

Prison Newspapers in JSTOR

Digitized prison newspapers from Fogler Library's print collection are now available in Reveal Digital's collection, "[American Prison Newspapers,1800s-present: Voices from the Inside.](#)" Hosted by JSTOR, the collection brings together hundreds of prison periodicals from U.S. penal institutions of all kinds, with special attention paid to women-only institutions. Maine publications from Fogler Library's collection include: [Der Wächter](#), from the World War II POW camp in Houlton; [Spotlight on Stevens \(SOS\)](#), published by the students and staff of the Stevens Training Center in Hallowell; [Phoenix](#), from the Maine State Prison L.T.G. (Long Timers Group) in Thomaston; and [SCAR'd Times](#), published by the Statewide Correctional Alliance for Reform in Portland.

New Interlibrary Loan and Assistant Collection Services Librarian
