovery, and service to the public. As the flagship university of the University of Maine System and the state's land-grant and sea-grant institution, the University of Maine has the unique responsibility for providing high-quality undergraduate and graduate education programs, public service, and basic and applied research.

Located in Orono, within close proximity to the ocean, lakes, and mountains, the University of Maine offers an inspiring learning environment. There is plenty of open space on its 1,200 acres, where students are offered the diversity and the challenge of a large university in an invigorating atmosphere of a small college. The campus is located 10 miles north of Bangor, Maine's third largest city.

The University's undergraduate and graduate educational offerings are built upon a liberal arts and sciences foundation complemented by profession-oriented education in a wide range of disciplines, many of which are found nowhere else in the state. Because of their responsibility to teach, conduct research, and serve the public, faculty members are able to incorporate the new knowledge they uncover with classroom activities, often giving students hands-on experience in the research process.

The University offers its students, faculty, and staff, as well as the people of the community and the state, an outstanding athletic tradition. Maine's 19 Division I sports entertain more than 150 intercollegiate

events on campus each year attracting 200,000 spectators.

The University of Maine was established as the Maine College of Agriculture and the Mechanic Arts under the provisions of the Morrill Act, approved by President Abraham Lincoln in 1862. The institution opened September 21, 1868 with twelve students and two faculty members. In 1897, the name was changed to the University of Maine.

By 1871, curricula had been organized in Agriculture, Civil Engineering, Mechanical Engineering, and electives. From these courses of study there gradually developed the Colleges of Life Sciences and Agriculture (later to include the School of Forest Resources and the School of Human Development), Engineering and Science, and Arts and Sciences. The School of Education was established in 1930 and received college status in 1958. The School of Business Administration was formed in 1958 and was granted college status in 1965. Women have been admitted into all curricula since 1872.

The Maine Agricultural and Forest Experiment Station was founded as a division of the University in 1887. In 1912, the Maine Cooperative Extension,



which offers field educational programs for both adults and youths, was initiated. The first master's degree was conferred in 1881; the first doctor's degree in 1960. Since 1923 there has been a separate graduate school. The Summer Session as a separate entity dates from 1902. A Continuing Education Division offers evening and Saturday courses from the several curricula.

In 1980, the University of Maine was given Sea Grant College status by the Federal Government under provisions of the National Sea Grant College Program Act.

## THE MAINE FACTS

- Fall 2006 enrollment totaled approximately 11,500 students, nearly 2,200 of whom are graduate students. The student body includes residents of 45 states and 47 countries. Seventy-seven percent of Maine's students are full-time.
- *The Princeton Review* rates Maine among the top 20 "best bargains" among public colleges and universities in the U.S. Other universities in the same category include the University of California-Berkeley, the University of Texas-Austin and North Carolina State University.
- Maine is one of just 151 institutions (4 percent) nationwide to be classified by the Carnegie Foun-

dation for the Advancement of Teaching as a "Doctoral Research - Extensive" university, the highest classification possible.

- More of Maine's high school valedictorians and salutatorians enroll at the University of Maine than all other Maine colleges and universities combined.
- The Maine Honors college continues to be instrumental in efforts to attract highly qualified students. It started with 250 students four years ago, and is now up to approximately 700 students.
- The average SAT score of the 2004 entering class was 1,081, 55 points above the national average, and 75 above the state average.

### PRESIDENT



Robert A. Kennedy, Ph. D., became the president of the University of Maine on April 15, 2005. A plant biochemist with a long and distinguished scholarly career, Kennedy has held academic leadership positions at some of the nation's most prestigious universities. He has been at Maine since July 2000, serving first as Vice President for Academic Affairs. One year after his arrival, he was promoted to the position of Executive Vice Pres-

ident and Provost.

At Maine, Kennedy has played a central role in developing and executing the university's teaching, research and statewide public outreach missions. He has led the university's well-received strategic planning process, which has helped to provide direction for four years of growth and advancement in targeted critical areas.

"I am grateful for the opportunity to lead the University of Maine at this exciting time in the university's history," Kennedy says. "As all Black Bear fans know, Maine enjoys national and regional prominence in intercollegiate athletics. In competition and in the classroom, Maine student athletes have enjoyed tremendous success in the past several seasons. I look forward to the continuation of that success this year.

"With its wide-ranging mission of teaching, cutting-edge research and public engagement, the University of Maine is a true statewide resource, which will play a central role in developing and shaping the state's future."

Kennedy began his academic career on the faculty of the University of Iowa, followed by faculty appointments at Washington State University, The Ohio State University, the University of Maryland and Texas A&M University. He served as Associate Dean and Director of the Colleges of Agriculture and Life Sciences and the University of Maryland Agricultural Experiment Station for one year, before being promoted to the vice presidency for research at that university's Maryland Institute for Agriculture and Natural Resources. Immediately before coming to UMaine, Kennedy served for eight years as Vice President for Research and Associate Provost for Graduate Studies at Texas A&M.

In the late 1980s, Kennedy worked for three years in the Division of Molecular Biosciences and the Division of Cellular Biosciences at the National Science Foundation in Washington, D.C.

A Minnesota native, Kennedy earned his undergraduate degree in plant science for the University of Minnesota in 1968 and a Ph.D. in botany from the University of California, Berkeley in 1974. Kennedy and his wife, Mary, a professor of biochemistry at Maine, have four sons.

## BLAKE JAMES

### ATHLETIC DIRECTOR



Blake James was named Athletic Director by President Robert Kennedy on May 10, 2006 after serving as interim athletic director since July 2005. He served the previous two years at Maine as the Senior Associate Athletic Director, overseeing marketing, ticketing, retail operations, athletic development along with men's and women's track and field and cross country, men's soccer, men's basketball and baseball.

"I am impressed with his personal integrity, his commitment to student-athletes, and his firm understanding of the appropriate role of an athletics department in a first-class academic institution," said President Robert Kennedy. "He really understands what Maine is all about, and he will be an outstanding leader in our campus community."

Prior to coming to Maine, he worked in athletic development at Providence College, where he established the "Friars Forever" campaign and the Friar Athletic Fund. He began his career at the University of Miami where he worked in corporate sales and athletic development with former Maine Athletic Director Patrick Nero. James also worked at the University of Nebraska.

