TOWN WARRANT

To Lester F. Smith, a Constable of the Town of North Yarmouth, in the County of Cumberland,

Greeting:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of North Yarmouth qualified by law to vote in Town affairs to meet at the Town House in said Town on Monday, the ninth day of March, A. D. 1942, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act on the following articles, to wit:

- Article 1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.
 - Art. 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- Art. 3. To hear and act on the reports of the Town Treasurer. Assessors, Selectmen, Overseers of Poor and Superintendent of Schools.
- Art. 4. To hear and act on the report of the North Yarmouth School Fund Trustees and vote how the money shall be expended.
- Art. 5. To hear and act on the report of the Cemetery Commission.
- Art. 6. To receive accounts against the Town and raise money for such as may be allowed.
- Art. 7. To choose all such officers as required by law to be chosen in the month of March annually.
- Art. 8. To choose a Cemetery Commissioner for five years.

- Art. 9. To elect one or more Fire Wards, also to designate one Fire Ward as Inspector, fix the compensation and raise money for the same.
- Art. 10. To raise money for the support of schools, as follows: Common Schools, Text Books, Repairs, Supplies, High School Tuition, Insurance, School Contingent and Electric Lights.
- Art. 11. To raise money for the repair of roads as follows: Town Roads, Snow Roads, Bridges and Culverts, and Cutting Bushes on Town Roads, State Aid Roads, Third Class Road, Support of Poor, Town Officers, Cemeteries, Contingencies and Interest.
- Art. 12. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for State Aid Road construction (in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges) under the provisions of Section 19, Chapter 28, Revised Statutes of 1930, as under the provisions of Section 3, Chapter 229, Public Laws of 1937.
- Art. 13. To see if the Town will join with the State Highway Commission in raising the sum of \$50.00 to be used in grading the Patrol Road.
- Art. 14. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for maintenance and resurfacing the Third Class Highway as per law.
- Art. 15. To see if Town will vote to buy Snow Fence and raise money for same.
- Art. 16. To fix the price of Men, Teams and Trucks per day, and all Town Officers not fixed by law.
- Art. 17. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for maintenance and resurfacing the Special Resolve Road as per law.

- Art. 18. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for maintenance and resurfacing the State Unimproved roads as per law.
- Art. 19. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for the services of the nurses of the Cumberland County Public Health Association.
- Art. 20. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen and Treasurer to enter into an agreement with the men working for the Town to deduct 50% of all their orders to apply on taxes or take any action thereon.
- Art. 21. To see if the Town will vote to choose a Budget Committee.
- Art. 22. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen, on behalf of the Town, to sell and dispose of any Real Estate acquired by the Town for non-payment of taxes thereon at such terms as they deem advisable, and to execute quit claim deed for such property.
- Art. 23. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to procure a temporary loan or loans in anticipation of taxes for the purpose of paying obligations of the Town, such loan or loans to be paid during the current year out of money raised during said municipal year by taxes.
- Art. 24. To see if the Town will vote to buy a Collector's and Treasurer's bond.
- Art. 25. To see if the Town will vote to discount taxes or take any action thereon.
- Art. 26. To see if the Town will vote to set a time when taxes of 1942 shall be paid.
- Art. 27. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for Fire Protection, or take any action thereon.
- Art. 28. To see if the Town will raise the sum of \$50.00 to pay the Dental Clinic.

- Art. 29. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for advertising our natural resources, advantages and attractions under the provisions of Chapter 5, Section 82, of the Revised Statutes of 1930, said sum to be expended under the direction of the State of Maine Publicity Bureau.
- Art. 30. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$17.00 for public health work in North Yarmouth, said sum to be expended by the Bureau of Health State Department of Health and Welfare, in cooperation with local authorities.
- Art. 31. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for Civilian Defense or take any action thereon.
- Art. 32. To see what action the Town will take toward removing the brown tail moth nests within our highways and raise money for the same.
- Art. 33. To see if the Town will vote to have the old record books in town rebound, or take any action thereon.
- Art. 34. To see if the Town will vote to build a fence across the front of the Walnut Hill Cemetery, and raise money for the same.

The Selectmen hereby give notice that they will be in session for the purpose of correcting the voting list in said Town and hearing and deciding to have their names entered on the voting list at the Town House at nine o'clock in the forenoon on the day of said meeting.

Hereof fail not to make due return to one of us on or before the day of said meeting.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

During the past year there have been few changes in the policies established in the previous years controlling the operation of the schools. Children who live considerable distances from the schools are transported and we have continued the practice of transporting whole grades from the school having enrollments too large to allow for effective teaching. Considering the number of miles travelled and the number of pupils transported, the cost of transportation is relatively small.

I would like to take this opportunity to impress upon the citizens the need of continued support for education. There will be an appreciable increase in the appropriations needed to meet the needs of the coming year. This is to be expected at a time when the cost of living is increasing. There is a very definite shortage of trained teachers not only in the State of Maine but in the country as a whole. In many towns married and retired teachers have been urged to return to the profession during the emergency period. Every effort is being made to maintain the standards so that unqualified teachers will not be certified during this period.

Two new teachers were hired in September to teach in the Walnut Hill School and in the Buxton School. Some of the Surplus Commodities have been used in the schools to suppliment the lunches brought from the home. A better program of hot lunches for all pupils would be desirable but there are some difficulties in securing the necessary equipment and material for a balanced program that are hard to overcome.

We are gradually replacing the worn arithmetic texts with new books of the same type. New reading books for the lower grades have been purchased and there is a need for new geography texts in some of the schools.

The usual repairs were done during the summer and in addition the Dunn School was painted and the Buxton School shingled.

The dental clinic was carried on as usual with all of the children, whose parents desired, receiving dental treatment. For the sum of \$55.00, 52 children received dental treatment that would have cost \$220.00 if the regular dental rates had been charged. This work included:

50 cleanings, 36 fillings, 31 extractions. (25 of these extractions were temporary teeth.)

MISCELLANEOUS

The school financial records are closed twice a year. The accounts are balanced and closed in February for the Annual Town Meeting and also in June for the State Reports.

In order that the school costs published in the Town Report may correspond with State Report figures the following school costs cover the school year beginning July, 1940 and ending June, 1941.

In the Town of North Yarmouth the children are being housed, educated, and in some cases transported at the following per pupil costs:

Yearly Cost Daily Cost Hourly Cost Elementary, \$37 73 \$0.209 \$0.029

The school buildings in this town have been kept in repair at a cost per pupil of \$1.74.

The number of pupils per elementary teacher is 27.

AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Taxpayers of the Town of North Yarmouth, Maine:

We have audited the financial records of the Municipal Officers of the Town of North Yarmouth for the year ended February 10, 1942.

REPORT OF PUBLIC HEALTH NURSE

Annual Report, 1941

Public health nursing is concerned with securing and maintaining better health for all members of the community. Recognizing that whatever is done to assure physical and mental health during maternity, infancy, childhood and youth will affect the health of adult population.

During the past year visits were made to prenatal patients to help them carry out their physcian's instructions, or if not under a physician's care, to urge them to secure medical advice as early in pregnancy as possible. In many cases the mother was helped to make plans for her confinement.

Visits were made to young infants to urge the mothers to keep the baby under medical supervision, to have him vaccinated against smallpox and immunized against diphtheria. When necessary the nurse assisted the mother in planning a daily regime for the baby. Special emphasis was placed on the prevention of communicable diseases which take a heavy toll in childhood.

Arrangements were made for crippled children to attend one of the Crippled Children's Clinics conducted by the Bureau of Health. Follow-up visits were made in the homes to assist the family with the care of the patient.
