By special Act of the Legislature, approved March 3d, 1870, this bridge was declared to be a town way, and the Bridge Corporation thereby released from all liability on account of the same after that date. Authority was also given to pay for the same the amount appraised as damages by the Selectmen, in laying out said way December 25, 1869. In pursuance thereof, we have paid said damages, and put such repairs upon the bridge as were required to make it safe and substantial.