He received a bachelors degree in marketing in 1992 from Minnesota State University – Mankato and earned a masters degree from St. Thomas University (Miami, FL) in 1994. James and his wife, Kelly, reside in Veazie with their daughter, Haley, and son, Ryan.

# UNIVERSITY OF MAINE ATHLETICS

The University of Maine Athletic Department continued a tradition of success during the 2005-06 academic year. Overall, nine teams reached postseason play and one team won a conference title. Men's ice hockey and baseball participated in the NCAA Tournament. While the Black Bears were excelling in competition, they also excelled in the classroom.

**ACADEMIC SUCCESS:** Maine finished second with a 3.11 grade point average for the America East Academic Cup for the second straight season. Ten of the nineteen teams posted a GPA of above a 3.00. Softball posted the highest grade point average among America East schools, while six teams had the second-highest grade point average. Maine also led the conference in All-Academic Team selections. Individually, more than half of all student-athletes were named Maine Scholar-Athletes with a grade point average of 3.0 or better.

**ATHLETIC SUCCESS:** In the fall of 2005, the Black Bears began the season strong as the women's soccer team and the field hockey team advanced to the America East Conference Championship game. Kirby Davis won the individual men's cross country America East title. The football team played at Nebraska and finished 5-6 overall, winning three of their last four games.

The winter teams continued to build upon the success of the fall sports. Men's and women's basketball had strong seasons in the America East conference. Both men's and women's swimming set numerous school records. Men's ice hockey reached the NCAA Tournament for the eighth straight season and advanced to the Frozen Four for the third time in five seasons. Women's ice hockey returned to the postseason with a school-record 17 wins.

In the spring, the baseball team won the America East title and played at North Carolina in the NCAA Tournament. The softball team set a school record with 35 wins and won the America East regular

season championship. Maine added four individual champions in men's and women's outdoor track and field.

Overall, the combination of athletic and academic success has enabled the University of Maine to build one of the strongest athletic programs in New England.

# UNIVERSITY OF MAINE TRADITIONS

## THE STEIN SONG

Maine's stein song is one of the most recognizable fight songs in the country. Written in 1910 by Lincoln Colcord and made popular by Rudy Vallee, University of Maine Class of 1925, it became number one on the pop charts of that day. The song was named the nation's sixth best fight song in the 1998 book, *College Fight Songs: An Annotated Anthology*. The song is played at a variety of events on campus, including sporting events and graduation.

## BANANAS THE BLACK BEAR

The black bear has been the mascot of the University of Maine since 1914.

Jeff, a black bear cub who was found on the slopes of Mt. Katahdin in that year, was loaned to the university by Old Town police chief O.B. Fernandez, who hoped that he might bring good luck to the football team.

Jeff made his debut at a rally in preparation for the Colby game, and as he entered the auditorium, the



surprised crowd applauded enthusiastically. Thinking it only proper thing to do, Jeff gratefully stood on his head; the crowd went "bananas!"

Maine went on to whip Colby 31-6, and Maine has been going "bananas" for Black Bears ever since.

Former track and cross country captain Lloyd E. Houghton '12 presented the university with its own black bear cub the following year, and, remembering Jeff's enthusiastic welcome he suggested that the cub be named, Bananas.

At least 15 different black bears have carried on the name "Bananas" until the practice of having live mascots was banned after the death of "Cindy Bananas" in 1966.

In 1969, the Alpha Phi Omega fraternity began providing a "human Bananas" as a service to the university, and they continue to do so today. Additional support is provided by the Graduate M Club and the Maine General Alumni Association.

Bananas entertains at Maine athletic contest and other university special events, and also takes part in a variety of community activities and events.

In the fall of 2004, a newly designed "Bananas" mascot was unveiled at the first home football game

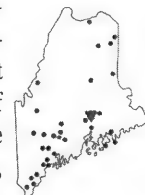
## SCHOOL COLORS AND LOGO

The University of Maine unveiled a new bear logo and school colors during the 1999 Homecoming festivities. Official University of Maine school colors are "Maine blue" (a deep sky blue), navy blue and white.



## BLACK BEARS FROM MAINE

The University of Maine is proud that nearly half of the student-athletes participating are from the state of Maine. Eighteen of the 19 sports have at least one team member from the state. Overall, over 80 towns and cities are represented on the athletic teams at the University of Maine. Some of the areas most represented include Bangor, Portland, South Portland, Augusta and Westbrook.



## MAINE DAY

In 1935 President Arthur Hauck inaugurated "Maine Day," a day set aside for "spring clean-up" of the campus. Classes are suspended for the day and all of the campus community — students, faculty, staff, and alumni — pitch in to spruce up the campus. The day kicks off with a wake-up parade, followed by work projects throughout the morning. A gigantic barbecue is held in the steam plant parking lot at lunchtime for all volunteers. In the afternoon student teams compete for the "oozeball championship" — volleyball played in the mud.

## ATHLETIC SUCCESS

Several Black Bear teams have excelled to regional and national prominence, including the Black Bear men's ice hockey team, the 1993 and 1999 NCAA Division I national champions. Every year since 1986, a streak of 21 straight seasons, at least one Black Bear sports team has competed in an NCAA Championship. In both 2002 and 2004, three dif-



ferent teams advanced to NCAA Tournaments. The Black Bears captured their first national title in 1993 when they defeated Lake Superior State University, 5-4, then captured the 1999 NCAA crown with a 3-2 win over New Hampshire. The baseball team has made seven appearances in the College World Series.

## COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

University of Maine student-athletes and athletic department staff are very involved in the community. From speaking in schools to providing sports clinics across the state, Black Bears are giving back to the community. This past season projects also included Habitat for Humanity, the Run for Hope, Buddy Walk, fundraising for Hurricane Katrina Relief, Bike and Safety Fair, Toys for Tots, National Girls and Women in Sports Day, and Broomball for the Children's Miracle Network.

# ACADEMIC SUPPORT AND LIFE SKILLS

## ACADEMIC SUPPORT

The University of Maine is committed to offering a comprehensive academic support program in conjunction with other University of Maine resources which can assist student-athletes in succeeding in their studies. Students must work just as intensely in the classroom as they do on the court, field, or ice in order to excel. Services include a variety of progressive and proactive support programs which can assist the student-athlete in developing academically, professionally and personally throughout their college years.

