## IMPORTANT

All taxpayers should read the following requirement and comply with it.

### Section 70, Chapter 180, Public Laws 1933

“Before making an assessment, the Assessors shall give seasonable notice in writing to the Inhabitants, by posting notifications in some public place in Town, or shall notify them, in such other ways as the Town at its Annual Meeting directs, to make and bring in to them true and perfect lists, of their polls and all their estates, real and personal, not by law exempt from taxation, of which they were possessed on the first day of April of the same year. If any resident owner, after such notice, or any non-resident owner after being reasonably requested thereto by the assessors, does not bring in such lists, he is thereby barred of his right to make application to the Assessors, or the County Commissioners for any abatement of his taxes, unless he offers such list with his application and satisfies them that he was unable to offer it at the time appointed. The request upon non-resident owners may be proved by a notice sent by mail directed to the last known address of the taxpayer or given by any other method that brings notice home to the taxpayer.”

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## **Millinocket School Health Service**

To the Citizens of the Town of Millinocket:

I hereby submit my report of the School Health Service for the year February 1, 1938 to February 1, 1939.

In the spring Drs. Stevens, Grumley and Young vaccinated 130 students.

The twenty-nine students reacting from the Tuberculin Test in 1937, were re-X-rayed. Only twenty-three needed to have an examination of their lungs by Dr. Cromwell. All had improved. These are all under supervision as to diet, and twenty-nine X-rays have been provided from Christmas Seal Sale money as a routine check-up.

Seven students were taken to Bangor to the Orthopedic Clinic; only one is to continue under supervision.

Forty-five students had tonsils and adenoids removed during the year; three were taken for special eye examination to Dr. Moulton in Bangor; ninety-five have had their eyes examined by Mr. Leavitt, the Red Cross and other organizations have paid for several pair of glasses.

The routine health examination was given this fall, and this year, the 500 high school students had their throats examined as well as their eyes.

The physicians and dentists have examined throats and teeth, and, this year, the teeth are in better condition which will mean more Seven Point students. We are grateful to the Maine Public Health Association, the teachers and Mrs.

Charles Carrier and her helpers for their assistance with the sale of the Christmas health seals, Santa Claus buttons and pencils which has made possible much dental work for our children, who are Tuberculosis contacts.

From July, 1938 to date there have been eleven cases of scarlet fever reported, and, during the fall, quite a few cases of whooping cough.

The four accidents in the school yard have had the necessary surgical attention, and the nurse has cared for the many slight injuries, in the office.

Dr. Butler from Bangor examined fifty-five students at the Hard of Hearing Clinic held in May. 155 home calls were made in connection with this group.

Over 200 home calls have been made by the nurse.

The junior high school students were examined by a physician from the State Department of Health for signs of nutritional deficiency which shows in the gums. Sixty were found to have more or less trouble, which will respond to corrected diet containing vitamin C.

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## Report of Health Officer

To the Selectmen and Citizens of Millinocket:

The past year has been a fairly quiet one due as in the past to supervision by nurse, teachers and superintendent, in co-operation with Health Officer and I thank them.

It is only in this way that contagious diseases can be kept under control, any letting up might start an epidemic costly in lives as well as money. Am glad to say that the parents have improved in reporting cases. At the beginning of the school year all scholars were examined for Scabies, Impetigo, Ringworm, Herpes, etc; not reportable, but contagious.

Many children were brought to my office, diagnosis made and if necessary removed from school.

During March, April and May 101 cases of Measles and in June 4 more, making 105 reported. Chicken Pox 23, Pneumonia 16, Whooping Cough 21, Scarlet Fever 12 sporadic cases. Most in one month 4. Of course, many more not reported of Chicken Pox and Whooping Cough in particular. It should be remembered that non-reporting is illegal and subject to fine.

A few nuisances (6) reported and corrected.

The usual Spring Cleanup will be carried out.

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## REPORT OF BUDGET COMMITTEE

*To the Citizens of the Town of Millinocket:*

At the last Annual Town Meeting, the Moderator was given authority to appoint a Budget Committee of fifteen and a Secretary for 1939. As two of those appointed are out of town, the signatures of the entire original Committee do not appear on this report.

