Holiday Tips for Neurodiverse.

As we are moving closer to the winter holidays, we want to share a few tips for caregivers, individuals, and parents who are living with Neurodiversity.

- ~ Have a schedule: Communicate a daily, weekly, and monthly schedule that highlights the regular and special events planned. Make a schedule with pictures for the very young.
- ~ Create social stories: Before the holiday season arrives, show photos along with telling a simple story that explains what to expect for whatever events are planned.
- ~ Ensure safe and nutrient-dense foods are available: Neurodiverse people are often sensitive to food, have food allergies, and are sometimes also picky eaters. Ensure there are appropriate and known provisions of the kind of food they like and can eat.
- ~ Advocate preferences and needs: Let people know appropriate information about yourself or your children's needs and preferences so you all can have a joyful and peaceful holiday season.