Once on campus, first year student-athletes participate in orientation programs covering athletics, eligibility, and resources available on campus. These programs draw together many campus elements and provide opportunities to discover all that Maine has to offer both academically and culturally.

### **Academic Support Counselors provide:**

- Discussion of goals and academic plans
- Ongoing academic eligibility, degree progress and NCAA certification
- Consultation for class registration
- First-year orientation programs
- Tutoring services
- Academic progress checks
- Individual meetings
- Monitored study hours

**Academic Progress Monitored.** The Athletic Academic Counseling staff monitors student-athletes' academic progress throughout their college careers to ensure academic success in their chosen degree programs. To enhance knowledge of progress throughout the semester, academic progress reports are sent to course instructors twice each semester. In addition, student athletes report grades regularly to their assigned counselor and receive information regarding their status in meeting University of Maine and NCAA academic requirements.

**Tutoring Services.** The Tutor Program provides free tutors for all University of Maine students who need academic assistance in 100 & 200 level courses. The Tutor Program's role is to help students "learn how-to-learn" course material and how to utilize the resources available on campus. Athletic Tutoring is also available through Academic Support Services as a supplement to class lecture and readings. Peer tutors meet student-athletes once or twice weekly to review course material, answer questions and prepare for upcoming exams.

**Services for Students with Disabilities.** The University of Maine Disability Support Services facilitates the education of any University of Maine stu-

dent with diagnosed physical or learning disabilities by providing a point of accommodation and services to enhance success. In collaboration with these services, student-athletes receive additional support from a learning disability specialist on the Academic Support staff. Student-athlete referrals are made on an individualized basis.

**Sezak Academic Center.** In addition to several computer clusters available to all University of Maine students, student-athletes have exclusive use of computers (PC and Macintosh) in the Sam and Ethel Sezak Academic Center. The facility was renovated in 2004 and air conditioning added in 2006. Computers in this facility are networked to the Fogler Library, campus intranet, and the Internet. Student-athletes take advantage by utilizing the Academic Center for obtaining required study table hours. In addition, ten IBM-compatible laptop computers are available to student-athletes to use when traveling to athletic competitions.

**Academic Achievement.** In addition to the many conference and national honors, each spring the athletic department honors Maine's Scholar Athletes, those student-athletes earning a 3.0 minimum GPA for the year. In 2006, a total of 172 student-athletes earned this distinction. In addition, 63 first-year students were honored as "Rising Stars" for earning a 3.0 or better in their first semester at Maine. The total of 239 honorees is the largest group in the history of the program, representing over 50% of the students who participate in Intercollegiate Athletics at Maine. In 2004, Maine was awarded the America East Academic Cup, representing the highest GPA among member schools with a 3.12 overall average. In 2005, Maine again posted a 3.12 overall GPA, finishing second in the conference. In 2006, Maine had a 3.11 overall GPA, again good for second in the conference.

## LIFE SKILLS

The goal of the life skills program is to assist student-athletes as students, citizens and aspiring professionals.

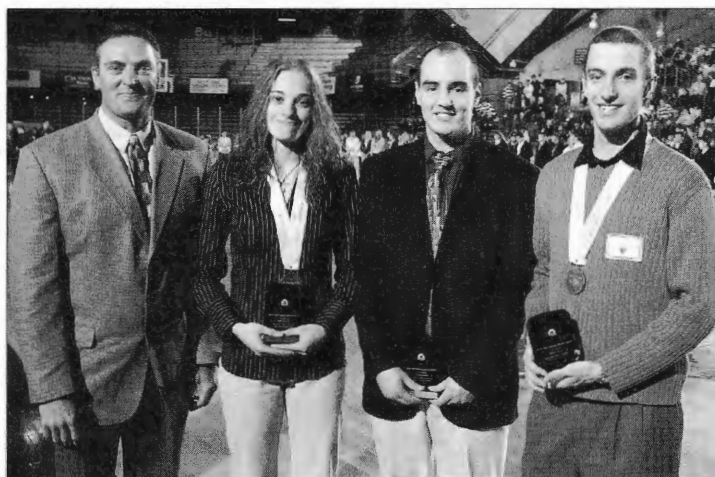
**Life Skills Seminars.** Student-athletes work with the Life Skills Coordinator and campus members to design and participate in life skills workshops covering a variety of areas: career development, team building, alcohol and drug education, and nutrition.

**Multicultural Programs.** The University of Maine and its Athletic Department have a commitment to supporting diversity within the campus community. A liaison relationship involving full-time staff members has developed between the Office of Multicultural Affairs and the Department of Athletics to promote an appreciation of diversity and to serve the student-athletes of different cultures.

**Student-Athlete Advisory Committee.** This organization is composed of members from each of the intercollegiate sports teams and meets with athletic and academic administrators regularly to help streamline and promote efficient communication between the athletic department administration and the student-athlete population. SAAC acknowledges the unique contribution student-athletes provide to the collegiate and community climate, and remains committed to positive involvement and excellence in each.

**Outreach.** Opportunities exist through the Community Outreach Program for student-athletes to gain public speaking experience while they give back to the community. Student-athletes speak at numerous schools and community groups during the year, including the "Winter Kids Program" which encourages 5<sup>th</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> graders to commit to fun and healthy winter lifestyles.

## SPORTS MEDICINE

College athletics places extreme physical demands on the players. To meet this reality, Maine has a highly respected sports medicine staff to help its student-athletes with any health related situation.

The Maine sports medicine team includes six full-time and one graduate assistant certified athletic trainers, a team physician, an orthopaedic physician, a wide variety of medical specialists and student athletic trainers. The Maine team physician, Dr. Craig W. Curtis, holds a doctor's clinics on campus four days per week, and the orthopaedic physician holds clinic once per week. In addition, a team podiatrist visits bi-monthly. Other specialists on the Maine athletic health care team include an optometrist, a chiropractor and a dentist.

The staff is headquartered in the Mike Kessock Sports Medicine Center, located in the Memorial Gymnasium, and houses some of the newest technology in the field of sports medicine. This facility, located inside Memorial Gym, serves all injury prevention, treatment and rehabilitation needs of the student-athlete.

