DEPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Citizens of Monhegan Plantation:

I herewith submit my first annual report as Supt. of Schools for the year ending March 1, 1920.

We have been extremely fortunate this year in that the same teacher who began the fall term last September is still with us today. It is not too much to say that Miss Robinson is a first-class teacher. She prepares her school work carefully and takes a great interest in the work of her pupils. At the time of my visit I was very favorably impressed with the discipline of the school. The pupils were orderly and obedient and devoted to their work. Examinations were being given and I had a good opportunity to judge of the work that had been done previously. I found that the pupils had a good understanding of what they had been over.

I wish to congratulate the people of Monhegan for the financial support that they give their school. This is something that can be said of very few small communities. The teacher is well paid and a well paid teacher is a contented teacher. The school is abundantly supplied with text books, school paper, and other necessary articles.

Considerable repairs were done on the school building last year and it is in pretty good condition. A new outside door would add to the warmth of the building.

Although teachers' wages will be higher next year than they have been this year yet I do not think you

will have to raise any more money for school purposes than you did last year. You are now paying far more than the average wage now paid in the state. Fuel may cost more but it ought not to. It would seem that the price limit had been reached in that very necessary commodity.

I wish to thank school officials and citizens for the support that they have given me.

- WARRANT For Annual Plantation Meeting

STATE OF MAINE

COUNTY OF LINCOLN SS.

To George C. Everett, a Constable in the Plantation of Monhegan:

GREETING:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Plantation of Monhegan qualified by law to vote in Plantation affairs to assemble at the School House in said plantation on Monday the 8th day of March 1920 at One O'clock in the afternoon to act on the following articles to wit:

FIRST. To choose a Moderator to preside at the said meeting.

SECOND. To choose all necessary Plantation Officers for the ensuing year.

THIRD. To see if the plantation will grant and raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of Schools and the Poor and repairs of roads and bridges and to defray all other plantation charges for the year ensuing.

FOURTH. To see if the plantation will grant and raise a sum of money "and how much" to defray the charges of a School Superintendent for the year ensuing.

FIFTH. To see if the plantation will grant and raise a sum of money and how much to repair damage to plantation wharf caused by recent storm.

SIXTH. To see if the plantation will grant and raise a sum of money to be expended on the present right of way up Horn's Hill to make the same more suitable for travel.

SEVENTH. To listen to report of plantation Treasurer and to act on same.

The Selectmen give notice that they will be in session at the School House on the day of said meeting at 12.30 o'clock in the afternoon for the purpose of correcting the list of voters.

Hereof fail not and have you then and there this warrant with your doings thereon at the time and place of the said meeting.