The procedure of the Committee was similar to that of the past few years, in that three meetings were open to the public, at which all citizens were invited to discuss, suggest, and make recommendations to the Committee on all phases of the Town's affairs. A special effort was made this year to inform all voters of the dates and purposes of these meetings. The suggestions made, and appropriations asked for at these gatherings, have been given careful consideration by the Committee, and any change in recommendations is explained in the following paragraphs. We also submit a tabulation of the Town Accounts, with such explanatory notes as necessary.

The Administration General is a new account to take the place of the Selectmen's Office, which has been closed out into the new Account.

For advertising the Natural Resources of Millinocket, \$500 is recommended, with the understanding that it is to be spent under the direction of the Chamber of Commerce.

At the Public Meeting, the proposition of a new Armory was very strongly presented. This proposal is that the Town furnish \$10,000, and the State of Maine \$25,000, to build in Millinocket a new \$35,000 Armory, to be fully maintained by the State at no further cost whatever to the Town. This building would include an Auditorium which, according to statements presented, would be available to the Town at any time for Town Meetings, voting, or any Municipal purpose. As the State builds only one Armory each

year, there is no definite decision at the time this report is written, that it would be awarded to Millinocket. Therefore, the Budget Committee recommends, by a vote of eleven to one, that this proposition of a new Armory be accepted, and that the Town Treasurer, with the approval of the Selectmen, be authorized to borrow up to \$10,000 for the Town's share of said Armory, if and when the State decides to build here. We also recommend that \$300 be raised for maintenance on the old Armory until a new building is secured.

On the Aviation Field Account there is no appropriation recommended as the balance is more than last year's disbursements.

For the Care of the Poor, \$20,000 is recommended as in the past few years, with the understanding that if necessary funds from the Miscellaneous Account may be transferred. The Committee also recommends that \$5,000 be raised for an Account to be known as Work Relief Account, to take the place of the old Special Account—Emergency. These, together with the \$20,000 already borrowed under Notes Payable—Permanent Loan, should be sufficient.

In general, the recommendations for the various School Accounts have followed the amounts asked for by your School Superintendent and School Committee in their 1939 forecast, which are somewhat higher than for the previous year.

The Dependent Children Guardians recommendation is \$2,000, as this, with the 1938 balance of \$747.10, gives a total available of more than last year's disbursements.

The recommendations for Memorial Library Accounts have followed the requests of the Library Committee, as their report on increased use of Library facilities warrants full continuation of this service.

For several years, the Millinocket Band appropriation has been \$700, being stepped up last year to \$900 because of extra expense for uniforms. This year the Committee recommends \$700 as in those previous years.

As stated in the Care of the Poor Account, \$20,000 was borrowed during the year under Notes Payable—Permanent Loans, and it is therefore necessary to raise \$20,000 to retire this loan.

Under Pensions for the Blind, \$100 is recommended as there is at present a balance in this account. If more funds are necessary, it is suggested to transfer the \$100 balance from the Third Class Roads Maintenance Account which, with no third class roads, has no demand on it.



An additional \$200, or a total of \$1,400, is recommended for the Public Health Nurse, in order to employ a part-time Assistant, as requested by the Millinocket Nursing Association.

For the Sourdnhunk Road Account, \$1,000 is recommended for maintenance, as there is being more of this made each year into permanent highway, and the Committee feels that money expended on the rest should be confined to maintenance.

Street Lighting recommendation has followed the amount as charged by the Light Company. A sub-committee has been appointed to investigate before Town Meeting any further lights necessary.

The Swimming Pool recommendation has been stepped up \$150 over last year, or to \$850, to cover the cost of a Red Cross worker at the Pool, as requested by that Committee.

The War Veterans and Dependents Relief Account has in the past been financed from the Miscellaneous Account, so no recommendation is necessary.