The Cutler Student Health Center, located adjacent to Memorial Gym, also serves as an on-campus resource capable of handling x-rays and laboratory work for student-athletes.

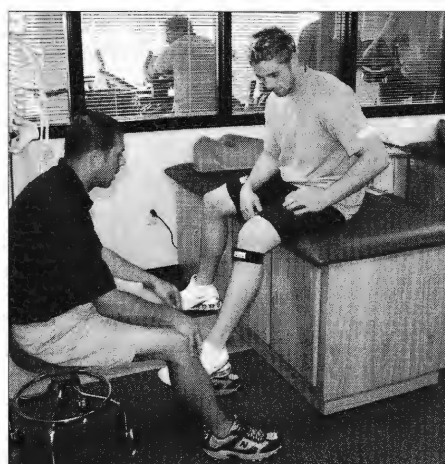
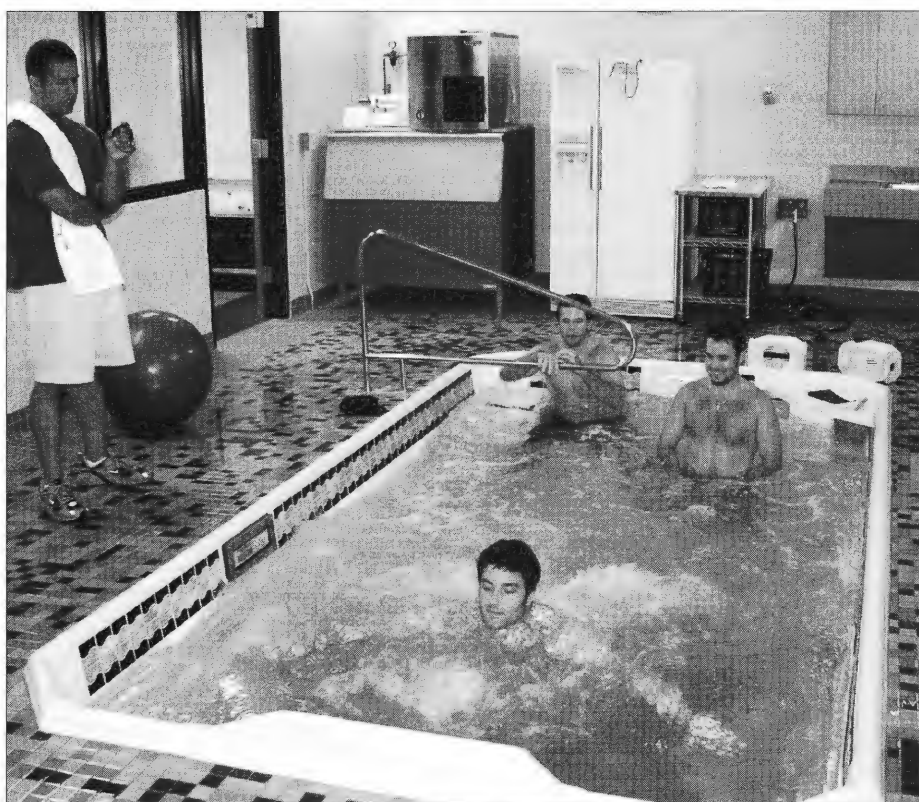
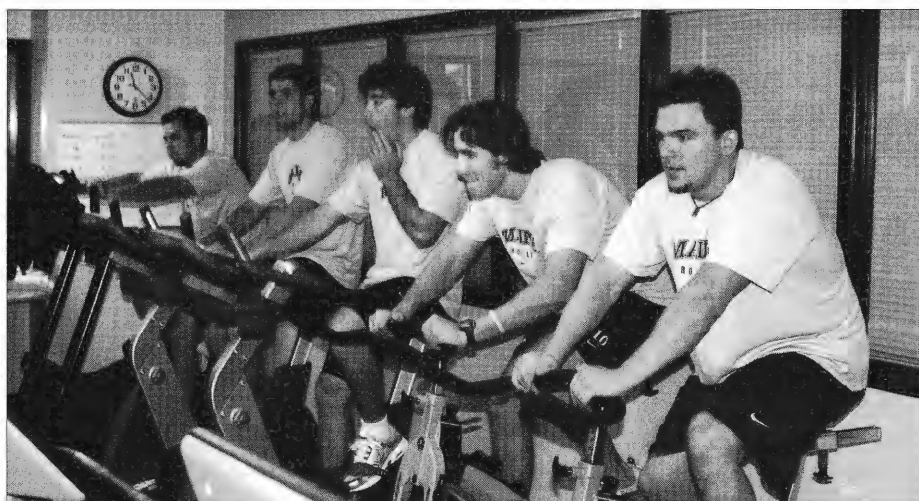
Maine hockey players will be treated this season in facilities located in the Shawn Walsh Hockey Center. The sports medicine facility is divided into two areas – a hydro room and a therapy room. The focal point of the hydro room is a Hydroworx 500 series therapy pool. The pool includes jets that provide a current for resistance training along with an underwater treadmill. Also included in the hydro room are two whirl-

pool tubs. The therapy room includes three treatment tables, two taping stations, and standard therapeutic modalities.

Prevention of injury is a primary focus of the athletic training staff. Black Bear ice hockey players are screened for conditions which could predispose them to injury and placed on programs to prevent these injuries.

If an injury does occur, the athlete is placed on a daily injury treatment and rehabilitation program designed to return the athlete to the ice as quickly and

safely as possible. Certified athletic trainers utilize the latest in treatment and rehabilitation techniques to aggressively return the athlete to competition. All Black Bear ice hockey players are supervised by a member of the sports medicine staff from the first day of rehabilitation until total recovery has occurred.

