

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Citizens of Monhegan:

I hereby submit my first annual report for your consideration.

Miss Lillian V. Braddock taught the fall term of eleven weeks but resigned before the winter term opened. Mrs. Field was hired to substitute until a regular teacher could be obtained. She found, however, that it would not be profitable to teach for so short a time, some discussion was raised, and she decided to refuse the position.

Finally Mr. O. C. Turner of Veazie was hired. Mr. Turner has attended the University of Maine three years and is capable to teach any common or high school subject. I believe he will make an able teacher. Pupils to make good citizens must learn to obey certain laws and regulations of society. Trere is no better place to learn them than in school. No school can make rapid headway without order any more than a ship can with an unruly crew.

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Some of the books will have to be changed this year especially if peace is made in Europe. The sudden increase in the number of pupils has necessitated the purchase of a few new books. A new flag has been ordered.

The new walk in front of the schoolhouse is nearly completed. It will be a great improvement as before the water in spring and fall made in across the yard.

I would suggest that new toilets be built at the rear and connected to the main building by covered walks. The old toilets and wood-room should be made into a large wood-shed. Pupils should not be out-of-doors during school hours and the wood should be kept dry. I thank the officers and people for their cooperation and support.

WARRANT

For Annual Plantation Meeting STATE OF MAINE

County of Lincoln ss.

To George C. Everett, a Constable in the Plantation of Monhegan in said County:

GREETING:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the Inhabitants of the Plantation of Monhegan qualified by law to vote in Plantation affairs to assemble at the School House in said Plantation on Monday the 10th day of March 1919 at One o'clock P. M. to act on the following articles to Wit:

First. To choose a Moderator to preside at the

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said meeting.

Second. To choose all necessary Plantation officers for the year ensuing.

Third. To see if the Plantation will grant and raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of Schools and the Poor and repairs of roads and bridges and to defray all other Plantation charges for the year ensuing.

Fourth. To see if the Plantation will grant and raise a sum of money "and how much" to defray the charges of a School Superintendent for the next school-year.

Fifth. To see what action the Plantation will take in regard to making some repairs on Plantation Landing.

Sixth. To see if the Plantation will grant and raise a sum of money to be expended on the present extension of burying ground for the purpose of grading and sowing the same also to see what action the Plantation will take in regard to the disposing of burial lots.

Seventh. To listen to report of Treasurer and to act on same.

The Selectmen give notice that they will be in session at the School House on the day of said meeting at 12.30 P. M. for the purpose of correcting the list of voters. Hereof fail not and have you then and there this warrant with your doings thereon at the time and place of the said meeting.