For W. P. A. Projects—Various, the Committee recommends \$7,500. It is further suggested that if more funds are necessary, up to \$2,500 may be transferred from the Excise Tax Account. Projects in view are the Airport, new Tomb, and the possibility of Sewers and Sidewalks as discussed under those subjects in this report.

The proposition of a new Fire Station was presented to the Budget Committee by Chief Picard, and tentative plans made with an estimate of \$30,000 complete and equipped. This brick building, approximately 60 feet by 70 feet, and containing Fire Apparatus Room, Chief's office, Dormitory, assembly hall and prisoner's cells, would face on Aroostook Avenue, immediately back of present wooden structure. The Committee, by a ballot of nine to three, recommends that the Town vote to build this Fire Station, and finance it in this manner: \$15,000 to be raised this year; remainder borrowed as follows:—one \$5,000 note for one year, one \$5,000 note for two years, balance on a note for three years, with an agreement with the lender that these notes could be called earlier if the Town wishes. The Town Treasurer, with approval of Selectmen, to borrow at the best available rate of interest.

The increased use of the present Police Wagon as an ambulance, especially for trips to Bangor, was brought up at a Public Meeting by Chief Picard, and request made that the purchase of a regular ambulance be considered. The Committee recommends that the

Town vote to buy an Ambulance, and that \$2,000 be raised to buy and completely equip the same. The Committee will report further on this at Town Meeting.

The Storm Sewer requested for Highland Avenue was estimated to be built in two sections. The North one would have inlets at the corner of Maine and Bates Streets, corner of Bates and Highland Avenue, and on Highland Avenue where East Terrace starts off. This section would have a discharge line down the hill into the storm sewer built on Penobscot Avenue in 1930, which was built with 24 inch tile with this in view. The South section would have inlets on both sides of Colby Street at Highland Avenue, and one half-way between Colby and Bates. This would carry down the hill and discharge into the end of storm sewer built on Penobscot Avenue in 1931. Your Committee makes the following recommendation:—that the Town raise the sum of \$3,350, same to be expended on the North section as a Town project, or for the material of both North and South section if a W. P. A. project can be obtained on this by the Selectmen. If no W. P. A. is available, the Committee recommends that the South section be built by the Town the following year.

For Sidewalk Construction, the Committee recommends that \$500 be raised, same to be expended on School Street as a Town project, or for the material of both School Street and Maine Avenue if a W. P. A. project can be obtained on this by the Selectmen.

An article for the purchase of Uniforms for the Stearns High School Band, not to exceed \$600, has received the approval of the Committee. It is recommended that this amount be taken from the Miscellaneous Account.

It is further recommended by the Committee that in the future, local merchants be given an opportunity to bid on purchases to be made by any department of the Town, which those merchants are in a position to furnish.

The overdraft of \$53.07 in Administration General, and of \$163.00 in the Firemen Account should be appropriated to properly balance those Accounts.

The Budget Committee, and especially the Secretary, wish to thank the Board of Selectmen, the Selectmen's Office force, Heads of Departments, and all others who have so willingly assisted in the work of the Committee. We also wish to express appreciation to the Municipal Court for the use of the Court Room for the meetings.

*In Conclusion*—If the Town votes to accept the recommendations of the Budget Committee as herein submitted, and the State and County taxes and Town valuation remain approximately the same as last year, the tax rate for 1939 will be about \$67.00 per \$1,000. As this is considerable higher than other recent years, it is sincerely hoped that this figure may not be exceeded.

## AUDITOR'S CERTIFICATE

To the Citizens of Millinocket:

SELECTMEN: A detailed examination has been made of all records in the Selectmen's Office in connection with business transactions during the fiscal year ended January 31, 1939. All vouchers and warrants were duly approved by the Board of Selectmen. Special scrutiny was given vouchers covering transactions in which members of the Administrative group had a personal interest, and under this category I



discussed with the Board, expenditures charged to the town by members of the Board for traveling expenses as follows:

It was explained that some of these trips were made in connection with emergency cases requiring immediate hospital care. It might be desirable that the taxpayers fix a rate per mile to be hereafter charged, if this type of expense is to continue.

