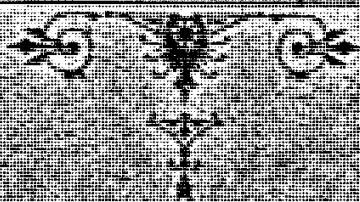

PERAMBULATION OF TOWN LINES.

Warrant for Annual Town Meeting.

To E. W. Ross, Constable of the Town of North Yarmouth, in the County of Cumberland.

Greeting:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of North Yarmouth qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to meet at the Town House in said Town, on Monday, the twelfth day of March, A. D. 1906 at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act on the following articles, to wit:

- Art. 1 To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.
- Art. 2 To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- Art. 3 To hear and act on the reports of the Town Treasurer, Selectmen, Overseers of the Poor, and Superintendent of Schools.
- Art. 4 To hear the report of the Trustees of the School Fund and vote how the money shall be expended.
- Art. 5 To choose all such officers as are required by law to be chosen in the month of March annually.
- Art. 6 To raise money for the support of Schools, and of the Poor, for the repair of Roads, Bridges, and Schoolhouses, for the care of Cemeteries, for payment of Town Officers, for Text Books, High School tuition, Interest, and Contingencies.

- Art. 7 To see what sum of money the town will raise for insurance, apparatus, appliances, and other school supplies.
- Art. 8 To receive accounts against the town, and raise money for such as may be allowed.
- Art. 9 To see if the town will vote to accept such persons as bondsman as the Treasurer and Collector for the ensuing year may present.
- Art. 10 To see if the town will vote to raise \$200.00 for a State Road one-half of which sum will be returned by the State.
- Art. 11 To see if the town will make a discount on taxes paid within a given time.
- Art. 12 To see if the town will vote to purchase a piece of land to enlarge the Walnut Hill Cemetery in accordance with the plan made by Silas Skillin and raise money for the same.
- Art. 13 To hear and act on the report of the Selectmen on perambulating the town lines.
- Art. 14 To see if the town will vote to authorize the superintending school committee to unite with other towns in employing a superintendent of schools; provided satisfactory arrangements can be made for such a union, and raise money for the same.
- Art. 15 To see if the town will vote to take any action in regard to delinquent tax payers.
- Art. 16 To see if the town will raise money to pay outstanding interest bearing orders.

Art. 17 To hear and act on the report of the selectmen on the condition of the river bank, west of the bridge near the residence of A. L. Dunn.

Art. 18 To see if the town will vote to take any action to exterminate the brown tail moth, and raise money for the same.

The Selectmen give notice that they will be in session for the purpose of correcting the voting list in said town, and hearing and deciding upon the application of persons claiming to have their names entered upon said list, at the Town House at 9 o'clock in the forenoon on the day of said meeting.

Hereof fail not, and make due return of this warrant and your doings thereon to one of us, on or before the day of said meeting.
