# Field Day and Fun Run Saturday, September 7, 2024

### 10a.m. - 1 p.m. · Rogers Farm, 914 Bennoch Rd. Old Town, ME

This seasonal celebration will feature demonstrations, taste tests, and art in the garden. Visitors can explore over 30 themed gardens, including the new Color Trail and the well-established native plant collection. Staff and volunteers will provide insights on soil testing, composting, pollinator-friendly gardening and wildlife management.

Children up to 12 years old can participate in a ½ mile Harvest Fun Run through farm fields adjacent to the demonstration garden. The event will also feature the Great Veggie Race, where competitors of all ages can create and decorate wheeled vegetable vehicles. Participants can bring their own vegetable (under 3 lbs, please) or select one upon arrival.