**TREASURER:** All cash received has been properly accounted for; and disbursements were made only upon approved warrants. At the time of the audit the entire cash fund was in the bank and this was found to be in agreement with the cash account on the general books kept in the Selectmen's Office.

The Treasurer's records were accurate in every respect and exceptionally well kept.

**TAX COLLECTOR:** The total tax commitment has been fully accounted for by your Collector through:

- (a) Cash turned over by him to the Treasurer.
- (b) Abatement orders issued by the Selectmen.
- (c) Uncollected taxes listed in another part of this report.

Furthermore, he has turned over to the Treasurer, interest collected from those who paid their taxes after August 15, 1938, also amounts collected upon taxes due from taxpayers for prior years.

A detailed audit of Automobile Excise Tax was made and the Collector has fully accounted for all collections.

Upon the day next following audit of his accounts he transferred all town funds in his possession, to the Town

Treasurer.

**PERMANENT SCHOOL FUND:** In this fund are both Cash and Bonds. The Cash is in a savings account in Millinocket Trust Co., and at the close of the fiscal year amounted to \$1,215.08. The Bonds are kept in a safe-deposit box at Millinocket Trust Co. and have an aggregate par value of \$10,000.00. They matured April 1, 1924.

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## COMMENTS BY SELECTMEN

*To the Citizens of the Town of Millinocket—*

This year as well as for the past ten years relief and unemployment are the two major problems confronted by this office and, of course, the country at large. The cost of Care of Poor for the past year, for State, Town and Other Towns is \$11,059.20 over and above 1937. This is an average cost of not quite \$1,000. per month more than in 1937. You will note that the Poor Account has again been broken down to show Board, Room and Care items which further reduce the sundries column. You will also note that medical aid this year is far in excess of what it was in 1937.

There are twenty-five people sixty-five years of age or

over who receive Old Age Assistance. Strange as it may seem our Care of Poor Account is not benefited accordingly because the majority of those who are receiving Old Age Assistance have not in the past received aid from the town. Of the twenty-five Old Age Assistance cases pending we expect to receive more benefit by way of Care of Poor Account.

The town has three WPA Projects in operation: Sewing Project, Airport Project and Millinocket - Brownville Road Project. These projects employ a total of 115. This number, we understand will be further reduced.

There has been approximately 4,330 feet of storm sewers constructed, including Elm Street, Penobscot Avenue and Spruce Street Sewers. Also approximately 500 feet of sidewalk was constructed on the Medway Road.

The only project pending and approved is the Tomb Project which we expect will be started as soon as the weather is permissable. The project is a very worthy one and much credit is due Mr. E. B. Reed, Jr. for his very sincere interest.

The amount of money expended by the Federal Government for WPA Projects for the calendar year of 1938 is as follows:

Because of circumstances over which we had no control it has been necessary to rent a power shovel for which we are paying \$700. per month, this amount to be applied on purchase price if the town votes to purchase same. In order to find a company who would rent us a shovel under those conditions we had to sign a contract for a four month's period. If the town votes to purchase the shovel the \$2,800. may be applied to the purchase price, otherwise it has cost the town \$2,800. for four month's rental, which is a very high rental.

It is the opinion of the Selectmen that a sum of money should be raised this year or some future year to abate taxes which are carried on our books as far back as 1925.

Early in 1938 we realized that in order to save money for the town it would be necessary to transport patients to and from Bangor by automobile. In order to establish a rate we referred to the Revised Statutes of Maine, Chapter 126, Sections 4 and 24, which reads in part: Section 4; For travel actually performed xxxxx ten cents per mile each way from the officer's residence to place of service xxxxx by the usual traveled routes with all reasonable sums paid for boat hire, ferriage and for crossing any toll bridge xxxxx. Section 24; In cases not expressly provided for, the fees of all public officers, for any official service, shall be at the same rate as are prescribed in this Chapter for like service.

With this rate allowed by law we established a rate of ten cents per mile to be paid for the use of an automobile and this rate has been adhered to all the year. All travel has been with the knowledge and consent of the full board.

In conclusion the Selectmen wish to express to the citizens of Millinocket their appreciation of their cooperation.