# STRENGTH AND CONDITIONING

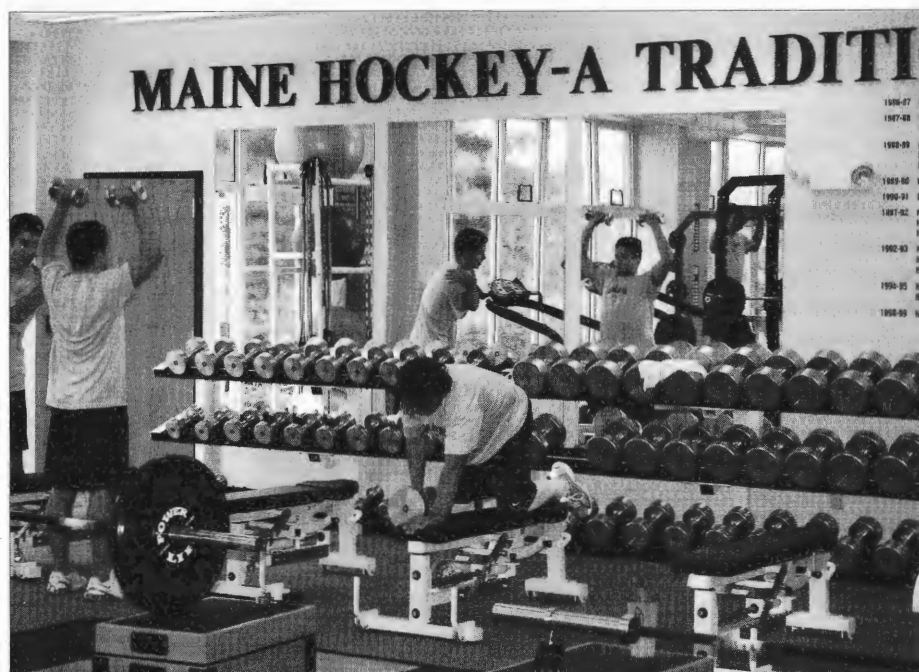
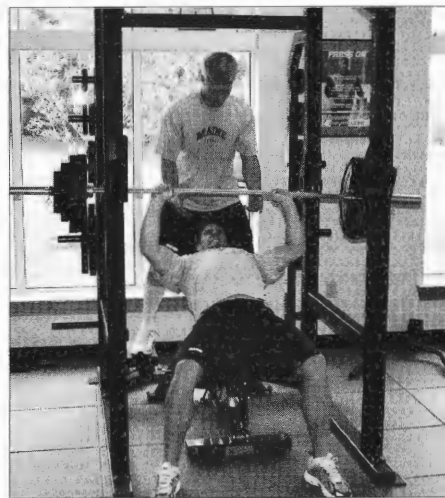
The Maine strength and conditioning program is a sophisticated blend of science, technology, nutrition, and one-on-one attention to each athlete. Maine ice hockey players make a year-round commitment to physically preparing to play their sport at the highest level.

That physical preparation addresses numerous components that are critical to athletic success, including strength, speed, power, agility, flexibility, metabolic conditioning, and motivation. The Maine strength and conditioning staff tailors a strength and conditioning program that matches the student-athlete's individual needs with the sport-specific physical demands.

Maine hockey players will train this season in the Shawn Walsh Hockey Center, which opened in 2005. The 2,000 square foot weightroom contains four multi-purpose power racks, four benches, custom-made dumbbells ranging from five to 100 pounds, four Olympic platforms with weights and bars, along with several selectorized machines. For cardiovascular work, six stationary bikes are provided, along with a stairmaster. A Woodway Force treadmill is also available, which provides a challenging workout with resistance. The area also includes room for a slideboard and plyometric training.

Maine hockey players can also use the Intercollegiate Athletic Strength Center, located in the Memorial Gymnasium. The physical elements of the Strength Center reflect the strength training and conditioning philosophy. The 1,600-square foot facility contains more than 8,000 pounds of weight, four multi-purpose power racks, four bench press stations, dumbbells ranging from five to 130 pounds, and numerous selectorized machines. A fully equipped plyometric training area is located just off the Strength Center.

In addition, the Latti Fitness Center is also used by the Black Bears. The 5,000-square foot facility, located in Memorial Gym next to Wallace Pool, was first dedicated on October 6, 1989, and has recently been completely renovated. A total of 28 state-of-the-art cardiovascular machines and numerous selectorized machines are available to supplement conditioning and rehabilitation. A new student recreation facility will open on campus in August of 2007.

# SHAWN WALSH HOCKEY CENTER

There is no doubt that Alford Arena is home to the greatest fans in college hockey. Anyone who has experienced the facility's big-game atmosphere knows how special a place Alford Arena is. It is this passion and enthusiasm that truly gives the Black Bears a home-ice advantage.

While this building remains one of the best places to see a college hockey game, some of its amenities have been improved. The University of Maine began construction on the Shawn Walsh Hockey Center in June of 2004. Locker rooms, office spaces, strength and conditioning areas, and the athletic training room were enhanced. These changes better the student-athlete experience, assist with continuing to draw high-caliber student-athletes to Maine, and provide current Black Bears the best training areas to prepare for competition. In addition, fan-friendly improvements to concession areas, the sound system, and Bear Necessities, along with a new Hockey Hall of Fame, complete the Alford Arena makeover.

In recognition of his accomplishments as a coach and the visionary of the program, the University of Maine dedicated this project in memory of Shawn Walsh. The Shawn Walsh Hockey Center at Alford Arena provides the program with the necessary improvements to continue to keep Black Bear hockey as one of the truly special programs in the country.

All funding for the project was privately raised. The lead donor was Harold Alford. In total, over 40 former men's ice hockey players made contributions to the Shawn Walsh Hockey Center. # HAROLD ALFOND SPORTS ARENA



One of the finest college hockey facilities in the country, the Harold Alfond Sports Arena has served the University community since 1977. Completed in February of that year, the building was dedicated by Mr. Alfond and officials of the University on November 18 at the Maine-Acadia hockey game. Alfond Arena was originally built with the generous contributions of more than 2,000 people, headed by Mr. Alfond.

In addition to being the home of the Black Bears men's ice hockey, women's ice hockey, men's basketball and women's basketball programs, the building is used by numerous hockey leagues, and for concerts and graduation ceremonies.

Thanks to the demand of sellout-after-sellout at the old capacity of 3,800 and a \$2 million gift from Mr. Alfond, Alfond Arena underwent a significant expansion project prior to the 1991-92 season.

Mr. Alfond's generous gift represented, at the time, the largest one-time (non-posthumous) cash contribution ever received by the University of Maine. Since 1968, Mr. Alfond has donated more than \$6.5 million to the University of Maine.

