Report of Superintendent of Schools

N.o 1—LONGFELLOW SCHOOL.

Miss Emma E. Jones, taught the spring and fall terms, with the usual satisfactory results. Miss Jones decided not to return for the winter school, to the regret of her pupils, and many friends here. Her long connection, thirteen terms and faithful service in this school have obtained results only acquired by earnest, persistent and painstaking work. Waldo V. Andrews, a student at Bates college, was engaged to teach the winter school. Mr. Andrews had had no previous experience as a teacher but he proved to be the "right man in the right place," maintaining good order and advancing the school work satisfactorily.

Spring term: number of pupils registered 28, average 20, number of pupils not absent for the term 2, number of visits by citizens 7.

Fall term: number of pupils registered 25, average 19, number not absent for the term 6, number of visitors 14.

Winter term: number of pupils registered 26, average 21, number of pupils not absent for the term 7, visit by citizens 11.

No. 2—McKINLEY SCHOOL.

Miss Ethel C. Tobey of Augusta taught the spring term. Miss Tobey is a graduate of the Cony high school and a good scholar and worked faithfully for the advancement of the pupils. This was Miss Tobey's first school. The fall and winter schools were taught by Miss Florence A. McKenney of Augusta. Miss McKenney's work was very satisfactory for a young teacher, this being her first school.

Spring term: number of pupils, registered 11, average 88, two pupils, not absent for the term, number of visits by citizens 9.

Fall term: number of pupils registered 9, average 83, one pupil not absent for the term, number of visitors 6.

Winter term: number of pupils registered 9, average 76, number of visitors 13.

No. 4—WASHINGTON SCHOOL.

Frank H. Williams, taught this school for the entire year. His work has been very satisfactory here, this being his fifth term. It is gratifying to be able to say that this school has changed very

much for the better within the last two years, indeed it is, now one of our best schools.

Spring term: number of pupils registered 20, average 18, seven pupils not absent for the term, number of visitors 42.

Fall term: number of pupils registered 25, average 22, eight pupils not absent for the term, number of visitors 21.

Winter term: number of pupils registered 27, average 19, two pupils not absent for the term.

No. 6—LINCOLN SCHOOL.

This school was very fortunate in having Miss Elsie S. Jones, for a teacher. Miss Jones, is one of our best teachers working in and out of school for the advancement of her pupils. Miss Izetta Royal was secured for the fall and winter terms. Miss Royal had taught previously several term, here, giving entire satisfaction. It is needless to state that the past two terms, were equally satisfactory.

Spring term: number of pupils registered 20, average 16, two pupils not absent for the term, number of visitors 12.

Fall term: number of pupils registered 22, average 20, pupils not absent for the term 4, number of visits by citizens 7.

Winter term: number of pupils registered 24, average 19, one pupil not absent for the term, number of visits by citizens 5.

The school-year just closed will compare favorably with those immediately preceding. While all of the schools have not been up to the high average which we could wish, the general average has been good.

The liberal appropriation of last year enabled us to have an increased amount of schooling.

An equal amount should be had this year. Six pupils are attending the Cony high school at Augusta, and two the Grammar school. Number of persons in town of school age, 146.