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the Inhabitants of the town of Millinocket, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at the

ARMORY BUILDING in said town on Monday, the Sixth (6th) day of March, A. D. 1939, at Nine (9) o'clock in the forenoon to act on the following articles, to wit:

Article 1. To choose by ballot a Moderator to preside at the said meeting.

Art. 2. To choose by ballot, according to the provisions of Sections thirty-eight (38) to fifty-two (52) inclusive, of Chapter Five (5) of the Revised Statutes of Maine, 1930, three Selectmen, who shall be Assessors and Overseers of the Poor, a Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, Collector of Taxes, Road Commissioner, one member of the Superintending School Committee for three years, Chief of the Fire Department, and Auditor. The Polls for the Election of these officers will be open at Nine (9) o'clock in the forenoon and close at Seven (7) o'clock in the afternoon.

Art. 3. To see if the town will vote to elect or to have the Moderator appoint a Budget Committee. Also, to fix the number of members and their term of office.

Art. 4. To see if the town will vote to charge interest on all taxes remaining unpaid after a specific time. Also, to fix such rate and time.

Art. 5. To see if the town will vote to allow an abatement to be made to those who voluntarily pay their taxes to the Collector or Treasurer at certain periods, and the time within which they are so entitled. Also, to see if the town will vote to fix the rate for said abatements.

Art. 6. To choose a Sewer Commissioner for the ensuing year.

Art. 7. To see if the town will vote to fix the salary of the Road Commissioner for the ensuing year.

Art. 8. To see if the town will vote to continue the Free High School as established.

Art. 9. To see if the town will vote to grant and raise such sums of money as may be necessary.

Art. 10. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) to pay for Permanent Loans negotiated during the fiscal year ending January 31, 1939.

Art. 11. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of One Hundred and Sixty-three Dollars (\$163.00) to pay overdraft in the Firemen Account.

Art. 12. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of Fifty-seven Dollars and Three cents (\$57.03) to pay overdraft in the Administration-General Account.

Art. 13. To see if the town will vote to employ a School Nurse. Also, to see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise for the same.

Art. 14. To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise to be expended on the Sourdnahunk Road between the Bangor & Aroostook Railroad Station and Spencer's Carry, so-called.

Art. 15. To see what sum of money the town will appropriate for State Aid road construction, in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges, under the provisions of Section 19, Chapter 28, Revised Statutes of 1930, or under the provisions of Section 3, Chapter 229, Public Laws of 1937.

Art. 16. To see if the town will vote to grant and raise a sum of money for the maintenance of the State Aid Highway, according to the provisions of Sections 18, 37, and 38 of Chapter 28 of the Revised Statutes of 1930. Also, to see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise for the same.

Art. 17. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Municipal Officers of the town of Millinocket to petition the State Highway Commission on or before November 1, 1939, under the provisions of Sections fifty-two (52) and fifty-three (53) of Chapter twenty-eight (28) of the Revised Statutes of Maine, 1930, to lay out a winter route over the State Highway which begins at the Millinocket Stream Bridge and extends towards Mattawamkeag to the town line. Also, to see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise to pay for the same.

Art. 18. To see if the town will vote to establish and establish a rate percent for the collection of taxes, or fix a salary for the same, for the ensuing year.

Art. 19. To see if the town will authorize the town treasurer, with the approval of the Selectmen, to hire as temporary loans this current fiscal year, such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges and to pay town notes and bonds becoming due, and for these purposes to issue and negotiate notes of the town to be paid during the year, in which said loans are made, out of money raised during such current year by taxes, said loans not to exceed an amount in the aggregate the total tax levy for the preceding municipal year, less the total amount of temporary loans previously authorized to be made in anticipation of this current year's taxes, and to ratify said loans.

Art. 20. To see what sum of money, if any, the town will vote to authorize the town treasurer, with the approval of the Selectmen, to hire as a temporary loan after February 1, 1940, and before our next annual town meeting, to meet current expenses accruing at that time, and for this purpose, authorize said town treasurer, with the approval of the Selectmen, to issue and negotiate notes of the town to the amount of said loan; said temporary loan to be paid during the year 1940 out of money to be raised during such current year by taxes.