The construction provided an additional 1,200 seats to each side of the Arena, to increase the capacity to over 5,200 for hockey games. In 1998, additional luxury boxes were added giving the arena a capacity of 5,641. In 2006, the addition of six luxury boxes, along with changes to ADA-accessible seating resulted in a capacity of 5,592.

Included in the Arena expansion were additional concession areas and rest rooms, locker rooms, ticket offices, souvenir stands and improved media facilities. With the expansion, Alfond Arena also became the home of the Black Bear basketball teams, which had played home games at the Bangor Auditorium from 1988-91.

An addition to the south end of the Arena in 1988 houses the Black Bears' impressive locker room facility. Included in that expansion project was an attractive lounge for use by the hockey program and the university community.

In 1990, an office addition was completed, providing the coaching and administrative staffs much needed room. Entering the 1993-94 season, the Black Bears had played before standing-room-only crowds in 138 consecutive regular season games.

In 1995-96, Maine led Hockey East in total attendance for the fourth straight year. The Black Bears finished 10th in the nation in total attendance (104,176) and 11th in average attendance (5,483) in 2000-01. In 2003-04, Maine moved to 12th in overall attendance (104,599) and 11th in average attendance (5,505). Maine was third in Hockey East in total attendance during the last three seasons.

Prior to the 2005 season, renovations were completed during the construction of the Shawn Walsh Hockey Center that included renovated men's, women's, and visitor's locker rooms. Inside the arena, a new Hockey Hall of Fame, Bear Necessities and concessions areas were added to improve the fan experience at the Alfond.

# THIS IS HOCKEY EAST

Consistently labelled the strongest conference from top to bottom, the Hockey East Association, encompassing 10 established Division-I hockey programs, celebrates its 23rd season in 2006-07.

Hockey East has continued a steady rise to prominence since its founding charter on July 11, 1983, when the possibility of an apparent Ivy League break-off threatened the existence of the ECAC. In response, the Athletics Directors from Boston College, Boston University, New Hampshire, Northeastern and Providence announced the formation of a new Division I men's ice hockey conference. Together, William Flynn of Boston College, John Simpson of Boston University, Andy Mooradian of New Hampshire, Joe Zabalski of Northeastern and Lou Lamoriello of Providence launched Hockey East. Lamoriello assumed the role of the league's first commissioner.

Later that same summer, the Board of Directors added the University of Maine and the University of Lowell (now UMass Lowell). Official conference competition of the seven-team league began with the 1984-85 season, and expansion broadened the league to nine teams with the additions of Merrimack College (1989) and the University of Massachusetts (1993). The entry of the University of Vermont last season lifts the conference membership to 10 teams.

Since its inception, Hockey East has set new competitive standards for college hockey success, annually compiling an impressive collective winning percentage against non-conference opponents, including a record .705 during the 2002-03 frame. Over the last 14 seasons, Hockey East has cemented itself as the nation's most elite league, having earned 22 of the 56 berths in the NCAA Frozen Four championship tournament and boasting four NCAA title winners: the University of Maine in 1993 and 1999, Boston University in 1995 and Boston College in 2001. Three of the four Frozen Four participants in 1999 came from the Hockey East ranks.

However, it is the quality of its individual players as leading athletes that most sets Hockey East apart from the rest. A total of 54 Hockey East alums played in the NHL in 2005-06, and several enjoyed breakout seasons. Former BC captain Brian Gionta, the only player ever selected a Hockey East All-Star in four different seasons, exploded for 48 goals and 89 points as the New Jersey Devils' No. 1 sniper,

more than doubling his career totals. Paul Kariya, who gave Hockey East its first NCAA championship when he steered Maine's offense as a freshman in 1993, re-invigorated his career with an 85-point season with the Nashville Predators.

Hockey East has proven to be an equally strong presence off the ice. Both in the classroom and in the community, Hockey East athletes continue to demonstrate their commitment to overall excellence. The Hockey East All-Academic Team honored 61 student-athletes for outstanding academic achievement during the 2005-06 campaign. Hockey East athletes also make a tremendous impact on many community service programs across the region, volunteering with numerous youth hockey associations and community service organizations. Four Hockey East athletes have received the prestigious Hockey Humanitarian Award, two each from the men's and women's leagues, and six others have been finalists for the award.

The reach of Hockey East continues to grow as new state-of-the-art facilities are constructed, increasing capacities and amenities for college hockey fans. And the fans have responded — nearly a million spectators came out to watch Hockey East teams during the 2005-06 season, including a two-day total of 33,342 for the Hockey East championship at Boston's TD Banknorth Garden.

# TIM WHITEHEAD



**HEAD COACH • SIXTH SEASON • HAMILTON COLLEGE '85, MAINE '92**

Head Coach Tim Whitehead enters his sixth season at the helm of the University of Maine men's ice hockey program. With Whitehead behind the bench, the Black Bears have continued the success that has defined the program for nearly two decades.

In his first five seasons as head coach, the Black Bears have advanced to the NCAA Tournament all five seasons, reached the NCAA National Championship game twice, played in three NCAA Frozen Fours and won the Hockey East Tournament Championship. Over the five-year period, Maine has a 131-54-24 record. In ten seasons as a head coach, Whitehead has a career record of 207-149-35.

During the 2005-06 season, the Black Bears had the top penalty-kill in the nation and also had the fifth-ranked power play unit. The overall defense was fifth in the nation. In Hockey East play, Maine was 17-8-2 and finished tied for second in the standings. The team reached the Hockey East semifinals for the third straight season and earned a bid to their eighth straight NCAA Tournament.

In the NCAA Tournament, Maine defeated ECAC Tournament Champion Harvard 6-1 in the opening game. In the Regional Final, the Black Bears took a 3-0 lead against CCHA Tournament Champion Michigan State and won 5-4 to reach the Frozen Four. In the semifinals, Maine and Wisconsin were tied 1-1 after the first period, however the Badgers went on to a 5-2 win at the Bradley Center.

Following the season, Greg Moore was named a first team All-American and Michel Léveillé earned second team All-America honors. In addition, Greg Moore was named a finalist for the Hobey Baker Award. Moore was also a Hockey East First-Team All-Star, while Léveillé was named to the second team. Ben Bishop was named to the Hockey East All-Rookie Team, marking five straight seasons at least one Black

Bear has been named to the team. Whitehead was named a finalist for the Spencer Penrose Award for the third time in five seasons at Maine and fifth time his ten seasons as head coach.

