# **Guest Speakers**

Lisa Liberatore kicked off the semester with Matt Donahue, Vice President and

Chief Impact Officer at Heart of Maine United Way, in both sections of her MGT 101. He explained what nonprofits are and their importance in the fabric of society.

Dr. Robert A. "Bob" Strong talked to students in Dr. Lobe's Financial Strategy class (FIN 353) and SPIFFY members about portfolio objectives and portfolio management practices.