Art. 21. To see if the town will vote to authorize the town treasurer, with the approval of the Selectmen, to hire as permanent loans such sums of money as may be necessary to pay for Care of Poor during the remainder of this current fiscal year, and for this purpose to issue and negotiate notes of the town to be paid during the fiscal year 1940.

Art. 22. To see if the town will vote to delegate to the Board of Selectmen, or to some other Board or Committee, the right to exercise the powers granted in Sections One (1) and Five (5) of Chapter 213, of the Public Laws of Maine, 1931, relative to Municipal Airport, the maintenance, operation, and regulation of same.

Art. 23. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen on behalf of the town to sell and dispose of any real estate acquired by the town for non-payment of taxes thereon, on such terms as they deem advisable, and to execute quitclaim deeds for such property.

Art. 24. To see if the town will vote to enter into an agree-



ment with the Millinocket Water Company for a supply of water for fire protection and other municipal purposes. Also, to see if the town will vote to enter into said agreement in accordance with the terms and specifications of a form of agreement which will be submitted to the meeting, or what terms and specifications said agreement shall contain. Also, to see what duration of time shall be covered by said agreement. Also, to see if the town will authorize and direct its Selectmen to sign and execute such agreement for and in behalf of said town with said Millinocket Water Company.

Art. 25. To see if the town will vote to fix the salary of the Selectmen, Assessors, and Overseers of the Poor, the Town Clerk, the Town Treasurer, the Town Auditor, the Health Officer, the Chief of the Fire Department, the Fire and Building Inspector, the Sealer of Weights and Measures, and the Milk Inspector, for the ensuing year. Also, to fix said salaries.

Art. 26. To see what action the town will take relative to building a new Fire Station. Also what sum of money will be raised toward the cost of said building.

Art. 27. To see if the town will vote to buy an Ambulance, to be operated as a part of the Police Department. Also what sum of money the Town will raise to pay for same.

Art. 28. To see what action the town will take on constructing a new Armory, if the State of Maine elects to build one in Millinocket. Also to see if the town will authorize the town Treasurer, with the approval of the Selectmen, to borrow up to \$10,000 for the town's share of said building, if and when the State decides to build here.

Art. 29. To see if the town will raise the sum of \$3,350 for Storm Sewer on Highland Avenue, same to be expended on the North section as a town project, or for the material of both North and South sections if a W. P. A. project can be obtained on this by the Selectmen.

Art. 30. To see if the town will raise the sum of \$500 for Sidewalk Construction, same to be expended on School Street as a town project, or for the material of both School Street and Maine Avenue if a W. P. A. project can be obtained on this by the Selectmen.

Art. 31. To see what action the town will take toward the purchase of uniforms for the Stearns High School Band, at a cost not to exceed \$600. This amount to be taken from the

Miscellaneous Account.

Art. 32 To see what action the town will take relative to publishing the town By-Laws and Ordinances.

Art. 33 To see what action the town will take relative to purchasing a power shovel. Also, to see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise for the same.

Art. 34 To see if the town will vote to install a street light in front of Peter Mayo's house on the "Medway Road", so-called. Also, to raise a sufficient sum of money to pay for the same.

Art. 35 To see if the town will vote to elect and elect a Park or Tree Commissioner.

Art. 36 To choose all other town officers for the ensuing year.

Art. 37 To see if the town will vote to accept the report of the Municipal Officers for the fiscal year ending January 31, 1939.

Art. 38 To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The Selectmen give notice that they will be in session at the Selectmen's Office in Millinocket, in the "Gonya Block," so-called, on Thursday, Friday and Saturday, the Second (2nd), Third (3rd), and Fourth (4th) days of March, A. D. 1939, from Nine (9) o'clock in the forenoon to Five (5) o'clock in the afternoon, for the purpose of correcting the list of voters in said town, and hearing and deciding on applications of those claiming the right to have their name upon said lists.