Despite a slow start to the 2004-05 season, Maine went unbeaten in eight straight games in January. Key wins down the stretch of the season gave the Black Bears home ice in the Hockey East playoffs for the sixth straight season. Maine advanced to the Hockey East semifinals, where the Black Bears were defeated in double overtime by Boston College.

Maine advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the fifteenth time in school history. The Black Bears were up for the task of playing Minnesota on their home ice, as Jimmy Howard had 37 saves in the 1-0 overtime loss. Off the ice, the Black Bears were also successful as ten student-athletes were named to the Hockey East All-Academic team, the most in school history.

The 2003-04 season began with the Black Bears knocking off two-time defending National Champion Minnesota in the first game of the season and captured the Maverick Stampede Tournament title. After winning the first seven games of the season, the Black Bears were ranked first in the nation.

A loss at UMass-Lowell on February 27 set the stage for Maine's amazing run in the postseason. Beginning with a 4-3 overtime win in the season finale against Boston College, the Black Bears won eight straight one-goal games. The winning streak included a three-overtime thriller against Massachusetts in the Hockey East Championship, won by the Black Bears 2-1. Maine also pulled together for a 5-4 win over Harvard in the first round of the NCAA's, overcoming a three-goal deficit by scoring four goals in the third period. After an overtime win over Wisconsin, Maine faced Hockey East rival Boston College in the Frozen Four and came away with a 2-1 win. The season ended with a 1-0 loss to Denver in the National Championship game. The team led the NCAA in winning percentage and team defense on the season.

With the team's 33-8-3 record also came numerous individual honors, with Jimmy

Howard, Todd Jackson, Prestin Ryan and Colin Shields all earning second-team All-America honors, the most in a single season for Maine since the 1993 season. Howard was named Hockey East Tournament MVP, and Howard, Ryan, Shields and Jackson earned All-Hockey East honors. Michel Léveillé was named conference Rookie of the Year, Howard was named conference Goalie of the Year, Jackson was named Best Defensive Forward and Ryan was named Best Defensive Defenseman. Whitehead was named a finalist for the Spencer Penrose Trophy.

In addition to success on the ice, the Black Bears excelled during the 2003-04 season in the classroom. Maine led Hockey East with seven student-athletes named to the All-Academic Team. Goalie Frank Doyle was named the Top Scholar-Athlete in the conference with a 3.86 grade point average. Doyle and Todd Jackson both earned CoSIDA Academic All-District honors, with Doyle also earning CoSIDA All-America honors. Doyle was also named the 2004 "M" Club Dean Smith Award recipient.

In the 2002-03 season, the Black Bears started fast, compiling a 15-1-2 record before the New Year and was ranked first in either the *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* or U.S. College Hockey Online Poll for seven weeks. On the season, Maine posted a mark of 24-10-5.

Whitehead led Maine to the Black Bear Classic and Everblades College Hockey Classic Championships. Maine finished the regular season in third place in the Hockey East standings, just two points out of first place. The Black Bears earned their fifth-straight NCAA Tournament berth where they lost to



Michigan in the West Regional in Ann Arbor, Mich.

Honors for the team included Hockey East Rookie of the Year Jimmy Howard, and Hockey East first team members Martin Kariya and Francis Nault, while Lucas Lawson was named to the second team. Cliff Loya was named the Hockey East/Old Time Hockey Best Defensive Defenseman Award along with earning the New England Hockey Writers Association Outstanding Defenseman Award.

Whitehead's student-athletes had success in the classroom as well. Five student-athletes were named to the Hockey East All-Academic Team, while Kariya and Doyle received 2003 Verizon University Division Academic All-District I At-Large First Team honors. Kariya was named to the National Verizon Academic All-America Men's At-Large Division First Team and won his second-straight "M" Club Dean Smith Award as top scholar-athlete at Maine.

Whitehead returned to Maine for the 2001-02 season to serve as an assistant coach under head coach Shawn Walsh. When Walsh passed away on September 24, 2001, Whitehead was named interim coach. Following the season, Whitehead was introduced as the third head coach in Maine history on April 8, 2002.

In his first year with the Black Bears, Whitehead led the team to a record of 26-11-7, and finished as the NCAA finalists. The Black Bears finished tied for second in the Hockey East regular season, second in the Hockey East Tournament and advanced to the NCAA Championship game. In the process, Whitehead coached two Hockey East first team members in Mike Morrison and Peter Metcalf and two All-Americans in Metcalf and Niko Dimitrakos.

Whitehead recorded his 100th career victory against Harvard on March 23, 2002 in the NCAA East Regional in Worcester, Mass., with a 4-3 overtime victory. Whitehead, who won the American Hockey Coaches Association (AHCA) Spencer Penrose Award as the National Coach of the Year in 2002, finished as the runner-up for Hockey East Coach of the Year. Previously, Whitehead was honored as a finalist for the award in 1997 and 2001.

Whitehead came to Maine after serving as head coach of UMass-Lowell for five seasons where he compiled a record of 76-93-11, including a 19-16-3 record in 2000-01 in which the River Hawks advanced to the semifinals of the Hockey East Tournament with a win over New Hampshire. Prior to running the UMass-Lowell program, Whitehead spent five years as an assistant with the River Hawks under former Maine assistant Bruce Crowder. One of their players at UMass-Lowell was current Edmonton Oilers goalie Dwyane Roloson, who backstopped his team to the 2006 Stanley Cup playoffs.

Previously Whitehead served as an assistant at

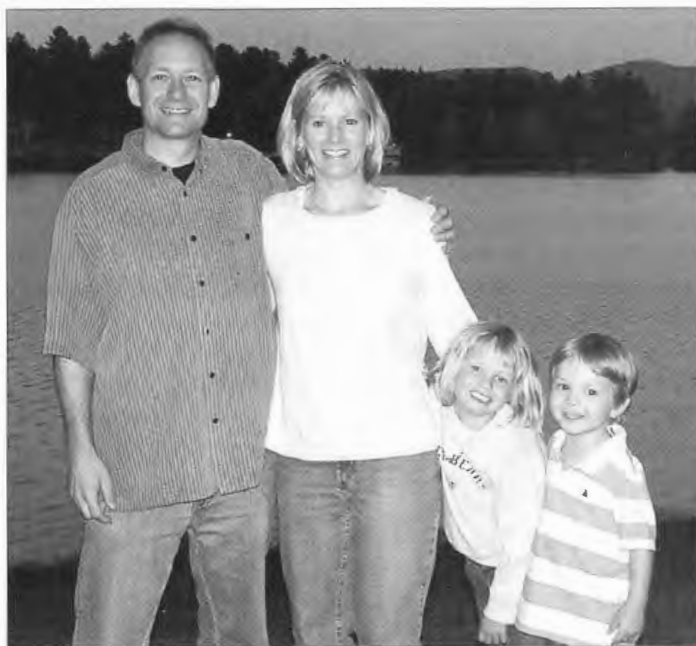
Maine in 1990-91 with Shawn Walsh. That team made it to the Hockey East Championship game and advanced to the semifinals of the NCAA Tournament. Maine finished the season with an impressive 32-9-2 mark; only four Black Bear hockey teams have won more games in a season.

Before coming to Maine, Whitehead spent two seasons as an assistant coach at Middlebury College, and played two seasons of professional hockey in Europe prior to that.

Whitehead graduated from Hamilton College in 1985 with a bachelor's degree in government, and earned his master's degree in education from the University of Maine

in 1991.

Whitehead and his wife Dena, are the parents of two children, a daughter, Natalie, 7, and a son, Zachary, 5.

## GUY PERRON

**ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH**

**FOURTH SEASON • MAINE '91**

Guy Perron returns to the bench of the men's ice hockey program after two successful seasons as the head coach of the Maine women's ice hockey team. Perron was named the Associate Head Coach by Tim Whitehead on July 28, 2006. Perron will be the primary recruiter for the Black Bears this season, which will be his fourth season overall on the coaching staff.



In two seasons he posted a 31-24-9 record as head coach of the women's team. The team set a school record for wins in a season as they went 17-9-6 in 2005-06. In his first season he led the Black Bears to a 14-15-3 record. He coached several players that received Hockey East All-Star honors, and his team led the league in Academic Honor Roll selections in 2004-05.

Perron served as a volunteer assistant with the Black Bear men's program in the 2003-04 season and was instrumental in leading Maine to a berth in the national championship game. He was also an assistant coach at Maine in 1991-92 and 1994-95 for Coach Shawn Walsh.

Perron was a four-year letter-winner with the Black Bears and served as captain in 1988-89 and 1989-90. He played in 136 career games, scoring 62 goals and adding 84 assists for 146 career points. He left Maine ranked ninth on both the school's career goals and career assists lists and seventh in career points. In his first season, Perron helped lead the Black Bears to their first of four consecutive trips to the NCAA Tournament.

Prior to his return to Maine, Perron coached the Chicago Freeze of the North American Hockey League where he was General Manager and Head Coach from 1997 through 2003. He compiled a record of 167-150-19 with the Freeze, while



leading them to the playoffs in each of his six seasons, and finishing third in the country (2001) behind the bench. Several member of the Freeze were drafted by NHL teams, including goalies Craig Henderson (Chicago) and Jason Bacashuiua (Dallas) and forward George Parros (Kings).

Before coaching the Chicago Freeze, Perron served as an assistant coach at Dartmouth College from 1995 through 1997. He also coached at Bangor High School from 1992-1994. In his rookie season, he was named Class A Coach of the Year after leading the Rams to the state playoffs. After graduation from Maine, Perron played professionally in Sweden at the Division I level before returning to the United States to accept a position at Maine.

Perron is a 1990 graduate of the University of Maine with a degree in education. He also has earned a masters in education administration from the University of Maine. Perron and his wife, Renee, reside in Bangor with their daughter Grace and son Jack.



## DAN KERLUKE

**ASSISTANT COACH**

**SECOND SEASON • MAINE '01**



Dan Kerluke begins his second season as an assistant coach for the Black Bears and the first as a full-time member of the staff. Kerluke played for Maine from 1997-2001 and was a member of the 1999 National Championship team.

Last season Kerluke served as volunteer assistant coach as the Black Bears advanced to the NCAA Frozen Four. He worked extensively with game video and also focused on face-offs.

Prior to Maine, Kerluke spent three seasons as head coach of the Bangor High School boy's ice hockey team. He led the team to the playoffs all three seasons, and in the 2004-05 season set numerous school records, including most wins and their first-ever regular season championship. Following Maine, he spent the 2001-02 season playing in the WCHL. He played in 14 games with the Idaho Steelheads and then went on to play in 49 games with the Fresno Falcons as they won the WCHL Championship.

In four seasons with the Black Bears, Kerluke played in 152 games. He scored 54 goals, including ten game-winners, and added 54 assists for 108 total points. As a senior in 2000-01, he posted nine goals and nine assists in 39 games played. In 1999-2000, he played in 39 games and had twelve goals and 14 assists. Kerluke earned Hockey East Academic Team honors and Maine Scholar Athlete honors. He was named Hockey East Player of the Week on March 6 after scoring three straight goals in a 3-2 win at Providence. During the 1998-99 season, he played in 41 games with 23 goals and 19 assists for 42 points. He tallied points in all four NCAA Tournament games, including an assist in the National Championship game. As a freshman, he scored ten goals and had twelve assists in 33 games played.

Anative of Brampton, Ontario, Kerluke is a 2001 graduate of the University of Maine with a degree in New Media. Kerluke resides in Bangor with his wife, Cristina, who works for the Maine Athletic Department in Academic Support.

Jack Semler was the first men's ice hockey coach of the modern era. What began as a club team entered NCAA play in 1977 in the ECAC, NCAA Division II. After winning 25 games in the second season, Maine moved up to Division I for the 1979-80 season and he earned New England Coach of the Year honors. Overall, he posted a 105-112-2 record as head coach.

Shawn Walsh took over the Maine hockey team in 1984 and in the matter of a few short years turned the program into a national powerhouse. The Black Bears won the school's first national championship in 1992-93 and once again in 1998-99 took home the nation's top honors. He was named Hockey East Coach of the Year four times and National Coach of the Year in 1994-95. Walsh passed away on September 24, 2001.
